WHO'S NEWS

Q: Since the 1986 Challenger disaster, it seems that we're falling further and further behind the Soviets in the space race. My 10-year-old son wants to be part of the space program and we were devastated by the death of Ronald McNair, one of the Challenger victims. Was he the first black astronaut?



BLUFORD: Awaiting his second space mission

A: McNair and Guion S. Bluford Jr. were in the same group picked to be astronauts in 1978. But it was Bluford who became the first black in space in '83. Charles A. Bassett was picked as the first black astronaut in '63; he was killed in an auto accident in '66. Of the 93 current astronauts, four are black,

two are Hispanic, 13 are women. Most are assigned to technical projects while awaiting a mission. Since the Challenger accident, 17 astronauts have left the program; each had gone up in space before quitting.

Q: How many times has Martin Sheen been arrested? What causes does he support?

— Rachel Smith, Jackson, Miss.

A: The prolific actor says he's lost count — but we count almost 20 arrests. He fights for peace and the homeless, protesting at the nuclear testing site in Nevada and sleeping on heating grates in D.C.

Q: I'm 13 and I'd like to know more about the cute girl who plays Winnie Cooper on ABC's *The Wonder Years*. Is she like Winnie in real life, sweet and polite and nice?

— Ruben Rodriguez, El Paso

A: Like Winnie, Danica McKellar, 14, does well in school (she has won math and French awards and wants to study science in college), tries to be "polite and nice" and has "good posture." But she isn't as fickle as Winnie, who's not sure if she likes likes Fred Savage, or just likes him. "I don't skip boyfriends," says Danica. Little sis Crystal, 12, plays Winnie's rival, Becky Slater.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

'Doonesbury' barbs don't hurt Pauley's interviews

Q: I watch Jane Pauley on the *Today* show and read her husband Garry Trudeau's *Doonesbury* comic strip, and I had a curious thought. It seems political figures pay close attention to political cartoonists. I wonder if some would not want her to interview them because of Trudeau's work.

A: We asked Pauley, who responded via a computer message: "Henry Kissinger has a standard joke with me. He says, 'Please don't mention me to your husband! Heh, heh!'"

"I can think of a few political wives and one offspring who seem wary of me, but I'm not aware of a turndown because of my husband's work. A lot of people think I'm married to the ex-prime minister of Canada," Pierre Trudeau.

Pauley and Trudeau met at a dinner at Tom Brokaw's house. Common interest? "We both knew a lot about frozen food," says Pauley, 38.

The couple and their three children live with a full-time nanny in New York City.

Q: Is tennis star Pat Cash Jr. dating anyone?

A: The 1987 Wimbledon champ and his girlfriend, Anne-Britt Kristiansen, just split up. "It's just a trial separation," says Cash's dad. Cash Jr., who turns 24 Saturday, is out for up to six months with an injured Achilles tendon. So he has the time to make up with Kristiansen, who took their kids, Daniel and Mia, back home to Norway.

Q: You recently said Nancy Reagan renovated the White House and bought china, but you didn't say that donations covered the cost.

— Betty Emery, Shelburne, Vt.

A: You're right. She declined Congress' \$50,000, and used the \$1 million-plus donated by supporters.

A: Horton is serving two life sentences at Maryland Penitentiary in Baltimore. In April '87, Horton escaped while on a weekend furlough and assaulted a Maryland couple, raping the woman. Since the campaign, both sides have questioned focus-

ing on Horton. Ex-Bush campaigner Lee Atwater later said the anti-Dukakis focus should not have used a black man. And ex-Dukakis campaigner Susan Estrich said, "When we see racism, we need to say so."

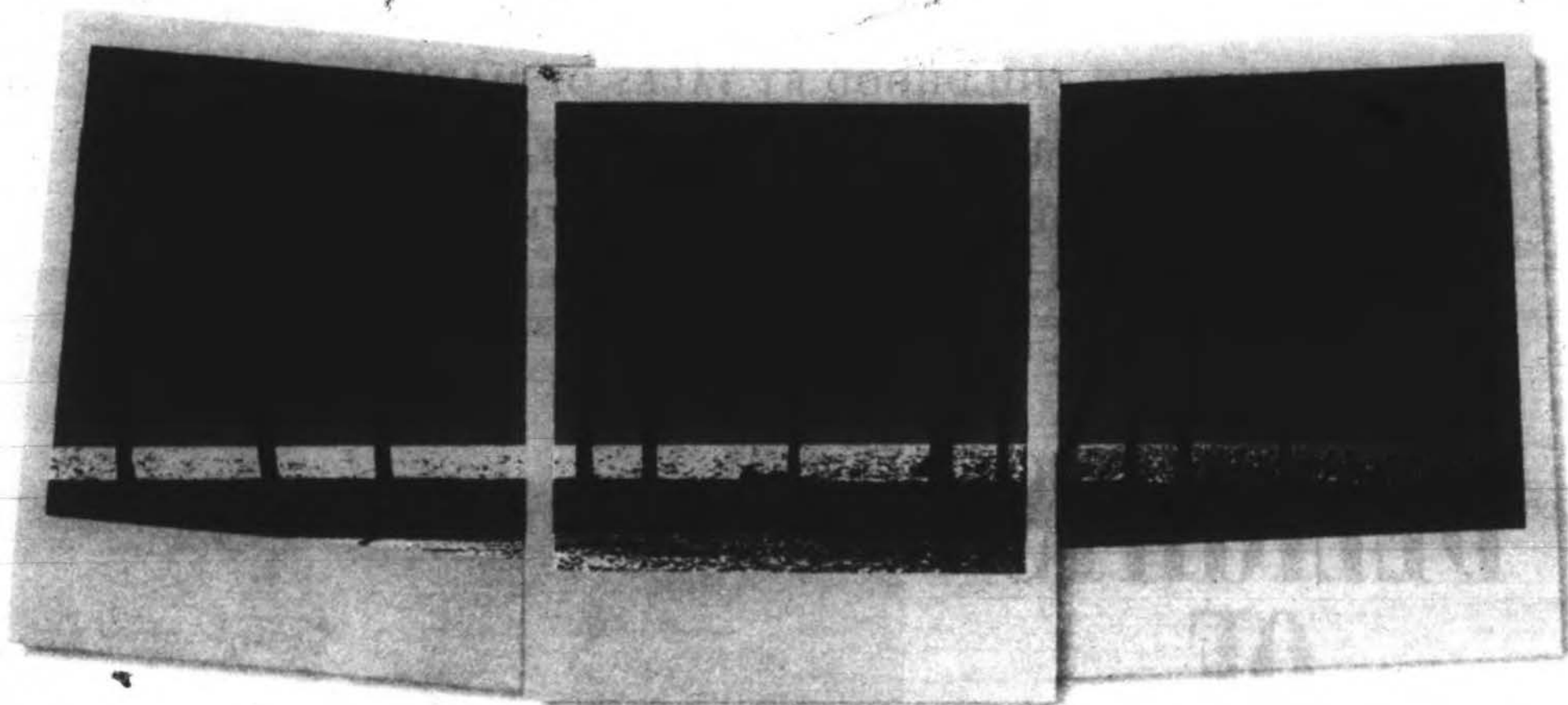

My life as a heavy reader began the summer I was 7. It was early summer, June 6. I remember the exact date because it was D-Day. On this day we moved from our house in Weaverville, N.C. — a bright little house with a sloping lawn, and cows across the road, as well as twin cousins I could play with — into a pretty awful apartment house in Asheville so my mother could be nearer to her newspaper job.

The apartment had no grass in its yard, even though the houses on either side sported rich, thick lawns of summer grass. Its only forms of landscaping were two mean old thorn bushes that pricked you

when you played too close. But there were no children to play with that summer, because I didn't know anybody yet.

The only saving feature of this new home was a neighborhood library, located in the gate house of the Manor Hotel, which was right across the street. The children's book section was presided over by a cultivated old Southern lady who pronounced library "lah-bri" and who recommended to me on my very first visit some books about someone she called "Maay-ri Poppins."

She spoke about this "Maay-ri" in a fond, knowing way, as though they were intimate acquaintances.

About our author

Gail Godwin grew up in Asheville, N.C., determined to be a writer like her mother, who wrote short stories and taught.

"Maay-ri" and some other acquaintances of this helpful librarian became my intimates during that long, grassless, friendless summer.

While lapping up tales during that summer, I became aware of an odd phenomenon connected with the act of reading. It still intrigues me whenever I stop to think about it.

When Mary Poppins floated down from the sky into a London park every time the Banks children needed discipline and enchantment, I — who had never seen a London park — saw the fierce nursemaid with her fiery cheeks descending via umbrella into a park two blocks away, across the street from

where we went to church, the only park I knew.

When, the following summer, I lay on top of our car, parked under a maple tree in front of the awful apartment house (still no grass!), reading *Bomba the Jungle Boy*, the green canopy of leaves above my head became Bomba's jungle, and the drone of passing cars transformed itself into a symphony of tropical insects.

When you are engaged in the act of reading, there becomes here. But you are involved in bringing it here. You are part of the process. Without you as reader,

the typeface would just lie there, in flat, incomprehensible squiggles on a white background. In order for there to be a story, or a poem, or any meaning at all, the muscle of your imagination has to go to work and do its job.

And, like any muscle, the more it's used, the stronger and more agile it grows. When called upon, it does a sweeping scan of the things you remember (and some you don't), and the things you've seen and felt. Then, quicker and subtler than the fanciest computer, it arranges them together to flash you a picture of what might be seen and felt.

The more you call upon it, the more adept it becomes at weaving connections. You get so you can, particularly in the company of an inspired writer, go anywhere you want: from the top of the Himalayas to the lowest circle of hell.

You become a connoisseur of human character, as well. You'll meet someone and know that person right down to his shoelaces, because you've already been inside his head in a book.

Eventually, when you become a seasoned old bookworm like me, reading has become so intertwined with your life that you don't bother to separate them anymore.

Your current stack of books becomes a revealing indicator of your current state of mind.

Your life feeds into your reading and, in turn, you read for your life. You get to know what shelf to go to when you need an aesthetic boost or a spiritual tonic or some diversion or escape. You become an old hand at propping up your novel against the lemonade and keeping it open with the salt shaker while you eat and read

on the cool porch. (You also learn not to read your valuable books while eating spaghetti.)

You can lie in a porch swing, or a hammock within sight of the sea, or sit on a carpet of grass with your head against a tree trunk and lose yourself in a frozen Russian landscape or a London fog, until you realize the fireflies are all around you, and your bare legs are cooling off. And perhaps you then remember, as I do, someone from long ago, calling to you from a house: "Come inside, honey, it's dark. You're going to ruin your eyes."

What my life would be like without books, I can't imagine. I'm not sure I want to try.

Some of the profoundest revelations that have shaped the course of my life spoke first to me from the printed page. Many of the people I think about as I go through my days and nights are characters in certain novels and stories. Their dilemmas and passions and besetting sins both reflect and shed light on my own. I am so much else because they fill me. Yet they also reveal to me new sides of myself:

I am the orphan, being shown for the first time to a room of my very own in the big house of a kind man.

I am the unjustly accused prisoner escaping as a dead man in a sack in order to wreak revenge on my enemies.

I am a wealthy young woman who sits in front of a dying fire and admits to herself that she has thrown away her freedom on a fortune-hunter.

I am the man who goes crazy in darkest Africa, and I am the boy who is kidnapped by a seedy circus and grows up to become a great magician.

I am the governess who falls in love with her moody employer, and I am a green garter snake in a pink and white bonnet, hurrying home through the woods to make supper for my family.

Reading enlarges your experience, and, in turn, your experience fills in and deepens your reading. A book you read at 18 will not be the same book when you are 25, or 50.

The first time I read Henry James' *The Portrait of a Lady*, I was the same age as the young, orphaned heiress Isabel and thought I ought to get married. When she turned down the affable Lord Warburton, I was furious with her. Though the sophisticated Gilbert Osmond was a bit sinister, I wanted her to marry him. But when she went back to him at the end I thought she was crazy.

Now that I'm old enough to be Isabel's mother, my favorite scene in the book is where she sits before the dying fire in her Roman villa and painstakingly reviews her mistakes. That scene speaks to me now. Just as importantly, perhaps: I can speak back to it. When she goes back to Osmond, I'm sad now, but I approve. She has to honor her promise to her little stepdaughter. The ending satisfies me because it reverberates with true echoes of how choices are made and consequences lived out.

And who knows? When I re-read it again this summer, I may have developed my reading imagination to the point that I can at last find it in my heart to forgive Madame Merle, the older woman who is the villainess of the novel.

That's another thing reading

does. It enlarges your sympathies. You get so you can identify with the most unlikely characters. For instance, I garden a lot in the summer, and like many a gardener, I have on occasion reached calmly into some thick growth to pluck a weed and, the next thing I knew, found myself upsetting the nap of a snake. I scream, of course, but then, as the outraged creature whips its loopy length off to the safety of the woods, I always watch it go with a wistful affection.

The first favorite book of my life, you see, was a story about a family of snakes. They lived deep in the green woods in a little house, and at meals they sat around a table, their tails dangling decorously down the sides of their chairs. The women snakes wore bonnets and one was named Gertie.

When my mother read me that book on our porch of the pretty house in Weaverville, it made me go all wriggly with happiness. She said she had felt the same way at my age, when her mother had sat on a porch with her and read aloud from this very same book.

I relished that book, to have it read to me — and later, to read it for myself.

Gertie the garter snake made me feel I was getting into a place I could never have found on my own. The characters were utterly mysterious beings — yet not unlike me.

I still feel this way about the books I love.

Relaxing reads

Big names muscle in on the usual beach books

Curling up with a book has never been so hard—because there's such a wealth to choose from.

"Light reading usually is set aside for summer months, typically referred to as beach reads," says John Baker, editor-in-chief of *Publishers Weekly* magazine. "But this summer, there are lots of well-known authors, which is startling, because traditionally most would have been published in the fall or spring seasons."

In addition to the top picks from book critics (see page 5), here are 15 other titles bound for the best-seller list:

Suspense

Clear and Present Danger by Tom Clancy. The insurance salesman turned best-selling novelist sends CIA hero Jack Ryan down to South America to explore an assassination and drug trafficking. (Putnam, August, \$21.95.)

The Confession of Joe Cullen by Howard Fast. A guilt-ridden Catholic confesses to killing a priest—and exposes a massive cocaine smuggling scam. (Houghton-Mifflin, Aug. 25, \$18.95.)

My Secret History by Paul Theroux. The *Mosquito Coast* author tracks a writer's love life. (Putnam, June 9, \$21.95.)

Capital Crimes by Lawrence Sanders. A power-hungry religious charmer wreaks havoc on Washington, D.C., politics. (Putnam, just out, \$19.95.)

Biography

King of the Night by Laurence Leamer. An unauthorized biography that brings to light the less-glamorous, other life of late-night host Johnny Carson. "He's a lonely man; it's so sad and unlike his image on television," says Leamer, who inter-

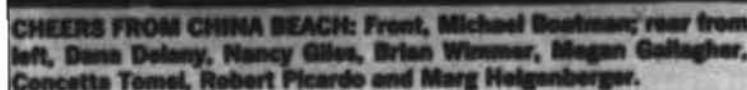

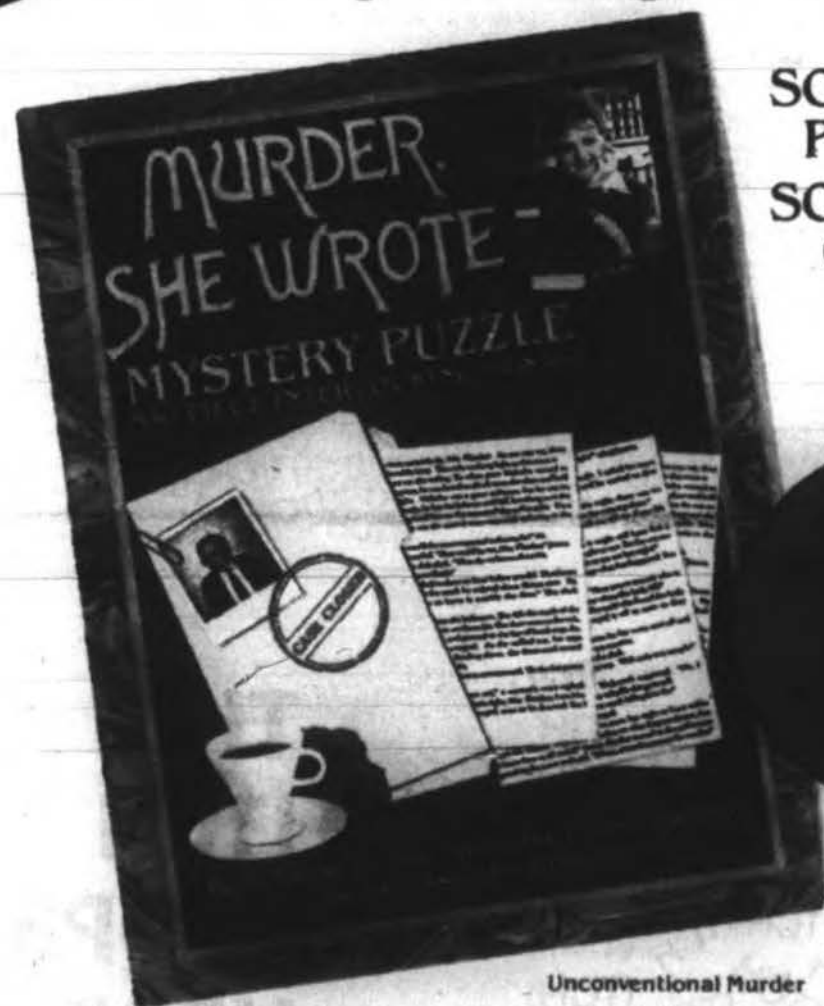

Perfect parks

Here's a savvy guide to surviving Disney World (go on weekends) and other top theme parks

You and the kids are ready for a day at the amusement park. Everyone's wearing sensible shoes and you've packed plenty of money. But most important, you need a plan of attack to get the most amusement from your day.

So here's how to survive and enjoy five of the USA's most popular theme parks.

Walt Disney World Lake Buena Vista, Fla.

You've been reading plenty about this place lately — with the addition of the Disney-MGM Studios Theme Park to the Magic Kingdom and Epcot Center lineup. Now here are a few inside tips:

Believe it or not, Disney World is less crowded on weekends; Mondays through Wednesdays are the busiest.

At Magic Kingdom, most lines for the Fantasyland rides move continuously, but those that must stop to reload — Dumbo,

the Flying Elephant and Mad Tea Party, for example — can back up. One good strategy: Go at 3 p.m., when everyone else is waiting for the Main Street parade. Or sneak on during the 9 p.m. Electrical Parade, which you can catch at 11 p.m.

And this tip from Steve Birnbaum's *Walt Disney World, The Official Guide*: If an attraction has two lines, check the one on the left. "Most of the time it will be less crowded, since most Magic Kingdom visitors automatically head for the one on the right."

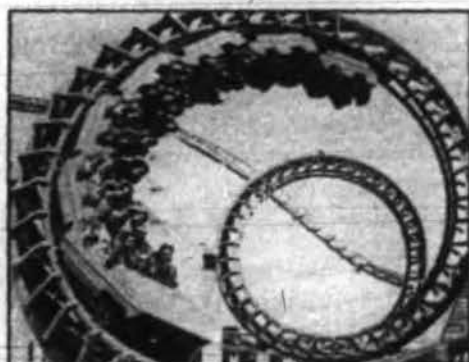
Epcot is laid out like an "8." Since many tourists start nearest the entrance, Disney's Tom Brinkmoeller suggests starting at the far end. Future World is jammed in mid-morning; save it for afternoon and visit World Showcase instead.

At Disney-MGM, The Great Movie Ride, Backstage Studio Tour and Animation Building draw the longest lines early,

so try SuperStar Television and the Sound Effects Studio first.

Six Flags Great America Gurnee, Ill.

An hour's drive north of Chicago, this is a roller-coaster mecca, with more than 100 rides, shows and attractions, plus five super roller-coaster rides. Most visitors rush to the big rides, such as Splashwater Falls or American Eagle, so save those for later. Instead take in one of the shows, "Dancin' In the Streets," for example.

Since weekends are hectic, your best bets are Thursdays and Fridays.

Allen Ambrosini of American Coaster Enthusiasts, a roller-coaster fan club, suggests that you take the young kids on the Whizzer, then work up to the Demon, a medium-sized, looping coaster.

Next stop is the Tidal Wave, which quick but intense, catapulting you forward from 0 to 55 mph in a matter of seconds, then looping you backward.

Once you're serious, try the American Eagle, a racer as opposed to a looping coaster. This, says Ambrosini, has the "best first drop of any," 127 feet from top to bottom. Finally, there's the Shock Wave, a steel coaster with seven loops which Ambrosini calls "a mind-numbing brain-scrambling ride. You see a lot of teenagers in the Shock Wave, but not a lot of adults." Need we say more?

Kings Island

Kings Island, Ohio

"People from Cincinnati (24 miles south) stay home on the holidays," says Ruth Voss of Kings Island, so that's a good time to go to the park. Weekends can be crowded, but Mondays and Fridays generally aren't.

Voss recommends that you plan meals at irregular hours, especially if you have small children who may not do well standing in line.

Because there are four major water rides that can get you plenty wet, bring a change of clothing and store it in a locker near the main entrance gate.

If your kids are old enough to explore the park on their own, you might want to retire to Tower Gardens, a shady, out-of-the-way area in the park with benches and waterfalls made for relaxing.

Sea World

San Diego, Calif.

The park offers nine shows daily: five animal shows, a water-effects show, pearl diving, a pageant and ice skating shows (the latter starring Olympian Scott Hamilton). You can see them all if you have six to eight hours, but don't try to see them back to back. Even if there are no lines, you'll be worn to a frazzle. Each show runs about 20 minutes.

After you've seen one, tour an exhibit before getting in line for another. If you turn up at the next line about 15 minutes before show time, you should have no trouble getting in.

Thursdays and Fridays are quiet days for Sea World, and as at most parks, early morning and evening shows are less crowded than at midday.

But what do you do if the lines to see Shamu get long? "A well-kept secret at Sea World," says the park's Fred Jacobs, "is the fresh- and saltwater aquariums" with giant octopuses, deadly stonefish and coral. Also often overlooked: Penguin Encounter, which has about 400 birds, including eight species

of penguins.

A final tip: Bring your own lunch — you're allowed to.

Knott's Berry Farm

Buena Park, Calif.

This theme park in Orange County, just south of Los Angeles, is most crowded in July and August. It is less crowded in May, June and September, and the weather is even more delightful.

The rides are busiest at midday, so visit Ghost Town, a recreation of an 1880s California mining town. Early morning's the best time to catch Montezooma's Revenge, a spiraling, stomach-churning ride that accelerates to 55 mph in less than four seconds, goes through a 76-foot loop, up a 140-foot tower that ends in mid-air, then shoots backwards. In other words, says the park's Diane Greene, go "before the crowds and before you've had too much to eat."

Because Knott's is open until 11 p.m. on weekdays and later on weekends, you can show up around 2 in the afternoon, when the crowds have begun to thin, and still get in nine hours. "The Incredible Waterworks Show," a light-and-water performance, is better when seen at nighttime anyway.

Camp Snoopy, the children's area, is crowded in the morning, so save it for the afternoon. Go take a whirl on the Dentzel Carousel instead, an underappreciated classic merry-go-round built in 1902.

Teenagers in the family? You can unload them at one of the two teen nightclubs that have disco dancing on weekends and nightly during the summer, then you've got the evening to yourself.

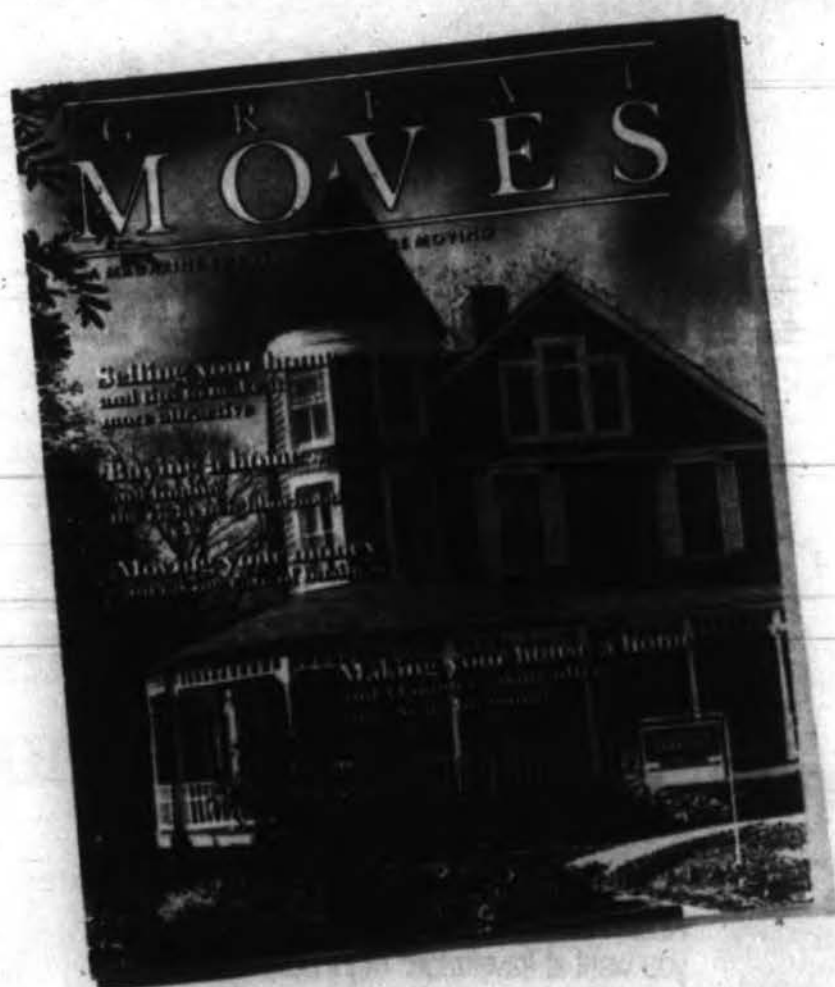

Coming soon: one blockbuster after another after another.

■ *Lethal Weapon II*, the follow-up to the successful, and violent, 1987 cop flick featuring Mel Gibson and Danny Glover. The two of them return to do clean-up duty in the City of Angels again. July 14.

Also getting advance notice and likely to draw crowds this summer:

■ *License to Kill* is the 16th movie in the James Bond series and the second for Timothy Dalton, who makes a fine 007. He takes on a Latin American drug lord and exotic cover girl Talisa Soto. July 14.

■ *Great Balls of Fire* has Dennis Quaid as the young Jerry Lee Lewis — but he

doesn't get to show off his own singing (off-screen, Quaid plays with a band called the Eclectics). June 30.

■ *Casualties of War* pairs goody-two-shoes Michael J. Fox and bad boy Sean Penn in a bloody Vietnam War film, directed by Brian De Palma (*The Untouchables*). Aug. 18.

■ *Black Rain* sends a paunchy-looking Michael Douglas, playing a New York undercover detective, to penetrate the underworld in Japan. He gets beaten up a lot. Aug. 11.

■ *The Abyss*, about divers working on an underwater oil rig, is being touted for its special effects and love scenes between Ed Harris and Mary Elizabeth Mastrantonio. By the people who brought us *Aliens*. July 5.

Klingon talk

Marc Okrand boldly went where no linguist has gone before — and created a real language for the Klingons, the *Star Trek* baddies featured in *Star Trek II: The Wrath of Khan*, opening June 9. That's Klingon Todd Bryant, left.

"Kupuk" (nooh-nahh) is the closest these curd bad guys come to a greeting: roughly, "Whaddya want?" But Klingons are "not really mean," says Okrand. "They're misunderstood."

Trek trivia: The first Klingon phrases, heard in the first *Star Trek* film, were created by James Doohan, alias Scotty.

The right stuff

Shorter hair, dressier clothes, seafood on the grill and lots of sunscreen define this summer's style

Sun season's here, and you've dug up your beach bag and picnic basket.

But what to put in them that's really hip, stylish, perfect for the last summer of the '80s?

Definitely not last season's odd scuba-diving swimsuit, or those madras plaid shorts. And we all should know that greasy hamburgers and chips are out.

So what's in?

Here's what the trend experts say you must have to fill up your '89 summer bag of tricks.

Skin care

The hottest ideas are geared to our new, smarter attitudes about the sun. We know that ultraviolet rays harm eyes and skin, so we're taking care to protect ourselves with sunscreens, hats and cover-ups, says Shari Sims, health director of *Self* magazine.

"Nobody's hiding indoors," she says. "You can still have fun in the sun — but be careful about it."

■ Most of us cover up with sunscreens when headed to the beach, but experts now recommend using it anywhere, even walking to work. Make sure your sunscreens have a Sun Protection Factor of 15 or above. And did you know that many cosmetics, including lip color and moisturizers, now have SPF's? Check labels for ratings.

■ Tan without the sun using bronzers that work with all skin colors. Just brush, puff or smooth on your choice of sunny shades. Tip: Darker skins look better in golden tones.

Sunwear

Casual, natural, but well-groomed. Those are the fashionable catchwords this season, says Bob Beauchamp of *Es-*

quire magazine. "People who set the styles, like movie stars and newscasters, are cutting their hair a bit shorter, wearing dressier clothes. Clothes for men and women alike are better tailored, with an all-American look." Dress up in:

■ Colorful sarongs for women. Use a gauzy, over-the-shoulder sarong to cover up at pool side; a jewel-toned ankle-length skirt to dazzle at parties.

■ Bermuda shorts for men. The classic is back: crisp with well-tailored pleats in creamy colors such as clay, beige and concrete. Also back: white buck shoes.

■ High-tech swimwear. Among the sleekest and sexiest: super-thin lycra blends with taffeta and cotton, the kind developed for Olympic competitors. Style: modest and dramatically draped for women; tailored trunks from the '40s for men.

■ Baseball caps that look so good on movie star Kevin Costner are "at their peak," says Beauchamp. "All the guys are wearing them, on and off the field."

■ Sunglasses. They're everywhere, indoors (really!) and out. Insist on ones with maximum protection against ultraviolet rays. New: contact lenses with UV protection.

■ Gold. As in buttons on blue blazers, big

bead necklaces with sarongs, powder lightly dusted over face and shoulders.

Entertaining

"We can look forward to more Mediterranean themes, the warm-climate tastes of Italy, France and Spain," says Zanne Zakroff of *Gourmet* magazine. "Those cuisines give us all the things we love, like tomatoes, peppers, garlic, olive oil — and they're all very light and good for us." Serve up:

■ Fresh seafood. Grilling alfresco is still the summer dinner party of choice. But this summer, "we're putting lots of seafood on the grill," says Zakroff. "It's lightning fast, it's very light and it tastes just wonderful."

■ Light Mediterranean flavors prepared in new ways. Try the recipes in Colman Andrews' *Catalan Cuisine* (Atheneum, \$24.95).

■ Old-fashioned picnics featuring Grandma's fried chicken, cole slaw, bean salad and German-style potato salad. Hold the mayo.

■ Or make your own cool-and-easy summer bean salad. Toss up some warm Spanish white beans with red onion and chunky canned tuna. Throw in vinaigrette for some zip.

Bring back that love-in feeling

Aug. 15 is the 20th anniversary of the three-day festival that defined a generation: Woodstock. Jack Curry, author of the new book "Woodstock: The Summer of Our Lives" (Weidenfeld & Nicolson, \$19.95), talks about the festival's impact.

"Two decades of Woodstock-bashing have twisted its legacy into a baby boomer cliché. Images of mud, marijuana and loud music linger. Whatever the 500,000 concertgoers experienced as genuine and heartfelt has largely been overlooked.

"This summer's commemorative celebrations and media retrospectives may help to re-establish Woodstock's place in pop-culture history. Plans for live musical events are evolving erratically. Re-release of the 1970 Oscar-winning documentary film *Woodstock* is the most concrete tie-in plan.

"Look for certain signs that the Woodstock legacy still has vitality. Rock music is again addressing social issues and influencing the way young people respond to them. Events like Amnesty International recreate Woodstock's heady mix of entertainment and politics.

"Things will be different at these mini-Woodstocks, though. Drug and alcohol use will no longer carry the social stamp of approval they did at the 1969 be-in. And it's more than likely that Mom and Dad will come along.

"That may be the most enduring legacy of the Woodstock Festival, in fact. Before the concert, rock was the sound that divided establishment from rebel, young from old, parent from child. Ever since, it's been the music that's kept us together."

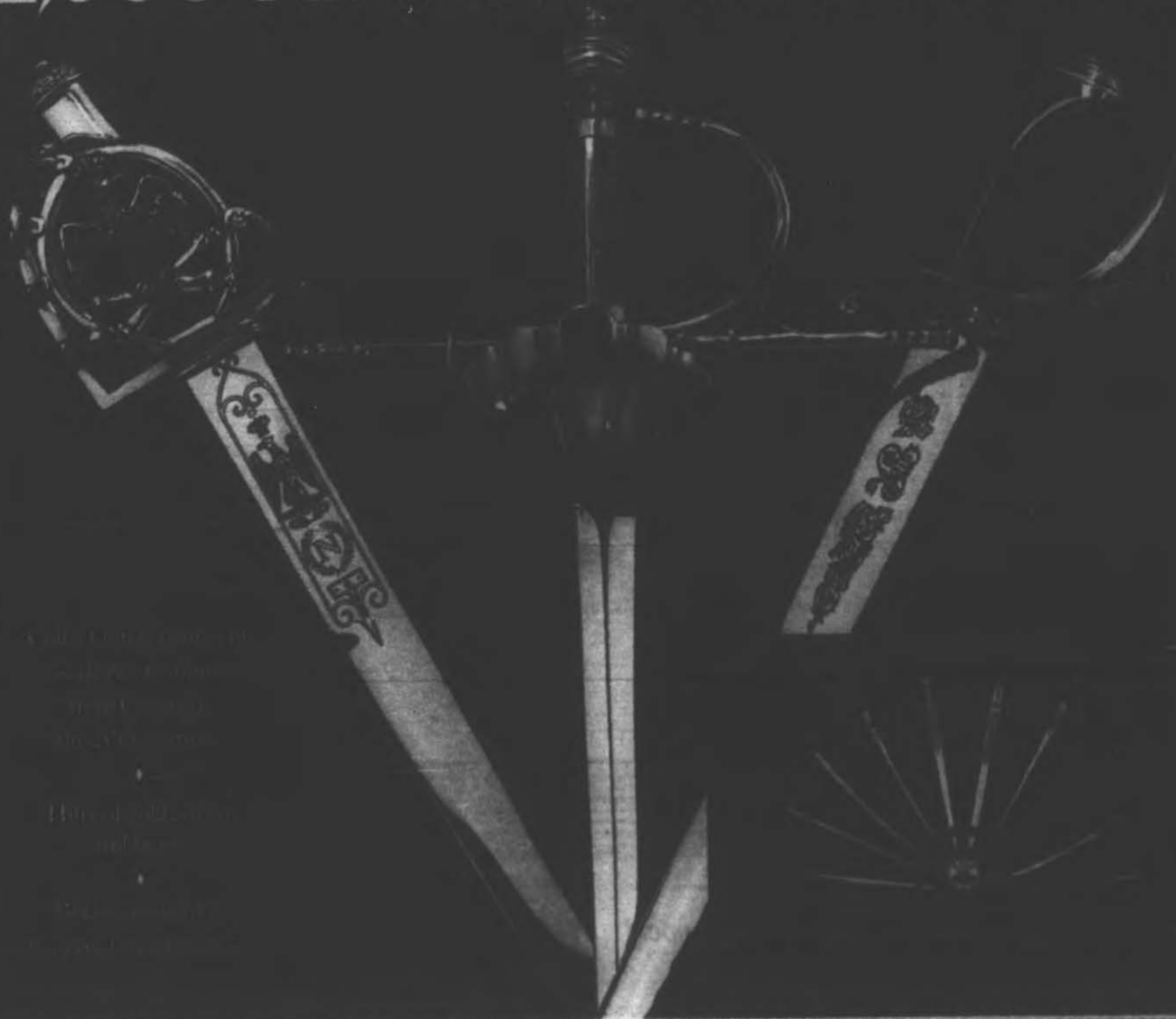

Soul of Sensitivity

Several people have told me that my boyfriend looks like the late Montgomery Clift. What can you tell me of his background? Can you list a few of his film credits? - JEN PAN-NULLA, PIPERSVILLE, PENN.

Born Edward Montgomery Clift on Oct. 17, 1920, in Omaha, Neb., Clift began his acting career in summer stock at age 14. He made his

screen debut in 1948's "The Search" and was immediately hailed as an intelligent, highly sensitive performer, with a bright future. His credits include "Red River" (1948), "The Heiress" (1949), "A Place in the Sun" (1951) and "From Here to Eternity" (1953). During filming of "Raintree County" (1957), the actor was in a serious automobile accident that scarred his face and blatantly altered his classic good looks. Although he made movies after the accident, most notably "Suddenly, Last Summer" (1959) and "The Misfits" (1961), he never completely recovered from it. Rumors of drug and alcohol abuse began to surface after the accident, and his health problems seemed to multiply. During the production of John Huston's "Freud" (1962), in which he appeared in the title role, he underwent cataract operations in both eyes. After "Freud," he found it difficult to get any kind of work, since his health problems made him an insurance risk. His last film, "The Defector" (1966), was released posthumously. Clift, who never married, died of a heart attack in 1966 at the age of 45.

Ups and Downs

I have heard that Charles Bronson has a home in Vermont. Is this true? Can you tell me a little about him? - W.T. MELEN, RUTLAND, VT.

Bronson was born Charles Bunchinsky on Nov. 3, 1921 (some reference books list the year as 1922), in Ehrenfeld, Penn., the son of a Lithuanian coal miner. He broke into films as a supporting actor in "You're in the Navy Now" (1951), but didn't become an international box-office star until 1968, when he left Hollywood to film in Europe. Three years later, he received the

Golden Globe Award as the world's most popular actor. Bronson, his wife Jill Ireland, whom he married in 1968, and their brood of seven divide their time among their Bel Air home, their Malibu cottage and a 600-acre Vermont farm reportedly located in West Windsor. Ireland, who battled breast cancer in 1984, has recently learned that the disease has spread to her lungs. She is undergoing aggressive chemotherapy, and Bronson rarely leaves her side.

"It was hard for me to get a hold of reality," says Tony Danza.

Tony Danza used to be a palooka. These days he's the boss.

"Yeah, it's like lookin' back on somebody else's life sometimes, when I think about boxin'," the actor reminisces, remembering the days when Brooklyn-born middle-weight Tough Tony Danza fought other club boxers whose names will never grace "The Ring Encyclopedia." "And some of those early episodes of 'Taxi'!" he adds, laughing. "It was like 'acting by numbers'!" Now, just look at him: star of both the TV hit "Who's the Boss?" and the frothy summer movie "She's Out of Control," chatting away this long Manhattan afternoon in the type of hotel whose name, in the old days, he probably couldn't pronounce.

"Someone says to me, 'On 'Who's the Boss?' are you acting or just playin' yourself?'" he riffs. "I say, 'Both - it's me in a good mood!'"

If that's the case, he has a lot to draw on these days. Aside from the burgeoning career, his 18-year-old son Marc is ready for college. Then there's his three-year marriage to Tracy Robinson; they have a 2-year-old daughter, Katherine Anne, who is clearly poppa's favorite thing in the universe. "My (second) marriage changed me," Danza says thoughtfully. "But also," he adds, with a charming but calculated grin, "I'm 38 now. How much longer can I hold off this maturity stuff?"

The "maturity stuff" has indeed been a long time coming. During the glory days of "Taxi," Danza confesses he "chased everything that moved! I mean, five years in a series - you go to the bar, you could have anybody. I used to go home alone 'cause I couldn't make up my mind!" he half-jokes.

Then in 1983, "Taxi" was canceled, and Danza was sure he had bought a one-way ticket to Palookaville. The downtown train stopped at New York City's Mayflower Hotel, where on Feb. 3, 1984, Danza and buddy Albert Sinacori were arrested after a barroom brawl. "I was feelin' bad enough about that," he recalls, "but then the next day I saw The New York Post, and right on the front cover in letters as big as my

hand it says "'Taxi' Star Arrested in Drunken Brawl!"

"I was young," Danza, who was 32 at the time, adds with a sigh. "It was hard for me to get a hold of reality. I really wasn't mature, and that added to the conflicts."

He did his penance - community work for the elderly - and somehow things started changing. "Who's the Boss?" premiered on ABC in 1984, and though critics moaned, the domestic sitcom rose to become a ratings hit. Danza surprised and delighted those same critics with starring roles in two TV-movie dramas: "Doing Life" (1986) and "Freedom Fighter" (1987).

The way he operates on the set of "Who's the Boss?" might best be described as Brooklyn diplomacy: Whoever shouts loudest wins. Danza shrugs. "On the show, they're gonna remember me. They're not gonna remember who directed it or who wrote it, they're gonna remember me. So I wanna be sure that what's on is the best it can be."

Despite all his efforts on the show, Danza admits, "You have to be a realist. I mean, it's wonderful that my show is still top-10 after five years, but what am I gonna do - tell you it's better than 'Taxi'?"

Better? No. More long-lived? Definitely. "Ain't no end in sight, pal!" he exclaims. "I heard Ted Danson the other day. Someone asked him if he was happy they were gonna keep doin' his show ('Cheers'). And he said, 'Yeah - because the show still makes me laugh.' That's the bottom line," says Danza. "My show still makes me laugh."

Do we really need 'Rock Awards'?

Music awards shows are, as a rule, suspect. They're frequently pointless, often rigged and invariably long and boring. But few are as suspect as "The International Rock Awards," which air live on ABC on Wednesday, May 31.

To its credit, the 90-minute program boasts a lineup of genuine rock 'n' roll performers: The

Bangles, Living Colour, Lou Reed, the Replacements, Robert Palmer, David Bowie and Keith Richards, who is to receive the first "Living Legend" award. It's the awards part we can't help wondering about.

For one thing, these awards seem redundant. Nominees like INXS, George Michael and Terence Trent D'Arby were also nominated for this year's Grammys; others, such as Bruce Springsteen and Tina Turner, were up for last year's Grammys.

The acts were nominated by a panel of promoters, record-company executives, talent agents and managers. Producer Bill Zysblat, his bio boasts, "manages Keith Richards' personal affairs." What better way to promote your client than to stage an awards show and give him the top award?

What's most interesting about "The International Rock Awards," however, is that they seem to signal a trend toward the trivialization of music awards. With so many out there — the Grammys, the American Music Awards, the Country Music Association Awards, and MTV's Video Music Awards — it's hard to get excited about any of them.

ABC's interest in "The International Rock Awards" is puzzling. The network's broadcast last June of David Bowie's "Glass Spider" tour drew low ratings, as did the Atlantic Records 40th Anniversary concert.

Rock critic Dave Marsh contends that the networks broadcast such shows simply to fill air time. "Instead of packaging them as variety shows, which no longer seems to work," he says, "they package them as awards shows."

The one thing this show has going for it is that rock musicians — who used to spurn awards shows — seem to be flocking to this one. "At one time, you couldn't get anyone to show up for these things," says Kurt Loder, who hosts the music news on MTV. "I don't know what's happened lately. It's just another event, I guess, another night out."

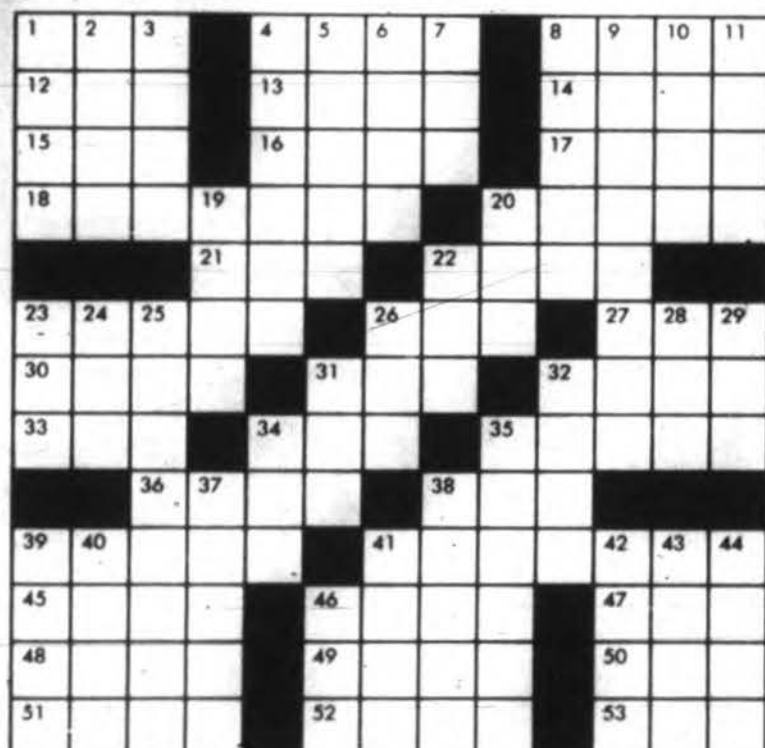

Traffic jams order of day as holiday weekend starts

A man passed out while windsurfing in Newport Beach, southbound freeways turned into parking lots and a mother lost her unborn child in an auto accident during the first day of the Memorial Day weekend.

Newport Beach Fire Department paramedics were summoned at 1:47 p.m. Saturday to help a man who had fallen unconscious while windsurfing near 18th Street on the inland side of the Balboa Peninsula. Witnesses told paramedics that they did not see Jack Schwarze collapse but noticed him floating in the water near his windsurfing board.

Schwarze, whose age and residence were unavailable, was admitted to the coronary care unit at Hoag Memorial Hospital in critical condition, fire Capt. Randy Smith said.

An unborn baby was killed during a traffic accident late Saturday night in La Habra. Police had no additional information, however.

The California Highway Patrol issued a traffic warning throughout

most of the day for the southbound San Diego Freeway, which was backed up from Capistrano Beach to Katella Avenue in Anaheim. The southbound San Diego Freeway was also moving at a slug's pace.

"It's all stopped," a CHP dispatcher said. "Maybe that's why we haven't had any accidents; everybody's going too slow."

Statewide, the CHP reported 13 people killed in automobile accidents between 6 p.m. Friday and 6 a.m. Saturday. Nine people died in the same period last year.

The CHP also arrested 654 motorists on suspicion of drunken driving.

Traffic control officers in Newport set up their traditional roadblock on Balboa Boulevard at 15th Street on Friday and Saturday nights. Officers turned back non-residents and those who could not demonstrate an urgent need to drive onto the Peninsula. The practice is meant to limit ferocious traffic jams and unwieldy crowds.

Lt. Don Chandler said Friday night that he had received several complaints from motorists who were

refused access to the Peninsula.

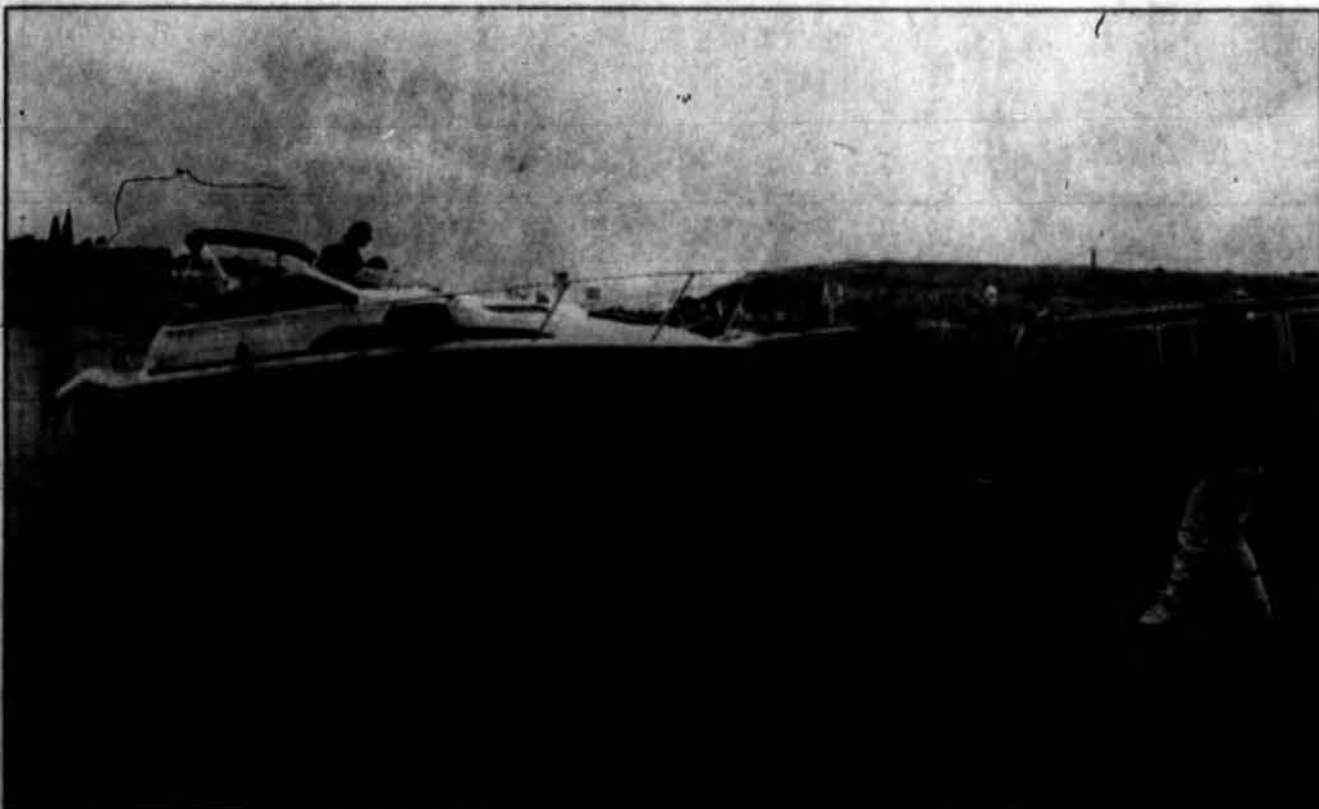
Despite an early morning cloud layer, boaters turned out en masse, which was probably fine with Kris Jamtaas.

Jamtaas, general manager of Newport Dunes Aquatic Park, said last month that "you can sink me in the water" if the park's public boat launch ramp wasn't ready for business by the Memorial Day weekend.

Well, Jamtaas stayed dry Saturday as the ramp opened for business and boaters lined up to launch their craft.

The ramp is one of the first improvements in a \$10-million renovation for the aquatic park. When completed in about five years, the facelift will include a 175-room hotel, restaurant, clubhouse, 200 additional boat slips and a dry storage for 400 boats.

Lifeguards along the Orange Coast reported crowd size commensurate with a regular summer weekend day. Huntington Beach reported 60,000. Huntington State Beach had about 15,000 and Newport lifeguards counted about 80,000.

Memorial services to salute veterans

Solemn traditions blend with sunny thoughts of early summer on Memorial Day throughout the U.S., and indications are that Orange Coast residents are in for an all-American holiday.

Meteorologists are promising mild weather with temperatures at or slightly below normal in Southern California.

Observance of the holiday began on the Orange Coast Saturday with the placing of flags on the graves of more than 1,300 Huntington Beach area residents killed in wars and military actions overseas.

The ceremony, at Good Shepherd Cemetery in Huntington Beach, was organized by Martha Valentine, president of the Huntington Beach Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary.

The 9 a.m. flag ceremony was followed by a memorial service at noon that included a U.S. Navy color guard and a fly-by by helicopters from the Huntington Beach Police Department.

Memorial Day activities will continue in Huntington Beach at 8 a.m. Monday with the raising of a special flag commemorating American prisoners of war and soldiers missing in action.

The POW-MIA flag-raising will take place at Huntington Ranch Mobile Home Park, which is located on Brookhurst Street between Garfield and Yorktown avenues.

Featured at the Huntington Beach observances will be the playing of taps by 89-year-old bugler Fred Hummer. Hummer, an American Legion member for 70 years, has been playing the bugle since World War I.

Harbor Lawn Memorial Park will be the site of the 35th annual Costa Mesa Veterans of Foreign Wars Memorial Day observance Monday at 11 a.m.

"This is the time when we remember those people

who gave their lives for their country," said Harold J. Hohl, organizer of the event for the Costa Mesa VFW. "And this year, we're making it a special one for the sailors who gave their lives on the Iowa."

Last month's disastrous explosion aboard the battleship USS Iowa in the Caribbean took the lives of 47 sailors, including a 22-year-old Costa Mesa resident, Geoffrey Schelin.

Retired U.S. Marine Corps Col. William E. Barber, who received the Medal of Honor for heroism during the Korean War, will be the principal speaker, Hohl said.

Congressman Christopher Cox, R-Newport Beach, is also expected to attend, he said.

Part of the observance will be devoted to the addition of six new burial flags to Harbor Lawn's Avenue of Flags.

Veterans in Laguna Beach will also celebrate Memorial Day with an observance at Heisler Park.

The ceremony, sponsored jointly by the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars, will include presentation of a memorial poppy, the traditional symbol of remembrance for fallen soldiers.

Retired Marine Corps Gen. William A. Bloomer will give the memorial address. Also on the schedule in Laguna Beach are floral presentations by various organizations, music by the Laguna Beach High School Band, and a rifle salute by a firing team from the U.S. Marine Corps Air Station at El Toro.

Elsewhere in Orange County, a major observance will be held at the Veterans Memorial, 10 Civic Center Plaza, in Santa Ana.

Dubbed "A Service of 1,000 Lights," the ceremony will begin at 7 p.m. Monday.

"We deliberately chose the evening for the service because we know that veterans groups throughout the county will be having their own observances during the

Child safety comes first with Irvine pediatrician

Dr. Phyllis Agran may speak softly, even deferentially, but she wields great influence in national child safety laws.

When Agran testified before the California Legislature in 1982 advocating a child safety seat law, one senator said to her, "Well, you want to protect those sweet young children and that's fine, but I hope you're not going to come back next year looking for the same protection for older people."

"I said oh no, of course I won't be back next year," Agran said with a laugh.

The next year she was back, arguing the need for restraints in vehicles carrying older children and adults. She didn't notice if the same senator was there listening, but if he was, he offered no resistance. Her argument helped win new legislation again.

As a pediatrician — both privately and through UCI Medical Center where she also lectures — Agran has been in a position to study traffic

accidents and children for 10 years.

For the past nine years, Agran has been compiling her research data with help from the Public Policy Research Organization at UCI and using it to back pro-restraint legislation.

With a staff of five, Agran collects injury reports from Orange County hospitals and creates comprehensive pictures of child safety needs. Diane Winn, a nurse who's worked on Agran's staff since 1981, only speaks with admiration for Agran.

"She can be tough," Winn said, "but she's very good at working with politicians."

And no wonder, Agran has had extensive dealings with politicians in her own home. She is married to Irvine's simultaneously respected and reviled Mayor Larry Agran — a political shaker in his own field.

The couple have one son, Ken, an 18-year-old freshman at Dartmouth University in New Hampshire.

Even with her personal experience with politics, Agran was probably not prepared for the virulence of

recent criticism from some sectors. After making headlines for nearly a decade in the cause of child safety,

Pei Wang to leave hospital for short visit home today

Six weeks after the car accident that claimed her younger sister's life and left her in critical condition, Estancia High School student Pei Wang was expected to leave the hospital today for a brief visit with her family.

Her first stop will be at her sibling's grave. In fact, that was the leading reason she asked to be temporarily released from her room at Long Beach Memorial Hospital.

With only two years between them and their birthdays falling one day apart, Pei Yu and Cori Pei-Chen Wang were pals.

"We were like best friends. We told each other everything," Pei said during an interview in her hospital room surrounded by a few friends and family members.

"She'd tell me about her boyfriend and I'd tell her about mine."

Pei was behind the wheel of a new Acura Integra — a recent 16th birthday present — and Cori was in the passenger's seat on April 11 when the car went out of control on Placentia Avenue in Costa Mesa and hit a light pole.

Cori, 14, was killed instantly. Pei suffered a broken hip and pelvis, torn liver and trachea, internal bleeding and there was nerve damage to her left leg and eye.

Pei doesn't remember the accident. In fact, she doesn't remember April 11 at all. In a way, she's glad she can't remember.

But 16-year-old Damon Jones, Pei's boyfriend, remembers.

He was racing Pei in a Ford Escort when she overtook him shortly after they had both pulled out of an Estancia High School parking lot. He was about to speed up to overtake her when he saw Pei's car swerve across the street and hit the light standard.

Since the accident he has visited Pei every day. Pei credits visits from her friends and family, especially Damon's, for her fast recovery. On Wednesday, the high school's vocal ensemble, of which Pei is a member, is scheduled to stop by for a visit and a bit of musical merriment to cheer her up.

"If it wasn't for my friends I couldn't do this," Pei said hospital therapists have told her she'll be able to go home for good in about a month. Today's visit home was to last only five hours, just time enough to visit Good Shepherd Cemetery in Huntington Beach, have brunch at Birraporetti's and stop by her house.

"They say I'll be fine when I get out of here."

Part of her therapy has included regaining her voice, which was damaged when her trachea was torn by the seatbelt. Tubes shoved down her throat during

Agran's affiliation with this month's report from the Transportation Research Board — on which Agran serves with 12 other countrywide experts — surprised many people.

The report stated, "The overall potential benefit of requiring seat belts in large school buses is insufficient to justify a federal standard mandating installation."

According to the study, the one life and several dozen injuries which could be saved with seat belts each year cannot justify a \$40 million per year expenditure.

The idea that a national Transportation Research Board has stated that seat belts are not necessary in school buses, while you must have them in your car, has angered Irvine resident Edie Selig, a vocal opponent of the board's recommendation.

"If that one child that died were mine," she said, "it would feel like a thousand."

"There were some people on the board who felt that we have a policy of seat belts in travel and we should make that go for school buses, as well," Agran said diplomatically.

Although she indicated she would have liked to see seat belts required in buses, Agran would not openly

and after surgery didn't help either.

But she'll never again be able to hit the high notes of a soprano.

"My voice deepened so much," she said. "When I come back I'll be an alto."

She'll also be a lot richer when she returns home. The resourceful high school student was already playing the stock market before the accident, following instructions from a fellow student and having her mother co-sign the investment papers. (Minors are not allowed to invest in the stock market by themselves.)

She figures she's made about \$10,000 during her recovery on investments in Columbia Pictures and Quicksilver clothing.

"I just thought it was an easy way to make money," she said with obvious pride and a smile.

Yet for all of the good cheer for Pei's recovery, the death of her sister is always near, threatening to intrude on the moments of happiness. As Pei mentions a scholarship that has been set up in her sister's name to honor teen-agers who counsel peers against drug abuse, her mother, Hsiuchih Wang, cannot hold back her tears.

"Cori, such a good girl," her mother says, as a friend embraces her and does her best to soothe a wound that will never completely heal.

oppose the board's findings.

Economics, Agran stressed, is the bottom line. More children are injured by school buses as pedestrians than as riders. Therefore, the board recommended safety features such as a crossing guard arm which forces children, when crossing in front of the bus, to walk in the driver's line of vision.

To insulate passengers during a crash, the board's study believes that raising seat backs from 20 to 24 inches and eliminating the practice of allowing children to stand in the aisles will raise safety levels to an acceptable standard.

However, Edie Selig's husband, Gene Selig, did indicate that Agran's position — as wife of Irvine's mayor — could have as much to do with his criticism as the report itself.

"Those Agrans seem to be working off their own agenda. And if you don't think this has anything to do with politics," Selig said, "I've got a canal down in Panama to sell you."

The Agrans have become accustomed to, even philosophical about, others' tendencies to confuse them politically. "You know what they say," Larry Agran said, "unless you've picked up a few enemies along the way, you're probably not being effective."

Two Marines die, five injured in copter collision in Nevada

FALLON, Nev. (AP) — Two Marine Corps Sea Knight helicopters assigned to the Marine Corps Air Station El Toro collided Saturday morning, killing two women Marines and injuring five others, authorities said.

The collision occurred at 8:45 a.m. during a training exercise in an uninhabited desert area about eight miles southeast of Fallon, authorities said.

The dead were identified as Sgt. Brenda L. Schroeder, 29, a field radio operator from Baltimore, and Cpl. Lisa D. Tutt, 22, a unit clerk from Santa Ana, said Maj. J.W. McClain, a spokesman for the El Toro Air Station.



This helicopter was moderately damaged in a collision that killed two women Marines and injured five others.

The two CH-46 Sea Knights belonged to the Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron, which is permanently assigned to the Marine Corps Air Station in El Toro.

Authorities declined to speculate on the cause of the accident but said an investigation would begin immediately.

McClain identified the injured as Col. George J. O'Connell Jr. of Mission Viejo; Lt. Col. W. Tom Reid of Lake Elsinore; Maj. S.P. Toth of Irvine; Maj. Warren E. Jones of Laguna Hills; and Staff Sgt. P.L. Gauthier of San Juan Capistrano.

The squadron arrived at the

Fallon air station last week to participate in operation "High-Roller," a two-week exercise designed to test combat readiness for the 4th Marine Air Wing.

One of the helicopters received major damage while the other came away with moderate damage.

A new wave in pizza deliveries

JUNEAU, Alaska (AP) — The newest pizza outlet in the state won't promise delivery within 30 minutes, but the owners have an excuse — their new shop is a boat.

The 32-foot "Pizza Tug O" is due to make its maiden voyage Tuesday. It will ply the waters of southeastern Alaska, where almost every town is on its own island and pizza delivery was out of the question until Helen and Fred Tallmadge decided that where there's a wave there's a way.

The Tallmadges, who came to Alaska on their honeymoon seven years ago and never went back, opened the first Domino's Pizza

Newport radio preacher pleads no contest to bribery charges

One month after proclaiming his innocence, a Newport Beach radio preacher pleaded no contest Friday to charges that he tried to bribe a witness in a child molestation case, against one of his parishioners.

The Rev. Fred Kenton Beshore, 63, entered the plea in exchange for a guarantee that he would serve no jail time and to avoid the "public spectacle" of a trial, said his attorney, John D. Barnett.

"This disposition was reached in order to avoid a circus atmosphere which would have undoubtedly surrounded the litigation of a minister," Barnett said.

The molestation case involved accusations that Dr. Francis Williams, a popular neurosurgeon from New-

port Beach, had molested a teen-age patient while giving her pelvic examinations in 1985. The 14 felony charges were dismissed after a Harbor Court Municipal Judge found that there was insufficient evidence to bring him to trial.

Beshore was charged with two bribery charges after allegedly calling the girl's father, himself a Baptist minister, and offering him \$36,000 to keep his daughter from testifying. Beshore pleaded not guilty to the charges last month.

Under Friday's no contest plea, which was delivered before Orange County Superior Court Judge Myron S. Brown, Beshore agreed to pay a \$7,500 fine. If he had been tried and found guilty, he could have faced three years in prison and a \$10,000 fine.

TIME OF MY LIFE

Free enterprise still free to correct errors

It's nice to see Sav-On back among the corporate names again. After five children and 12 grandchildren, it would be impossible to estimate the number of times we've been in and out of drugstores over the years, and most of the time the store has been a Sav-On. That's why we were so disturbed a few years ago in the Walnut Park Sav-On store in Irvine when we suddenly saw a flock of signs saying, in effect, Osco is here.

When I turned to a supervisor and asked what all that Osco stuff was about, I got a supercilious answer to the effect that now Southern California was going to be big time, because Osco, which earlier had acquired the Sav-On chain, was now going to give Orange County all the wonderful service it gave the rest of the country.

"We're the biggest drugstore chain in the country," the clerk said. "Just wait and see the difference."

Well, we waited, and we saw, and what we saw we didn't like, and neither did much of Southern California. Fewer checkout stands, fewer checkout clerks, more merchandise, narrower aisles, and all manner of stuff unrelated to drugs or medicine. Camping gear, cheap wines, novelty junk, seasonal impulse-buying stuff. Only the pharmacy seemed to be the same.

Suddenly, the chain's local share of market began to decline and the spin became steadily worse. The company blamed it on a strange coincidence — the name Osco sounded similar to a hispanic word that meant putrid. Whatever the reason, the company has now spent enormous sums bringing the name Sav-On back, restoring the signs, producing new banners and spending much money on radio and TV and in the newspapers announcing the backstepping.

The Osco fiasco proves once again that corporate board rooms and management teams can have their share of stupid people who have reached their levels of incompetence. Sadly, it takes some companies, like Osco, an awfully long time to admit their errors. Look at Beech-Nut and the admission that they sold colored water as apple juice, and Wall Street with their insider trading scandals, and the long delay of the U.S. auto industry to recognize the seriousness of the imported automobiles, particularly those from Japan. David Halberstam's book, "The Reckoning" relates incredible stories about stupid attitudes and decisions of Detroit's auto bosses.

All of us have our favorite examples of dumb corporate decisions raising the question of just how smart is free enterprise? My favorite is the Edsel, and my personal experience is real: I was an account executive in charge of Edsel advertising for Southern California, and while I rose above this, I may not survive this admission.

It was during my years with Foote, Cone & Belding, one of the world's largest advertising agencies. The agency did not have an automotive account, so when Ford announced it was planning to develop a new medium-sized automobile, our Chicago office vigorously pitched the business, and won. It was all very exciting and the agency had to open a Detroit office.

Ford had no consumer research to indicate whether such a car was wanted. Officials simply looked at the General Motors line and concluded they had no auto to compete with the Buick, and they felt they needed one. GM owners went from Chevy to Olds to Buick to Cadillac, upgrading in the family. Ford owners went from Ford to Mercury to Continental. Mustangs and Thunderbirds were sports cars, not involved with the progression, they said.

While Ford designers worked on the new car, Ford said it needed a name, and the name would not be Edsel. At Foote, Cone & Belding, all employees were asked to submit proposed names. The winner would get one of the new cars as a prize, and remember, the name would not be Edsel.

Well, I suggested all kinds of names, animals, racers, and so on, and at the last minute, suspicious about management, I added the name Edsel. When the Edsel name was announced, I got a check for \$50, the value of the car divided by all those who like me, had put the name on their lists.

Some months later, the Southern California account executive for Edsel left the agency, and I was asked to handle dealer advertising for the Edsel in Southern California, adding it to my other accounts. And I learned about the auto industry the hard way, traveling all over the Southwest — Southern California and Arizona — visiting dealers, driving various Edsel models, listening to customers, and producing ads — primarily radio and newspapers — to support the dealers. The stories of dealer hustling, of back-shop ripoffs, of factory rebates and faulty production, haunt me to this day.

The Edsel failed for two reasons: the new small car imports from Japan and Germany answered consumer demand, and Ford failed to introduce a car that lived up to its advanced advertising. The quality control was virtually non-existent. The Edsels were built in old Mercury plants, where factory workers, loyal to Mercury, did slipshod work on the Edsel.

But I firmly believe in the free enterprise system. Some recent excesses, some shameful examples of greed, are generally rewarded with exposure and failure, like the Edsel. And if it weren't for free enterprise, I wouldn't have received \$50 for helping to name the Edsel. As some of my friends said, that's about all the car was worth.

Tapes in tune with Laguna Canyon

A cassette of songs about Laguna Canyon that has been distributed to 75 stores is raising awareness about potential development in the canyon, according to the cassette's promoter.

The songs, written by Laguna Beach resident Jim Rushing, are a blend of rhythm and blues, pop and "environmental rock," according to Rob Whalley, who created the display and is promoting the cassette sales.

With titles such as "Natural Beauty," "Too Many People" and "Solid City," the songs seek to both entertain and educate, Whalley said. "What's unique about the tape is you can listen to it for music pleasure or listen to the words and learn about what's going on in the canyon," Whalley said. "The whole tape is keyed to increasing people's awareness about what's happening in the canyon and the environment."

The eight songs, which are sung by Mark Kenoly, are selling for \$10 in supermarkets, hair salons, liquor stores, bars and record stores, including Tower Records in El Toro. Although sales of the cassettes are moving slowly, people are snapping up the brochures about the canyon, which are also tucked into the display, Whalley said.

"The display sells, but even more

important, it educates people about what's going on out there," Whalley said. "Right now it's the main way the brochures are getting out. Most of the time I go back to pick up money and the brochures are gone."

Since the cassettes hit the stores approximately six weeks ago, membership in the Laguna Canyon Conservancy has increased and the group recently received a \$1,000 donation, he said. Proceeds from cassette sales will also go to the Conservancy, he said.

Rushing, who owns Voyager Leather in Laguna and is on the board of the Conservancy, said it took him about a year to create the songs.

"I did it to promote the canyon, to raise the awareness about the preservation of open space," said Rushing, whose avocation is song writing. "We're searching for breakthroughs to inform the people and to raise money. This was a real breakthrough."

Eventually, Whalley said, the cassettes, brochures and display — which says "Buy a tape. Help us save Laguna Canyon" — should be in 200 stores. Although most of the stores now selling the tapes are in Laguna Beach, Whalley said he will be pushing them into surrounding cities.

"By the tapes selling at Tower Records in El Toro, it shows this is not just a local concern," he said. "Everybody loves Laguna Canyon."

Animal rights group facing injunction

LOS ANGELES — A group opposed to the use of animals for medical research today faced an injunction prohibiting its members from harassing, threatening or intimidating UCLA faculty members at their homes.

The order, issued by Superior Court Judge Abby Soven, specifies that members of "Last Chance for Animals" are also barred from breaking into or blocking any UCLA facility, obstructing teaching, research or other functions on the campus and destroying university property.

"UCLA supports the right of all individuals to express their opinions and to protest legally, but strongly condemns the use of threats, intimidation and criminal activity," said UCLA Chancellor Charles Young.

Representatives of the anti-vivisection group were not available for comment.

"I am very pleased that the court was able to distinguish between legitimate, peaceful protest and the type of harassment and threats that these people have decided to under-

take," Young said.

In addition to the injunction, the university has also filed a complaint seeking monetary damages against Last Chance for Animals, alleging that the group's actions have been "deliberately disruptive." UCLA also accused the group of civil conspiracy, violation of the civil rights of faculty members and trespassing.

Yesterday's preliminary injunction will remain in force until the other charges come to trial.

In recent months, the group has held rallies on the UCLA campus in opposition to the use of animals in research laboratories there. Last Chance has been accused of breaking in on the campus and of blocking neighborhood streets around the homes of two UCLA researchers and banging on their doors, demanding that they come outside.

The research programs opposed by the group are apparently aimed at understanding the brain and certain neurological disorders, such as epilepsy, Parkinson's disease, Alzheimer's disease and sudden infant death syndrome.

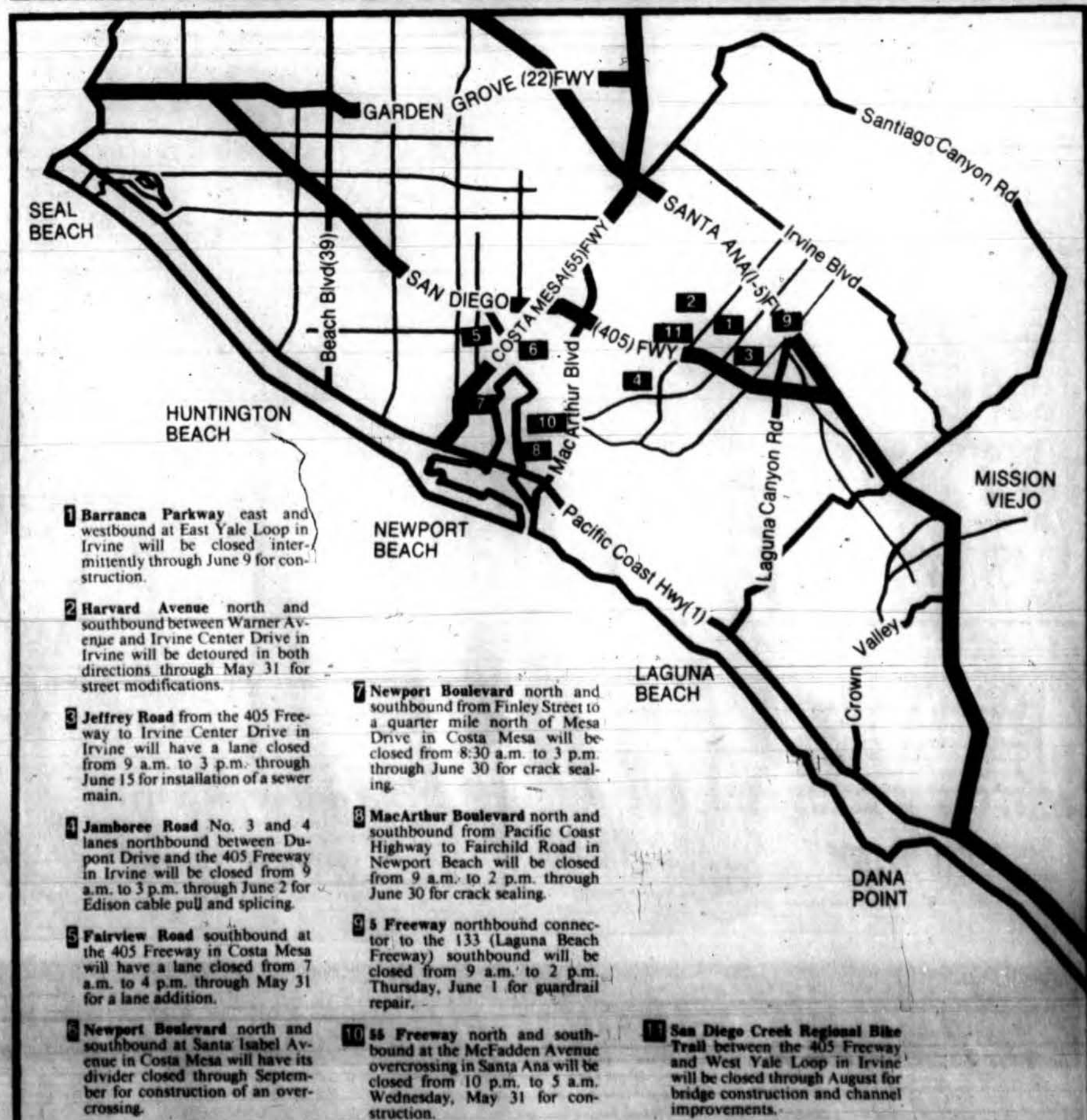

"It's like any kind of art form," said the 55-year-old artist. "You cannot guess what's going to happen here."

The most colorful vehicle was the slipper, whose wings flapped in time with its blinking eyes, well, sort of. It also had a rotor, but it didn't appear to be turning anything other than itself.

Charlie Strong of Seattle said this was his eighth year in the race. He and a friend were riding the "Red Eye Express," which defied definition but looked most like a giant sausage.

The winner of the race gets only the glory, said Brown. There were about 50 entries this year. Traditionally, about half finish.

Newport radio preacher pleads no contest to bribery charges

One month after proclaiming his innocence, a Newport Beach radio preacher pleaded no contest Friday to charges that he tried to bribe a witness in a child molestation case against one of his parishioners.

The Rev. Fred Kenton Beshore, 63, entered the plea in exchange for a guarantee that he would serve no jail time and to avoid the "public spectacle" of a trial, said his attorney, John D. Barnett.

"This disposition was reached in order to avoid a circus atmosphere which would have undoubtedly surrounded the litigation of a minister," Barnett said.

The molestation case involved accusations that Dr. Francis Williams, a popular neurosurgeon from New-

port Beach, had groped a teen-age patient while giving her pelvic examinations in 1985. The 14 felony charges were dismissed after a Harbor Court Municipal Judge found that there was insufficient evidence to bring him to trial.

Beshore was charged with two bribery charges after allegedly calling the girl's father, himself a Baptist minister, and offering him \$36,000 to keep his daughter from testifying. Beshore pleaded not guilty to the charges last month.

Under Friday's no contest plea, which was delivered before Orange County Superior Court Judge Myron S. Brown, Beshore agreed to pay a \$7,500 fine. If he had been tried and found guilty, he could have faced three years in prison and a \$10,000 fine.

TIME OF MY LIFE

Free enterprise still free to correct errors

It's nice to see Sav-On back among the corporate names again. After five children and 12 grandchildren, it would be impossible to estimate the number of times we've been in and out of drugstores over the years, and most of the time the store has been a Sav-On. That's why we were so disturbed a few years ago in the Walnut Park Sav-On store in Irvine when we suddenly saw a flock of signs saying, in effect, Osco is here.

When I turned to a supervisor and asked what all that Osco stuff was about, I got a supercilious answer to the effect that now Southern California was going to be big time, because Osco, which earlier had acquired the Sav-On chain, was now going to give Orange County all the wonderful service it gave the rest of the country.

"We're the biggest drugstore chain in the country," the clerk said. "Just wait and see the difference." Well, we waited, and we saw, and what we saw we didn't like, and neither did much of Southern California. Fewer checkout stands, fewer checkout clerks, more merchandise, narrower aisles, and all manner of stuff unrelated to drugs or medicine. Camping gear, cheap wines, novelty junk, seasonal impulse-buying stuff. Only the pharmacy seemed to be the same.

Suddenly, the chain's local share of market began to decline and the spin became steadily worse. The company blamed it on a strange coincidence — the name Osco sounded similar to a hispanic word that meant putrid. Whatever the reason, the company has now spent enormous sums bringing the name Sav-On back, restoring the signs, producing new banners and spending much money on radio and TV and in the newspapers announcing the backstepping.

The Osco fiasco proves once again that corporate board rooms and management teams can have their share of stupid people who have reached their levels of incompetence. Sadly, it takes some companies, like Osco, an awfully long time to admit their errors. Look at Beech-Nut and the admission that they sold colored water as apple juice, and Wall Street with their insider trading scandals, and the long delay of the U.S. auto industry to recognize the seriousness of the imported automobiles, particularly those from Japan. David Halberstam's book, "The Reckoning" relates incredible stories about stupid attitudes and decisions of Detroit's auto bosses.

All of us have our favorite examples of dumb corporate decisions raising the question of just how smart is free enterprise? My favorite is the Edsel, and my personal experience is real: I was an account executive in charge of Edsel advertising for Southern California, and while I rose above this, I may not survive this admission.

It was during my years with Foote, Cone & Belding, one of the world's largest advertising agencies. The agency did not have an automotive account, so when Ford announced it was planning to develop a new medium-sized automobile, our Chicago office vigorously pitched the business, and won. It was all very exciting and the agency had to open a Detroit office.

Ford had no consumer research to indicate whether such a car was wanted. Officials simply looked at the General Motors line and concluded they had no auto to compete with the Buick, and they felt they needed one. GM owners went from Chevy to Olds to Buick to Cadillac, upgrading in the family. Ford owners went from Ford to Mercury to Continental. Mustangs and Thunderbirds were sports cars, not involved with the progression, they said.

While Ford designers worked on the new car, Ford said it needed a name, and the name would not be Edsel. At Foote, Cone & Belding, all employees were asked to submit proposed names. The winner would get one of the new cars as a prize, and remember, the name would not be Edsel.

Well, I suggested all kinds of names, animals, racers, and so on, and at the last minute, suspicious about management, I added the name Edsel. When the Edsel name was announced, I got a check for \$50, the value of the car divided by all those who like me, had put the name on their lists.

Some months later, the Southern California account executive for Edsel left the agency, and I was asked to handle dealer advertising for the Edsel in Southern California, adding it to my other accounts. And I learned about the auto industry the hard way, traveling all over the Southwest — Southern California and Arizona — visiting dealers, driving various Edsel models, listening to customers, and producing ads — primarily radio and newspapers — to support the dealers. The stories of dealer hustling, of back-shop ripoffs, of factory rebates and faulty production, haunt me to this day.

The Edsel failed for two reasons: the new small car imports from Japan and Germany answered consumer demand, and Ford failed to introduce a car that lived up to its advanced advertising. The quality control was virtually non-existent. The Edels were built in old Mercury plants, where factory workers, loyal to Mercury, did slipshod work on the Edsel.

But I firmly believe in the free enterprise system. Some recent excesses, some shameful examples of greed, are generally rewarded with exposure and failure, like the Edsel. And if it weren't for free enterprise, I wouldn't have received \$50 for helping to name the Edsel. As some of my friends said, that's about all the car was worth.

May 29, 1959 A Grand Jury charge of bribery today was dismissed against Orange County Counsel Joel Ogle.

Superior Judge Robert Gardner threw out the Grand Jury indictment on motion of Deputy District Attorney DeWitte Chatterton. He said evidence was lacking to pursue the case against the embattled Ogle.

It was victory number four and a clean sweep for Ogle in courtroom skirmishes.

May 28, 1969 More than 400

Huntington Beach High School District teachers are expected to flex their muscles this week and next by calling a work slowdown and walk-out in protest of the administration's alleged unwillingness to negotiate salary scales.

The teachers, members of the District Educator's Association, were scheduled to begin their protest today by refusing to perform any duties for which they receive no pay, including club duties and noontime supervision.

May 29, 1969 Orange County Health Officer John Philp today officially declared an end to a four-month quarantine of five miles of Orange County beachfront.

The lifting of the swimming and surfing ban along West Newport and Huntington State beaches is effective immediately, in time for the three-day Memorial Day weekend.

May 31, 1979 Gordon West, president of the Newport Harbor Area Chamber of Commerce, renewed his criticism of Newport Beach City Council members today for what he says is their failure to seek positive solutions to the city's traffic problems.

West's criticism was contained in an open letter to Mayor Paul Ryckoff and the six other city council members.

Tapes in tune with Laguna Canyon

A cassette of songs about Laguna Canyon that has been distributed to 75 stores is raising awareness about potential development in the canyon, according to the cassette's promoter.

The songs, written by Laguna Beach resident Jim Rushing, are a blend of rhythm and blues, pop and "environmental rock," according to Rob Whalley, who created the display and is promoting the cassette sales.

With titles such as "Natural Beauty," "Too Many People" and "Solid City," the songs seek to both entertain and educate, Whalley said.

"What's unique about the tape is you can listen to it for music, pleasure or listen to the words and learn about what's going on in the canyon," Whalley said. "The whole tape is keyed to increasing people's awareness about what's happening in the canyon and the environment."

The eight songs, which are sung by Mark Kenoly, are selling for \$10 in supermarkets, hair salons, liquor stores, bars and record stores, including Tower Records in El Toro. Although sales of the cassettes are moving slowly, people are snapping up the brochures about the canyon, which are also tucked into the display, Whalley said.

"The display sells, but even more

important, it educates people about what's going on out there," Whalley said. "Right now it's the main way the brochures are getting out. Most of the time I go back to pick up money and the brochures are gone."

Since the cassettes hit the stores approximately six weeks ago, membership in the Laguna Canyon Conservancy has increased and the group recently received a \$1,000 donation, he said. Proceeds from cassette sales will also go to the Conservancy, he said.

Rushing, who owns Voyager Leather in Laguna and is on the board of the Conservancy, said it took him about a year to create the songs.

"I did it to promote the canyon, to raise the awareness about the preservation of open space," said Rushing, whose avocation is song writing. "We're searching for breakthroughs to inform the people and to raise money. This was a real breakthrough."

Eventually, Whalley said, the cassettes, brochures and display — which says "Buy a tape. Help us save Laguna Canyon" — should be in 200 stores. Although most of the stores now selling the tapes are in Laguna Beach, Whalley said he will be pushing them into surrounding cities.

"By the tapes selling at Tower Records in El Toro, it shows this is not just a local concern," he said. "Everybody loves Laguna Canyon."

Animal rights group facing injunction

LOS ANGELES — A group opposed to the use of animals for medical research today faced an injunction prohibiting its members from harassing, threatening or intimidating UCLA faculty members at their homes.

The order, issued by Superior Court Judge Abby Soven, specifies that members of "Last Chance for Animals" are also barred from breaking into or blocking any UCLA facility, obstructing teaching, research or other functions on the campus and destroying university property.

"UCLA supports the right of all individuals to express their opinions and to protest legally, but strongly condemns the use of threats, intimidation and criminal activity," said UCLA Chancellor Charles Young.

Representatives of the anti-vivisection group were not available for comment.

"I am very pleased that the court was able to distinguish between legitimate, peaceful protest and the type of harassment and threats that these people have decided to under-

take," Young said.

In addition to the injunction, the university has also filed a complaint seeking monetary damages against Last Chance for Animals, alleging that the group's actions have been "deliberately disruptive." UCLA also accused the group of civil conspiracy, violation of the civil rights of faculty members and trespassing.

Yesterday's preliminary injunction will remain in force until the other charges come to trial.

In recent months, the group has held rallies on the UCLA campus in opposition to the use of animals in research laboratories there. Last Chance has been accused of break-ins on the campus and of blocking neighborhood streets around the homes of two UCLA researchers and banging on their doors, demanding that they come outside.

The research programs opposed by the group are apparently aimed at understanding the brain and certain neurological disorders, such as epilepsy, Parkinson's disease, Alzheimer's disease and sudden infant death syndrome.

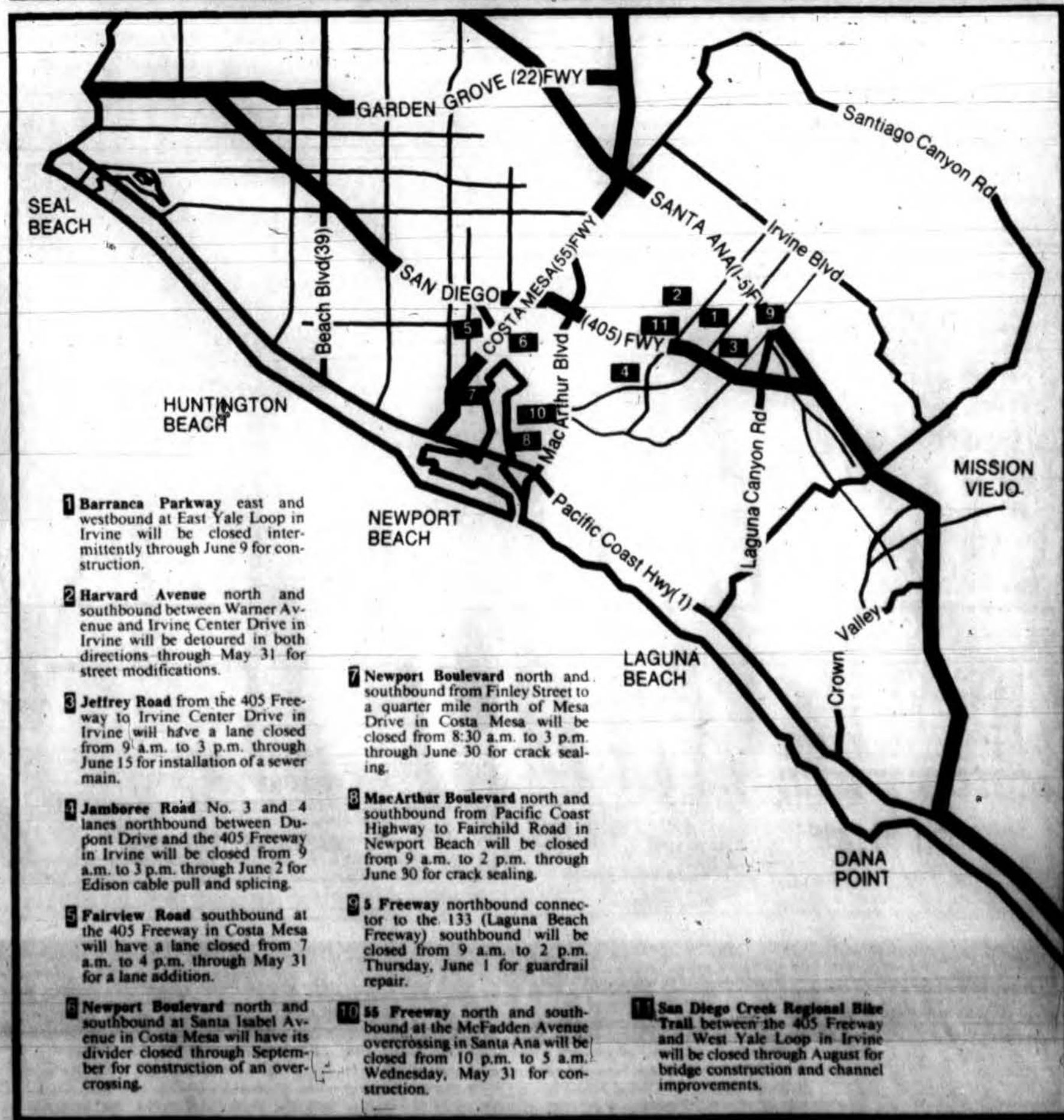

Students march again in Beijing

BEIJING (AP) — Tens of thousands of students formed a huge procession Sunday and left Tiananmen Square to march through central Beijing to press their demands for democratic reforms.

March leaders said students from up to 300 schools and institutes would join the march at various points around the capital.

One student from Beijing Normal University said the goal of the march is "to have Chinese from throughout the world unite" in demanding that the government grant greater political freedom.

Many carried signs demanding the resignations of Premier Li Peng, who declared martial law in Beijing on May 20, and senior leader Deng Xiaoping.

Authorities did not try to stop the

marchers as they set out.

Unlike demonstrations last week that drew up to a million people to sprawling Tiananmen square, including thousands of workers, there appeared to be few people who were not students in Sunday's procession.

Student leaders said workers would probably stay away.

"Factories are now taking economic measures against workers who participate," one student leader said. Some, he said, have had their pay docked.

However, thousands of people lined the streets and crowded onto overpasses to cheer on the marchers.

"Don't stop," some in the crowd yelled. "We won't let you down," students shouted back.

On Saturday, student leaders proposed that demonstrators hold a

climactic rally Tuesday to "celebrate our great victory" and then end their historic two-week occupation of Tiananmen Square.

The call came as hardliners expanded their purge of moderates, whose sympathy for the students triggered the fiercest power struggle since the leftist ideological purges of the Cultural Revolution.

Student leaders said it was time to change tactics in their push for greater freedom and an end to official corruption. But they said protesters in Tiananmen Square, whose numbers had fallen sharply to about 10,000, would have the final say on ending the sit-in.

Top student leaders Wu'er Kaixi, Wang Dan and Chai Ling held a news conference at the square and called for a city-wide march Tuesday

to culminate the protest movement that began April 15.

Also Saturday, President Li Xian-nian made the first public acknowledgment that China was experiencing a power struggle, accusing some Communist Party leaders of plotting to create confusion in the country.

Sources said officials in the media, the party and the army suspected of participating in the protest movement were being told to write "reports" detailing their activities. The reports could be used against them, the sources said, speaking on condition of anonymity.

The developments came two days after Communist Party leader Zhao Ziyang was reportedly stripped of power and placed under house arrest. Zhao's fall signaled a victory for the 84-year-old Deng.

250 soccer fans arrested in Scotland

GLASGOW, Scotland — Soccer fans clashed Saturday in the city center and the streets surrounding a Glasgow stadium before, during and after a game between Scotland and England, and police reported more than 250 arrests.

The annual England-Scotland game, the oldest rivalry in international soccer, often has been the setting for fan violence in recent years. Police in Glasgow had expected problems and made special plans for controlling hooliganism surrounding the game.

Cyclone kills 32, leaves many homeless

CALCUTTA, India — A cyclone killed 17 people in eastern India and then blew across the border to Bangladesh, where 15 more people died, officials and news reports said Saturday.

Winds racing at 80 mph hit the Indian coast late Friday, leaving more than 50,000 people homeless, the Press Trust of India news agency said. Finance Minister Asim Dasgupta of West-Bengal state told reporters 15 people died when at least 10,000 mud and straw houses collapsed in Midnapore, the most severely hit district.

Cardinal O'Connor on hostage mission

BKIRKI, Lebanon — Cardinal John O'Connor of New York arrived Saturday on a visit aimed at focusing the world's attention on foreign hostages held in Lebanon and on the bitter fighting between Christian and Moslem forces.

O'Connor said he did not come to Lebanon to negotiate on behalf of the United States but he would gladly meet with the hostages, even if that meant entering the Moslem sector of Beirut.

Kohl rules out compromise on talks

BONN, West Germany — Chancellor Helmut Kohl said Saturday he opposed postponing proposed U.S.-Soviet talks on short-range nuclear weapons as a possible compromise in the dispute within NATO over the issue.

In a surprise move, Kohl flew later to the Netherlands for talks with Prime Minister Ruud Lubbers over the division in the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

Lubbers has offered to mediate the dispute, in which West Germany is trying to persuade the United States to agree to early talks with the Soviets on short-range atomic arsenals.

Bush, Pope Paul II compare notes

VATICAN CITY — Pope John Paul II told President Bush Saturday that the United States faces an "immense challenge" to promote world peace, alleviate poverty and combat drug abuse and abortion.

The president, concentrating on foreign-policy issues, assured the pope that the United States will help Poland — "the land of your birth" — move toward greater political and economic freedom. Bush also pledged to pursue an active search for peace in troubled areas like Central America and Lebanon.

The two men exchanged formal statements in the papal library after concluding a one-hour private meeting during which Bush sounded out the pope on prospects for political liberalization in Communist-dominated Eastern European

countries.

They also reviewed political and economic reforms instituted by Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev, who will be here in November for the first meeting between a Soviet Communist Party chief and the leader of the world's 850 million Roman Catholics.

The president was ushered into the library with full Vatican pomp by officials in white tie surrounded by Swiss guards.

John Paul praised Bush for a "deep" commitment "to liberate the youth of America from the destructive forces of drug abuse and to alleviate poverty at home and abroad."

But the pope warned that material poverty and drug abuse are "only symptoms of a deeper moral crisis in almost every part of the world —

the spiritual poverty that lies at the basis of so much human suffering."

With the moral foundation bequeathed by its founders, the United States can make an "effective response" to modern-day problems by opposing injustice and war, he said.

Taking up the controversial abortion issue, the pope said the ultimate test of America's greatness will be its respect for "every human person, especially the weakest and most defenseless ones — those as yet unborn."

The pontiff noted that the 200th anniversary of the birth of the federal government coincides with the 200th anniversary of the establishment at Baltimore of the first Catholic diocese in the United States.

Economist: U.S. must have tax increase

WASHINGTON (AP) — Enough talk about "flexible freezes," "sin taxes" and "revenue enhancement" to cut the federal budget deficit, says economist Richard A. Musgrave.

The real solution to the budget problem, insists Musgrave, an authority on public finance, is the old-fashioned one: an increase in the individual income tax. And he wants more than higher rates that hit the wealthy — he is calling for restricting the mortgage interest deduction and for repealing the writeoff for charitable contributions.

"We cannot resolve the federal budget crisis without raising taxes," Musgrave, author of "The Theory of Public Finance," said in a report issued Saturday.

"There is not enough scope for responsible program cuts while paying for the savings-and-loan bailout and beginning to address the growing backlog of unmet needs in education, child care, the environment and public infrastructure," he wrote.

"Increased revenue is needed and should be drawn from the personal income tax," Musgrave said in a report released by the Economic Policy Institute, a research group financed by labor, business and foundations. Musgrave is a professor at the University of California at Santa Cruz and Harvard professor emeritus.

Congress and President Bush agree there will be no general tax increase to reduce the deficit

during the budget year that begins Oct. 1. The president prefers a "flexible freeze" on spending — Congress would not go along — and such "revenue enhancements" as extending the expiring tax on telephone service and blocking a scheduled decline in taxes on air tickets and shipments.

It remains to be seen whether Bush a year from now will abandon his campaign promise against any tax increase. While there is a widespread feeling in Congress that higher taxes will have to be enacted by Oct. 1, 1990, few lawmakers are calling for major changes in the massive 1986 tax overhaul.

Musgrave is. "The proposition that the income tax 'must not be touched' because it has been the subject of recent reform has political appeal but little substance," Musgrave wrote. "On the contrary: The need to provide for additional revenue and to do so promptly should make use of the improved tax, rather than worsen the tax system by resorting to inferior revenue sources or the addition of a new and complex tax."

Raising excise taxes — the "sin taxes" that Congress talks about — would be unfair to lower-income Americans and provide insufficient revenue for deficit reductions, Musgrave says. Imposing a national sales tax, known as a value-added tax, would discriminate against larger families, require a new bureaucracy to administer

and preempt a traditional state revenue source, he adds.

The individual income tax, which already provides 40 percent of federal revenues, "remains superior to other proven taxes and preferable to most alternatives which have been proposed," Musgrave says.

The income tax is highly visible, "a steady reminder of the quality of public service that should be provided in return," the report argues. It permits tax liabilities to be adjusted to the taxpayer's ability to pay and to family size. And, since the 1986 overhaul, the income tax has people with similar incomes paying similar taxes.

But the new law can be improved, making it fairer and providing sizable revenue to reduce the deficit, Musgrave contends. His proposals, which could wipe out the deficit in one year:

- Raise the 33-percent top individual tax bracket, which affects upper-income taxpayers, to 40 percent and impose a new set of graduated rates that would hit some middle-income families.
- Limit the amount of home mortgage interest that can be deducted.
- Repeal the deduction for charitable contributions.
- Tax interest on state and local bonds.
- Tax a portion of the money contributed to pensions, health insurance and other employer-financed benefits.

Democratic leadership crisis denied

SPOKANE, Wash. — House Majority Leader Tom Foley said Saturday the Democratic Party and Congress were not "in a crisis" despite the ethics controversies that have ensnared Speaker Jim Wright and Rep. Tony Coelho.

The Washington congressman said he tried to persuade Coelho, who as majority whip is the No. 3 House Democrat, not to resign from Congress because of a pending ethics investigation into personal finances.

But he said his California colleague told him his decision to quit was irreversible.

AT&T, unions near agreement

WASHINGTON — AT&T and unions representing about 160,000 workers were near agreement on new contracts early Sunday, resolving disputes over medical benefits and wages in a frenetic day of bargaining Saturday and working through the night on a few remaining details.

Disputes over certain job-classification titles and exact contract language covering some areas of agreement blocked a settlement. But, believing an agreement was at hand, the two unions agreed to bargain overnight and terms of contracts due to expire just before midnight Saturday were extended until further notice.

"It's a speck we expect to work out," a company official said of the final dispute. "We think we'll have it done by daybreak (Sunday)," a union official said.

Gas costs jump in wake of pipeline blast

LAS VEGAS — The explosion of a pipeline that provided 90 percent of this city's gasoline supply is expected to raise gasoline prices by at least a nickel a gallon over the Memorial Day weekend, suppliers report.

The increase comes as more than 100,000 tourists were expected in town for the holidays, with 45 percent arriving by car and 10 percent by bus.

"I imagine by the time the weekend is over, a nickel increase will be reflected at the pump," said Jack Greco, chairman of the Nevada Gasoline Retailers Association.

Increases of four cents a gallon were reported at many stations in the first 24 hours following Thursday morning's explosion of the Calne Pipeline in San Bernardino.

Brothers deny planning voodoo hex

TUPELO, Miss. — Voodoo murder is usually the stuff of paperback novels and B-grade movies, but it's shaping up as the fare of a real-life court battle for two men accused of trying to use a hex to kill a judge.

"They are ridiculous charges," insists John Henry Adams, charged along with his half-brother, Leroy Ivy, with conspiracy to commit murder.

Hijacker surrenders to FBI in Miami

MIAMI (AP) — A Cuban immigrant who escaped from a Los Angeles mental hospital tried to hijack an American Airlines jetliner to Cuba on Saturday, but surrendered after the plane landed at Miami, authorities said.

The Boeing 727 carrying 157 passengers and crew en route from Dallas to Miami was diverted toward Cuba temporarily before heading back to its original destination. The

hijacker was armed with a starter's pistol and two knives. No one was injured during the incident.

He was identified as Pedro Rene Comas-Banos, 37, who came to the United States exactly nine years ago Saturday as part of the Mariel boatlift, said FBI agent William Gavin.

The suspect has a history of mental problems, most recently escaping from an institution in the Los An-

geles area, Gavin said, adding that the date of that escape is not yet known.

Before going to Los Angeles, Gavin said, Comas-Banos escaped from St. Elizabeths Hospital in Washington, D.C.

"He's a very confused individual, not at all crystal clear and cogent," Gavin said. "His mind keeps changing."

Dressed in olive-drab fatigues and a bomber-type jacket, the sandy-haired Comas-Banos boarded an American Airlines flight in Los Angeles on Saturday morning and then transferred to the Miami-bound flight in Dallas, Gavin said.

"After the flight left the ground on its way to Miami, he produced a demand note and said he wanted to be taken to Havana," Gavin said.

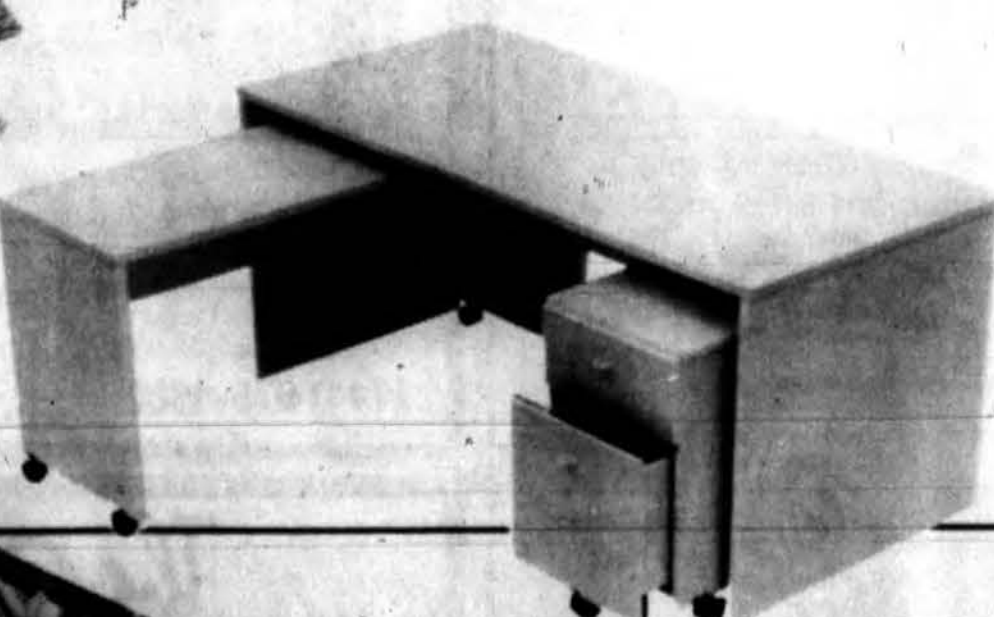

Coelho surprises state politicians

Many California politicians reacted with surprise to the announced resignation of Congressman Tony Coelho, the state's most influential House member.

"What? Oh my god," said Representative Barbara Boxer, D-San Francisco. "I knew he was very depressed about the situation, but I'm really totally taken aback."

"He's so dynamic and so successful at building coalitions for California; for agriculture, for the wine industry, for peace in Central America," Boxer said. "He was a power in the House and when you had Tony on your side, you had a good chance of winning."

Coelho formally announced his resignation Saturday morning, saying the scrutiny over his personal business dealings has impaired his ability to continue as the House's No. 3 Democrat.

Earlier this month, he acknowledged that a junk bond investment netted him a \$6,882 profit without him having to put up any of his own money. Coelho said again Saturday that the transaction was legal, despite reporting errors.

After Coelho's resignation, which he said would be effective June 15, Gov. George Deukmejian will have 14 days to call a special

election to fill the vacancy. The general election must be within 112 to 119 days, with a primary eight Tuesdays before that. All candidates run together in the primary, regardless of party. If one candidate receives more than 50 percent of the vote in the primary, he or she is elected without the further vote. If not, then the top vote-getters from each party compete in the general election.

Coelho's 15th District covers the Central Valley counties of Mariposa, Merced and Stanislaus and rural Fresno County outside the city of Fresno. It is 56 percent Democrat and 35 percent Republican.

Candidates for the seat could include state legislators with overlapping districts, such as Assemblymen Gary Condit, D-Ceres, Rusty Arrias, D-Los Banos, and Jim Costa, D-Fresno, and Senate Minority Leader Ken Maddy, R-Fresno. City and county officials could also seek the suddenly open seat.

"He's not running from anybody; he's not afraid of anything. He feels that he will be completely vindicated. I don't think there's any question about that," said Coelho's predecessor and mentor, former Congressman B.F. Sisk.

"Having known him for a lot of years and been very close to him, I thought of his as my own son. I am not surprised, under the circum-

stances," Sisk said.

While Sisk was one of the few not to express shock over the announcement, he was not alone in defending Coelho's integrity.

"I'm so sad and so shocked that I find it hard to believe," said Rep. Nancy Pelosi, D-San Francisco. "I have every confidence that Tony is honest and he just doesn't want to subject his family and friends to what's ahead in months to come."

"He can see a political wind blowing and I think he's doing the right thing."

In the San Joaquin Valley, where Coelho's home district is located, supporters said his defense of local issues will be missed.

Coelho has defended actively agribusiness and opposed limits on cut-rate federal water for central valley farms.

"I think it's obvious that having a person in the position Tony was in has benefited the valley and particularly, Fresno County," said Fresno County Supervisor Deran Koligian.

"The power he wielded in the House certainly had to be an asset to our district," said Roger Wood, owner of Wood Fruit Co. in Merced County, Coelho's home base. "There are rules, and I expect my representative to follow those rules."

Owner of pipeline wants to relocate line closer to homes

SAN BERNARDINO (AP) — The owner of an underground gasoline pipeline wants to move the line closer to homes that survived a pipeline rupture and explosion last week, an angry city official said Saturday.

"This has to be one of the most callous examples of corporate greed in the United States of America," City Attorney James Penman said. "After killing those people they are going to move the pipeline closer to the survivors."

Charles P. Diamond, an attorney for the Calnev Pipe Line Co., said the company wants to move the pressurized fuel pipeline only about 3 feet east of its existing route "to obviate any safety concerns whatsoever to the existing pipe."

Calnev also planned to ask a federal judge to issue an order prohibiting Penman and other city officials from interfering with Calnev employees working in the area. Penman allegedly threatened to order San Bernardino police to shoot Calnev employees if they try to dig a new trench, Diamond said.

Penman denounced Calnev after company officials canceled an afternoon meeting, which he said was arranged to discuss relocation of the 14-inch pressurized fuel line away

from homes, as well as restitution for area residents.

But Diamond disputed Penman's account, saying the meeting was to enlist the city's help in removing debris and to seek the city attorney's assistance in getting disaster relief area residents.

Although the subject of relocating the pipeline was raised, Diamond said, "I told him that he lives in a hopelessly unrealistic world, and that every major regulatory agency agrees that the pipeline should remain where it is."

William Pugh, an investigator from the federal National Transportation Safety Board declined to comment on the dispute at a news conference Saturday evening.

Pugh deferred reporters' questions about relocating the line to Calnev officials, although he said the company's options were restricted because of property boundaries in the area.

He added that federal investigators will examine an additional 800 to 1,000 feet of the pipeline and conduct metallurgical tests on train parts embedded in the earth near the line.

Unleaded gasoline from the ruptured line fueled a blistering fireball that burned for five hours Thursday,

killing two residents, destroying 10 homes and damaging five others.

Two weeks earlier, a runaway freight train derailed in the same area, killing four people and destroying six homes, and investigators are focusing on the possibility that the freight wreck damaged the pressurized line.

City officials want Calnev to move the pipeline to the west side of a railroad berm running through the area, away from area residents, Penman said. The closest homes on the far side of the berm are about a mile away.

But Penman said Calnev officials decided that moving the pipeline to the far side of the railroad tracks "is going to cost them too much money."

"We're astonished," Penman said. "It's unbelievable."

The city attorney did not know how much it would cost to move the pipeline, but said Calnev officials are "arguing that the new pipe will be brand new and it will be safer than the pipe that's in question."

Regardless, Penman argued, "Any train is always going to go off the outside of the curve, not the inside."

The explosion occurred 13 days after city officials and residents were assured by experts that the Calnev Pipe Line Co.'s underground 14-inch steel pipeline had escaped damage from the May 12 train wreck.

But a report issued Friday by Richard L. Beam, director of the U.S. Department of Transportation Office of Pipeline Safety found that Calnev "did not ascertain the structural integrity of the entire section of the affected pipeline after the May 12, 1989, derailment."

About 270 people have been displaced, but they would be not be allowed to return Saturday, said Bernita Joyner, a police spokeswoman.

Rogers ends his command; no apology

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Capt. Will C. Rogers III ended his two-year tour of duty as skipper of the USS Vincennes on Saturday without apology for the cruiser's mistaken destruction of an Iranian airliner and with a call to combat terrorism.

Navy Capt. Robert B. Lynch took over as new commander of the Aegis cruiser which Rogers defended as "a masterpiece of American technology and ingenuity" despite past criticisms.

Rogers made no mention of the airliner's downing July 3, 1988, instead focusing on a pipe bomb attack last March that destroyed a van driven by his wife, Sharon, as she drove to work in San Diego. Mrs. Rogers escaped injury.

Although the van bombing remains under investigation by the FBI as a possible act of terrorism, Rogers and others who spoke Saturday aboard the heavily guarded Vincennes appeared certain.

Vice Adm. Robert K.U. Kihune told a crowd of about 200 that the bombing was a burden that the Rogers and others in the extended Navy family were "forced to share when the cancer of terrorism struck so close to home."

Rogers, whose wife lost her teaching job after the bombing because of the private school's concerns about safety, said "non-combatants" and cowardice have no place in the war against terrorism.

"In this day of violent peace, there exists an active, subterranean and shadowy war — a war which does not employ the sophistication of complex weaponry or large maneuver forces."

"Kather, it is a conflict that pits rabid ideology against the soft underbelly of irrational fear, preys on a lack of courage and enlists those without moral conviction," Rogers said.

Fighting inmates shot by guards

FOLSOM — In the second incident in three days, two inmates suffered gunshot wounds Saturday when guards fired to stop a fight, prison officials said.

The two inmates, whose names were not released, were listed in stable condition at University Medical Center in Sacramento, said prison spokesman Jim Graham.

He said one inmate was attacking another in the administrative segregation area. "The assailant was given several verbal warnings to stop his attack, but failed to do so. A shot for effect was fired, striking the assailant in the left thigh," Graham said.

He said the other inmate received a minor wound to his left thigh.

Man beaten to death by 2 attackers

COMPTON — A man was beaten to death and his companion injured by two men who attacked them as they walked to a bar, authorities said. One assailant used a baseball bat in the 10:42 p.m. Friday assault, said Lt. Al Smith. They remained at large and there were no specific descriptions.

The dead man was identified as Jose Britos, 26. The other man was not identified. He was released after treatment at a hospital.

Officer in beating had stress problems

SAN FRANCISCO — A police officer at the center of a controversy over the beating of United Farm Workers co-founder Dolores Huerta was sued twice for wrongful assault and was told to get stress counseling just weeks before the activist was injured, a newspaper reported.

Officer Francis Achim, 38, also has been on duty until recently for five years without a license, according to Sunday editions of the San Francisco Examiner-Chronicle.

All San Francisco Police Department officers are required to have valid driver's licenses, but it was not immediately clear whether Achim illegally drove police vehicles. Achim recently renewed his expired license.

Soviets increase spy ship activity

LOS ANGELES — Soviet electronic intelligence-gathering ships have sharply increased their monitoring activity off the West Coast during the past two years, according to a published report.

Since 1987, specially designed auxiliary general intelligence ships have been present about two out of every three days just beyond the 12-mile territorial limit that marks the United States' offshore boundary, the Los Angeles Times reported in its Saturday editions.

Officials fail to find source of fungus

RIVERSIDE — Officials have failed to determine how a fungus infected seven heart surgery patients, prompting closure of the Riverside Community Hospital cardio-surgical unit.

The hospital's medical board has scheduled a meeting Tuesday to decide when elective heart surgery and angioplasty may resume, Robert A. Minkin, the hospital's chief operating officer, said Friday.

The hospital halted non-emergency heart surgery and cardiac angioplasty on May 18 after four of the hospital's heart surgeons reported a fungus, candida albicans, growing in the chest incisions of seven patients. Angioplasty is a procedure that helps open clogged blood vessels.

Salcido's mother wants custody

SANTA ROSA — The mother of mass murder defendant Ramon Salcido said she loves her 3-year-old granddaughter Carmina Salcido and wants to take custody of the child, who survived a knife attack that left her two sisters dead.

"Yes, of course, I want custody of Carmina," said Valentina Bojorquez Armendarez, 48, who hopes the girl can live with her in Mexico.

"I accept her with arms wide open," she said, in a telephone interview Friday from her home in Los Mochis, Sinaloa, Mexico.

Diocese fights showing of sex film

LOS ANGELES — A news conference and forum dealing with the problems caused by pornography was held at the public library in Palos Verdes Saturday. The forum was sponsored by the Los Angeles Catholic Archdiocese' Commission on Obscenity and Pornography.

Bishop Carl Fisher of the Archdiocese' San Pedro Pastoral Region joined Archbishop Roger Mahony in demanding that United States Attorney Robert Bonner take legal action to reverse U.S. District Judge David Kenyon's ruling that five sexually explicit films could be made available in the Los Angeles area.

Calendar shows conflict evidence

LOS ANGELES — Although the mayor denies knowing the city was doing business with a bank while he was serving as a paid adviser to the institution, information from an old appointment calendar may indicate otherwise.

The Los Angeles Times reported Saturday that it had obtained copies of Bradley's calendar showing that he met with Far East National Bank Chairman Henry Hwang on March 16, 1988 — five days before the city made a \$1 million deposit at the bank.

Protesters back Chinese students

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Protesters and hunger-strikers demonstrated outside the Chinese Consulate Saturday to support the student-led pro-democracy movement that has triggered a political crisis in China.

The crowd outside the consulate was estimated to number 500 but had caused no problems, said police Sgt. Alex Salazar.

Philip Lam, an organizer of the demonstration, said a 24-hour hunger strike began at noon. Participants were students from local universities.

Chinese students and other supporters of the Beijing and Shanghai protests also rallied at the consulate a week earlier.

In Beijing, leaders of the protest movement proposed that demonstrators hold one more rally this week and then end their historic two-week occupation of Tiananmen Square.

Despite market rally, brokerage stocks languishing

NEW YORK — Many investors may be celebrating the stock market's recent comeback, but there's little to shout about for people who bet on the securities industry itself.

Share prices of most publicly held investment firms, particularly those that do a large amount of their business with the public, linger far below their peaks earlier in the 1980s.

For example, Merrill Lynch, around \$30 last week, is trading for barely half its 1983 high of \$56.50.

Salomon Inc., a pre-eminent investment banker, stood recently around \$26, vs. a high just three years ago of \$59.50.

The stock of Charles Schwab Corp., the largest of the discount

brokers, has rallied from a post-crash \$5.75 to \$11.75 as of late last week. That's still quite a way short, however, of the \$16.50 price it commanded when it was first offered to the public in September of 1987.

There's no mystery about all this to regular readers of the financial pages. While stock prices have risen sharply in the past six months, most sources of brokers' income remain depressed.

Individual investors are still wary or just plain turned off. Competition for business from investing institutions has shaved commissions on their trades razor-thin.

"Continued sluggishness in capital and consumer market activity, combined with a barrage of negative articles in the press concerning the near-term outlook for the brokerage

business, has kept pressure on the brokerage stocks," said Lawrence Eckenfelder, an analyst who follows the industry for Prudential-Bache Securities.

For firms such as Merrill Lynch and PaineWebber, Eckenfelder observed in his current monthly report on the group, "the story is still the same."

"In order for earnings to move upward in a meaningful way from current levels, the retail business must gain momentum."

The Value Line Investment Survey, which has just published its quarterly appraisal of the securities industry, ranks it 83rd out of 92 groups it follows for likely stock-price performance over the next 12 months.

"Ever since the stock market col-

lapsed in October 1987, trading volume has been severely depressed," the investment advisory service observed.

"But, at least among the big Wall Street firms, mergers and acquisitions (and the hefty fees they bring in) have been picking up the slack."

"Now some wariness has set in: Will Congress limit the size of buyouts? Will rising interest rates make heavy debt burdens too risky?"

"Although there aren't yet any definitive answers to these questions, merger and acquisition activity has been on the back burner since

the start of the year. In the first quarter, for example, the number of transactions dropped 30 percent from the year-ago quarter, and dollar volume fell 58 percent.

"Many companies report there are enough deals in the pipeline so that second quarter results should show an increase, but at this point we're not expecting 1989 to catch up to 1988."

A telling gauge of the state of Wall Street is the price of a seat, or membership, at the New York Stock Exchange. On May 9, a seat changed hands for \$500,000, less than half

the pre-crash record of \$1.15 million.

"Seat prices have a volatile history, in line with the boom-bust cycles that regularly recur in the securities business," noted John Connolly at Dean Witter Reynolds Inc. in a recent commentary.

"In 1977 times were so bad that an NYSE seat sold for \$35,000, or slightly less than the price of a New York City taxi medallion."

"For those who insist that history must repeat itself, we would note that cab medallions are bid at \$140,000."

Maker of artificial limbs now selling worldwide

Jim Ott is a prosthetist at Orthomedics who fits artificial legs for amputees. For a dozen patients who have come to his office in Laguna Hills in the past year, Ott has recommended a limb called Flex-Foot.

Ott's goal is to give as much back to the amputee as he or she lost. It's difficult to imitate Mother Nature, he said, but Flex-Foot offers more action than other designs he's examined.

The curved piece of graphite within Flex-Foot replaces the muscles running from toe to knee. The flexible material stores and releases energy, nearly duplicating the springy heel-to-toe action of the human foot and calf.

Ott has seen patients try Flex-Foot for the first time after years of wearing older designs that act more like a bucket around the foot than a walking aid. For many, once they try the new design, they swear they'll never go back, he said. "It's very obvious that it's an emotional issue for them."

Testimony from those patients has kept Flex-Foot Inc. growing every year since it began manufacturing and selling artificial limbs in 1984. Based in Laguna Hills, the firm sells 3,000 limbs a year at a cost of \$5,000 each. Last year business grew more than 20 percent.

More than 100,000 people become lower-limb amputees each year. Most are age 50 and older and undergo limb removal because of diabetes, vascular problems and tumors. About 15 percent of amputees lose their limbs in accidents.

San Diego resident Van Phillips never really thought about making artificial legs until a water skiing outing one sunny day in 1976 ended in tragedy. Phillips' leg was fully torn away just below the knee by a boat propeller.

Phillips, 35, combined what he learned during a subsequent two-year prosthetics program at Northwestern University with basic knowledge of pole vaulting he acquired while competing on his high school track team. In just a week after meeting with an engineer, the first Flex-Foot was finished in Salt Lake City.

Today the feet still are produced in a Utah plant. The hand-laid carbon graphite filaments are placed in a mold, resins are added and heat pressure forms the false limb. Am-

putees can have the structures dressed up to look like a human leg. Some choose to have lines painted on the cast to simulate veins.

In 1984, a longtime marketer for pharmaceutical firms Merck Sharp, Dohme and Allergan saw a videotape of Phillips' creation. J. Roberts Fosberg, now president and chief executive officer of Newport Pharmaceuticals International Inc. gave Phillips the financial backing the firm needed to start up.

"This is a dream," Fosberg said. "This product gives you more reward than anything I've ever worked with." The firm now has about 5,000 feet walking around the world, including Scandinavia, Canada, Japan,

France and England.

One of those feet is being worn by Tom Whittaker, an amputee mountain climber who is attempting to scale Mt. Everest this month. Another is worn by Dennis Oehler, world-record holder for the disabled in the 100-meter-dash.

Fosberg enjoys collecting thank-you letters at his office. One shows a picture of a young girl practicing ballet. She was born with one leg shorter than the other and now wears a Flex-Foot product.

Phillips said he had a hunch the invention was a universal desire when he began designing Flex-Foot. "The first four or five people raved over them as much as I did. It was a good feeling."

Time-Warner merger approved

WASHINGTON — The Federal Communications Commission on Friday approved the \$18 billion merger of Time Inc. and Warner Communications Inc., removing the last federal regulatory hurdle to the creation of the world's largest entertainment and media conglomerate.

The commission had to review the transaction because a Time subsidiary — American Television and Communications Corp. — operates cable television systems in the Los Angeles and Austin, Texas, areas, overlapping the viewership of television stations owned by Chris-Craft Industries Inc. Chris-Craft controls a 15.5 percent block of Warner stock and would hold about 12 percent of the combined conglomerate.

The FCC granted a temporary waiver of its cross-ownership restrictions to allow the companies 18 months to comply with the rules. There are at least four possible ways to do that: American Television could sell the affected cable systems; Chris-Craft could sell its television subsidiary, or it could reduce its stake in the combined Time-Warner to below 5 percent, or Time-Warner could apply and receive a permanent waiver from the FCC.

"We perceive no public interest benefit in removing cable service to the many communities involved in this matter until a buyer or buyers can be found," the commission wrote in its opinion. "The alternative would be to hold up a major transaction of which the cable systems constitute but a very small part."

The chairmen of both companies,

J. Richard Munro of Time and Steven J. Ross of Warner, said in a joint statement: "We are delighted to have successfully completed the federal review process necessary for our merger. ... We are confident that the nation's policymakers will not be disappointed in the pro-competitive, pro-American and pro-consumer impact of the merger."

Seven weeks ago, the Justice Department ruled that the merger would not violate anti-trust laws. On Monday, the Securities and Exchange Commission approved proxy materials for separate Time and Warner shareholders' meetings scheduled June 23 in New York. A majority of shareholders of record on May 1 must approve the merger, which was announced on March 3.

The transaction must also be approved by several local cable franchising authorities.

CM Council abandons its social issue

To the Editor:

For over a year the Costa Mesa's Human Relations Committee has worked diligently to foster a forum for community interaction that would ease the existing tensions that certain Anglo citizens feel toward the Hispanic unemployed. At the last Human Relations Committee meeting we were also asked to get involved with the developing gang problems in Costa Mesa.

How does one help a community move forward in areas of conflicting sensitivity? Regardless of what one tries to do, the initial goal is to create an environment of respect and mutual goodwill among those in conflict.

Through diligent effort we came to conclude that one of the most positive ways that a sense of good feeling could be fostered would be to encourage the people to party together. It was our feeling that a festival once a year was insufficient to maintain the momentum of good will that it creates, so we proposed to the city the concept of the neighborhood festivals spaced at one a month.

The City Council rejected this concept of developing a momentum of good will by refusing to fund the neighborhood festival. It is hard to see the economics of this decision when one thinks of the cost of police time to monitor and enforce a growing number of possibly unconstitutional city ordinances developed to keep the undocumented workers from gathering in the parks and on the streets. The cost is further compounded when one calculates the cost of police involvement in the growing area of gang activities.

The decision by the City Council to not fund the neighborhood festivals reminds me of a something I saw when I was a lifeguard back in 1963.

It would happen every summer. Among the rescues there would always be one or two of

them. It usually happened to the largest and toughest of them. He'd be with his girlfriends and his buddies, they had been drinking a little, the music was too loud and then there would be the dare.

I was working at the swim stadium, next to the Los Angeles Coliseum and the diving pool had a deep end of over six feet. To get into the pool one had to pass a swim test and of course for the tough guys that was out of the question. So on the dare, he'd jump the fence and with as much cool as he possessed, he'd swagger to the diving platform, which was 30 feet high. Up he'd climb to the top, waving to his friends, strutting his stuff. Sure enough, he'd dive off, looking as good as an Olympic champion, doing a beautiful swan dive, cutting cleanly into the water, arrowing downward and downward to the bottom where he'd sit because he could not swim and his muscular body had a negative buoyancy.

It could almost could see his eyes looking up at me on the guard tower through 17 feet of water. Too cool to thrash around. Too together to signal for help. Eyes that dared me to come save him.

I was the lifeguard, wasn't I? I was paid to save lives, so I'd blow my whistle and dive in, swim to the bottom, grab hold of this giant and haul him to the surface. It was always the same.

Once at the edge he'd start to curse me and carry on like I had just committed an unforgivable offense.

Insulting me, he'd leap out of the water and yell so his friends could hear, "What in the hell you'd do that for, I was doing fine, you know, just checking things out..."

Our City Council, except for Mary Hornbuckle, reminds me of this young macho tough guy.

Our city is sitting under 17 feet of trouble. The Human Relations Committee was formed by the City Council and each of us who serve on this

committee was chosen by the council based upon our experience with social issues. On what rational basis of judgement did the council reject our years of experience when turning down the neighborhood festival as a relevant step in the creation of good will? None!

When I remember the laughing eyes of Genis, Amburgey and Buffa as they sat there refusing to second Hornbuckle's motion for approval of funding for the festival I feel a deep sadness. Who is going to be hurt by the City Council of Costa Mesa? The purported City of the Arts not funding the festivals? When the gangs take to the streets because their teenage members have been abandoned by the community, we'll see who gets hurt.

The old lady afraid to walk the streets. The businesses broken into. The automobiles stolen. The drugs in the schools. How much is it going to cost to go to court when the ordinances to prevent people from congregating in the parks on the basis of the intent of seeking employment are challenged?

The City Council has failed to provide a positive environment for social interaction, and who will have the right to complain when the darkness spreads?

At our next Human Relations Committee meeting what are we going to come up with? A letter to the community apologizing for our inability to prevent ourselves from being rendered neuter?

The message to the Hispanic community is clear — be rich or be put under.

It's a shame that such an unAmerican idea of intolerance has become the motto for so many of our citizens and the new banner for the City of Arts.

Last summer, at the request of the homosexual community and against the wishes of hundreds of Irvine residents, who packed the Irvine City Council chambers, the Irvine City Council adopted a "human rights" ordinance that would include protection for a person's "sexual orientation."

Free market should include banking industry

To the Editor:

As taxpayers continue to read about the legislation to bailout insolvent savings and loans, they should understand the individual costs involved.

In fact, if you divide the combined estimated number of individual/married/corporate income tax filers in 1988 — approximately 111 million — into the estimated \$150 billion S&L bailout bill, each filer will have to shell out an average \$1,351 to clean up the S&L situation.

Unfortunately, this has been necessitated by a fundamentally flawed regulatory structure.

Both the administration and Congress have pledged "never again" shall a situation like this occur. Yet the current regulatory scheme governing the U.S. financial services industry is antiquated, inefficient and not equipped to prevent such a crisis. The savings and loan fiasco is really a warning, signalling broader problems facing our nation's entire financial services sector.

The Depository Institution Affiliation Act (DIAA), a bill recently introduced by Senators D'Amato, Cranston and Garn in the Senate and by Rep. Barnard and seven of his colleagues in the House, addresses the need for overall structural reform of the financial services industry.

In effect, this bill would break down barriers between providers of financial services, allowing companies to own both banks and other lines of business, provided the bank is well-capitalized and firewalls are in place to prevent abuses.

Increased competition means improved services at better prices for consumers. American consumers should be able to choose from a variety of enhanced financial products shaped through free-market enterprise.

People concerned about preventing fiscal disasters as well as the development of competitive financial products should call or write their congressman with their opinion.

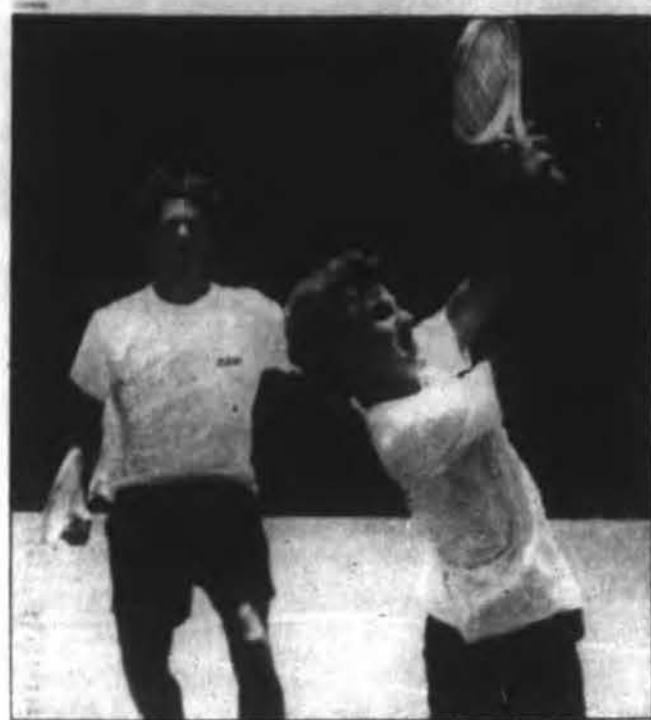

Leach, the defending CIF champion, beat Willie Quest of Long Beach Wilson in the semifinals Saturday, 6-4, 6-2, while Mancisidor disposed of Randy Ivey of Woodbridge, 6-4, 5-7, 6-4.

Leach got off to a good start against Mancisidor, a senior, but then grew tired in the second set.

Mancisidor, a top junior player in Spain before he was brought to Palm Springs in 1986 by countryman and former touring pro Jorge Higuera, wore down Leach with his strong baseline volley game.

As Leach prefers to attack near the net, Mancisidor patiently stayed back and volleyed. He was able to lob over Leach and produce several superb passing shots after

Leach had committed to the net.

Leach took a 2-1 lead in the second set but Mancisidor won the next seven games, including the first two games of the third set. Leach won the next game but then Mancisidor took over, winning the final four.

"He kept me off-balance from the second set on," Leach said. "Suddenly I just lost my energy and wasn't serving well."

"Once he broke my serve in the second set, the whole thing turned around. He only has one way to play and that's to stay back and wear you out. He did that to me. And then when you start losing, you feel even more tired."

Until Saturday, both players were undefeated in match play this year.

Mancisidor became eligible for CIF com-

petition only this year, however. His advantage is being able to train with Higuera, the head pro at Mission Hills Tennis Club.

"I didn't even know about Alejo until the tournament started," Leach said. "I figured Willie (Quest) was the top player."

Leach, the No. 1-ranked player in Southern California in the 16-and-under age group in 1988, won an emotional match over Quest, No. 1 in the 18s, with whom he has no love loss. There were a few heated exchanges between the two during the match and some shoving when it ended.

"He tried to intimidate me with some comments," Leach said of Quest. "We hadn't played each other since we were about 10. But because he's older, I think he resents me."

The cool and collected Mancisidor would have no part of that, though.

"I knew Leach would start missing shots after the first set because he was making so many and the odds were just not in his favor," he said. "Plus, I sensed he was getting tired. I was playing confident from the end of the first set on. When I had him down, 5-2, in the second set, I knew the match was mine."

Laguna Beach Coach Bob Walton said he thought Leach was getting into trouble when he attempted to rally with Mancisidor in the second set.

"Jon just can't do that yet," he said. "Jon had to pressure him (at the net) to win. He

Flag's up at Indy 500

Three-time winner Mears in front row for a 'faster' 500

INDIANAPOLIS — The Indy 500 is always speed, danger, excitement, and tension.

Today's race will be one more thing: faster. So fast, in fact, it will even sound different. The cars growl instead of whine.

Thirty-three ground-hugging machines, the fastest field in racing history, are scheduled to take the green flag for the 73rd Indy 500 today.

On TV, Channel 7, 8 a.m.

Rick Mears, the fastest Indy-car driver of all time, will be in front, as he has been four previous times. And he will try to become the first repeat winner since Al Unser in 1970-71.

"It's always good to start up front," the defending and three-time Indy champion said. "But especially with the speeds we'll be running here at the start — maybe 215 or 216 — it will be good to be out ahead of the real traffic."

"With all the cars bouncing around in the dirty air and the



adrenalin flowing at the start, anything can happen," he said. "But if everybody just keeps their head and remembers that there's no glory or money for winning the first couple of laps, it should be a good race."

That's what is expected by the 400,000 who show up at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway each year — the largest audience in sports. Besides the crowd, filling an estimated, 290,000 seats and the sprawling infield, a national television audience will watch the live broadcast by ABC.

The National Weather Service forecast for today called for sunny skies early, clouds increasing during the day, with highs in the 70s and a southeast wind at 5 to 10 mph.

Highs on the track, as Mears said, could approach 220.

The record for a single race lap of 209.517, which Mears set on lap 166 last May, is nearly certain to fall

early in the 200-lap event. The record field average during qualifications was 216.588.

Mears, who set one- and four-lap qualifying records of 224.254 mph and 223.885, is the spearhead of the dominating Penske Racing team led by Roger Penske.

Penske's drivers have won seven Indy 500s and started from the pole eight times, Indianapolis records.

A year ago, his three drivers — Mears, four-time winner Unser and 1985 champion Danny Sullivan — combined to lead 192 of the 200 laps after an unprecedented sweep of the front-row starting positions.

"I come to Indy to win for the team and the drivers," Penske said. "You've got to realize there's only one Indy every 365 days. You have to do whatever it takes."

"Some people say that running a two- or three-car team hurts the overall effort," he added. "I think if you can put two or three cars on the track at Indy, with drivers who know how to win, you've got a great chance."

Most drivers don't like the idea of sharing the chance at victory with anyone else, but Penske says his drivers don't mind.

"They certainly know they can't all be in the winner's circle," he said. "But, if the team wins, everybody wins. They're willing to take that chance, and the money that's won is

Lakers just 48 minutes away

Phoenix must win four in a row to survive

PHOENIX (AP) — The Los Angeles Lakers have their broom ready.

Seeking their third straight NBA title, the Lakers are within one game of a third straight sweep in the playoffs.

They can wrap up their Western Conference finals with the Phoenix Suns by winning Game 4 this afternoon at the Arizona Veterans Memorial Coliseum.

Los Angeles used another fourth-quarter rally to beat Phoenix 110-107 Friday night for a 3-0 lead in the best-of-7 series.

No team in NBA history has ever come back from an 0-3 deficit to win a seven-game playoff series. Moreover, the Suns have lost all five previous playoff series to Los Angeles, getting swept 4-0 in 1982 and 3-0 in 1985.

"They got their work cut out for them," Los Angeles coach Pat Riley said. "We're a little bit ahead of the

pack right now, but we still have 48 minutes of basketball to play and we have to win one more before we move on.

"Phoenix is a proud team and they're going to come hard. We just have to be ready. I just hope we don't have to do what we did in Seattle (in Game 4) and come back from 29 points down" to win 97-95 on May 14.

The Lakers, who swept Portland 3-0 and Seattle 4-0, now are 10-0 in the playoffs this season, setting a league record for consecutive post-season victories. They have won 12 consecutive playoff games dating back to last year and 15 straight overall counting this regular season.

"It's not a big concern to us. We don't ever talk about any streaks. That can end tomorrow and it won't mean anything," Magic Johnson said. "We just need to keep taking it one game at a time. We need to keep

working, working, working to get our goal. We just have to go in and do it again Sunday."

In each game, defense wog it for the Lakers.

After Phoenix erased a 93-83 fourth-quarter deficit to take a 105-102 lead with 1:22 remaining Friday night, Los Angeles reserve center Mychal Thompson blocked a jumper by Dan Majerle with 22 seconds remaining and then helped force the Suns rookie guard to miss two 3-point goals down the stretch.

The Lakers hit eight free throws — four by Thompson — in the final 64 seconds to seal the victory.

"The last minute and a half was all defense," said Johnson, who finished with 20 points, 11 assists and nine rebounds. "Defense has been the key all season. If the game's close, we'll win it. There's no safe lead in a playoff game, especially if you're playing us."

"We're an experienced team. We don't get rattled. We never panic. We just keep working until we get something that works."

"We just kept our poise and executed properly down the stretch," said Lakers forward James Worthy, who had 14 of his 29 points in the fourth period and also grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds.

The Suns made 61 percent of their field goals (14 of 23) in the second period to take a 54-50 halftime lead before Los Angeles went to a trapping defense.

"Coach Riley got on us at the half and felt like a trap would work," Johnson said. "We put in the trap all through the second half and that was the key."

"We were trying to step up the tempo in the third quarter when they finally went to their zone defense," Phoenix coach Cotton Fitzsimmons said. "Part of the time, it was just a straight zone. The other time it was the so-called trap zone so they could keep the ball away from Kevin as much as possible."

Unstoppable Jordan rolls on, 99-97

CHICAGO — It might be the simplest play in sports, and the most effective.

Give the ball to Michael Jordan and everyone else get out of the way.

That's how Chicago coach Doug Collins described Jordan's short jumper with three seconds left Saturday that gave the Bulls a 99-97 victory over the Detroit Pistons and a 2-1 lead in the NBA Eastern Conference finals.

"It's a challenge when everybody in the gymnasium, including Detroit, knows you're going to get the ball," said Jordan, who scored 46 points and keyed a startling comeback from a 90-77 deficit in the final 6:18. "It was a very special shot."

"When you have Michael Jordan, you always have a chance to win," Collins said.

Jordan scored 10 of his 17 fourth-

quarter points during a three-minute span, and his drive with 53 seconds left made it 97-95 before Horace Grant tied it with two free throws with 28 seconds remaining after a foul by Dennis Rodman.

"Jordan just took over the game and showed why he's the superstar he is," Pistons coach Chuck Daly said. "If a team can control the game like that at the end, it deserves to win."

Bill Laimbeer was called for an offensive foul with nine seconds left, setting up Jordan's game-winning for Chicago. He took an inbound pass from Scottie Pippen and drove to the right of the basket before banking in a jumper.

"I wanted to make sure we got the last shot," Jordan said. "I jumped horizontally to keep from charging."

"I knew we were in trouble," Daly said. "I switched Rodman to him, but he got free to the right and we

couldn't stop him."

Jordan credited Pippen, who scored only seven points on 2-for-10 shooting while playing with a bruised arch, with getting the comeback started with a 3-pointer with 5:12 left, making the score 90-83.

"I think the Pistons relaxed, thinking the game was over," Jordan said. "Then Scottie hit a 3-pointer and things went our way after that. The crowd got involved and we got motivated."

The Bulls, seeking their third straight upset in the playoffs, retained the homecourt advantage in the series with Saturday's victory. Half of the four remaining games of the best-of-7 series are scheduled for Chicago, starting Monday with Game 4.

Mark Aguirre led Detroit with 25 points, while Vinny Johnson had 19, including 11 in the fourth quarter. Bill Cartwright scored 15 points for the Bulls.

JOE'S LASAGNA
1 pound lean ground beef or veal
1/4 cup minced onion
3 cups tomato sauce
1 teaspoon basil
1/2 teaspoon chopped parsley
1/2 teaspoon oregano
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder or 1 clove garlic, minced
1/2 cup freshly ground black pepper
4-ounce can chopped mushrooms or 1/2 cup thin-sliced fresh mushrooms
1 10-ounce package frozen spinach, chopped, thawed and well drained
8 ounces low-fat cottage cheese
4 ounces skimmed milk mozzarella, grated cheese
1 pound lasagna noodles (whole wheat, soy, or your favorite kind)

In medium-size, nonstick skillet, sauté ground meat and onion until onion is tender, and meat browned. Do not add fat or oil to skillet. Add tomato sauce, basil, parsley, oregano, garlic, pepper and mushrooms to ground meat mixture. Combine well-drained spinach with cottage cheese.

Cook 1/2 pound noodles in boiling water until tender, and drain. Lightly oil an 8 x 13-inch baking dish. Arrange in layers, beginning with 1/2 of the noodles on the bottom. Spread a layer of the spinach mixture, then the meat mixture, then some grated mozzarella cheese. Repeat layers ending with cheese on top.

Bake in 375 F oven for 15 to 20 minutes, or until hot and bubbly. Yield: 6 servings. Approx. cal. serv. 405.

FRANCE

If you're planning a European vacation this summer, it may be one of the best years to include France as part of your itinerary. For this year, not only can you see the usual sites, such as Paris' Place de la Concorde, Eiffel Tower, Sacre Coeur, sidewalk cafes, and museums, but you can partake of some special festivities as well — in Paris and in other places.

In celebration of the Bicentennial of the French Revolution, France has scheduled fireworks spectacles, pageants and parades, special exhibitions, and performances throughout the summer. Plus, this is the season for a 100th birthday fete for the Eiffel Tower.

Events are already under way in Paris at the Petit Palais, where an exhibition of the 1889 centennial of the revolution, entitled "When Paris Danced with Marianne," will be pres-

ented through September; while at the Grand Palais, "Dance and Revolution" will be the theme of ballets performed through Aug. 28.

Parades, pageants, and a re-enactment of the creation of the Estates General will fill the streets of Versailles on June 17 and 18, while tall ships from around the world will gather together under the theme, "Sails of Liberty" in Rouen Harbor from July 9 through 16.

On July 14, which marks the anniversary of the storming of the Bastille, the new Bastille Opera (built next to the Place de la Bastille in Paris) will present Mozart's "Don Giovanni" in a pre-opening performance.

And, also in Paris, beginning this month, and continuing to October, the 100th birthday of the Eiffel Tower will be celebrated with fireworks, sound-and-light shows, and on-site exhibitions.

It is expected that 25 million American visitors will join the celebrations of the Bicentennial Year, especially since the French Government Tourist Office along with Air France and some 47 partners in the French travel industry, are currently promoting "France

'89 — A Great Value."


With prices guaranteed in U.S. dollars through the end of 1989, the French are offering more than 13,000 hotel rooms starting at \$41 a night; Air France packages to Paris (including airfare and a week's stay in a luxury hotel) from \$949; FrenchRail passes from \$99; as well as Air Inter's seven-day France Pass for \$210, featuring unlimited travel on the domestic airline's 50 routes.

Also, Air France has a wider selection of tours and travel services than in previous years. The choices include fly/drive vacations, Paris/Riviera packages, or Paris/Italy combinations, and other options such as hot-air ballooning, and a new "Paris Passport" for sightseeing, shopping, and transportation around the city.

Following are some examples, with prices listed per person, based on double occupancy, flying roundtrip from Los Angeles.

"Bonjour Paris" is a one-week package offering six nights in a choice of 12 deluxe-to-tourist hotels, round-trip airfare, half-day sightseeing, tour in a private, chauffeur-driven

All Dressed Up for

NETHERLANDS

Bathed in the colors of spring

The spring and summer seasons in the Netherlands are a floral extravaganza.

Crocuses, daffodils, narcissus, hyacinths, and tulips begin to bloom in March and April, joined by lilacs and rhododendrons in May, and lilies and roses in June. Summer is also the time for carnations, freesias, gladioli, hydrangeas, Dutch orchids, and large fields of purple heather.

If you plan a visit here between late March and late May, you can see many varieties of flowers at Keukenhof Gardens in Lisse, about a half hour out of Amsterdam. Billed as the world's largest flower garden, Keukenhof covers almost 70 acres

with more than six million tulip bulbs in addition to many other bulb flowers.

A few miles away, in this same bulb-growing region, are the Frans Roozen gardens and nursery in Vogelensang. The show garden here is smaller, but it is surrounded by almost 100 acres of magnificent flower fields.

May and June are the best months to view the rhododendron displays in the provinces of Utrecht and Gelderland and in the parks of The Hague, while July 1 through Sept. 30 marks the annual International Rose Exhibition in the The Hague's Woestbrook Park, where more than 20,000 roses come into bloom. (Surprising, but true, Holland grows and

exports more varieties of roses than tulips.)

Beyond the summer season, you will find plenty of greenhouse flowers at stores, stands, and weekly flower markets and auctions all through the fall and winter. At Aalsmeer, no more than 20 miles southwest of Amsterdam, is the largest flower auction in the world. Many of the flowers, all picked fresh each morning, are packed and shipped to other European cities for resale the same day.

Besides its bountiful flowers, though, this tiny nation on the North Sea has much more to offer vacationers — from the museums, shops, and waterways of Amsterdam to the historic cities and provincial villages of the outlying areas.

Most vacationers first arrive by way of Amsterdam's Schiphol Airport, cited as "the most preferred airport in the world" by voters in three independent surveys conducted by business travel magazines. The airport received high marks for its efficiency, cleanliness, good connections, and easy

transfers.

We arrived at Schiphol on British Airways from London. British Airways has a "London, Plus" package which includes all air transportation (round-trip from the U.S. and between countries), accommodations, and sightseeing in London plus another European city or country for one price.

After checking in at the Ascot Hotel on Damrak St., we walked a few blocks to the downtown docks opposite Centraal Station (a gathering spot for trains, trams, buses, and taxis), and hopped aboard one of the glass-topped excursion boats for a tour of Amsterdam via its waterways.

A seaport since the 13th Century, Amsterdam often has been called "Venice of the North," because of its 160 canals and more than 1,000 bridges.

As you glide along the canals, you'll see landmark buildings, such as the West Tower, and many of the city's 17th and 18th century

Ancient mystery, modern angst in De Staebler's works

"Where beams of warm imagination play, the memory's soft figures fade away..."

— Alexander Pope

"The Figure," an exhibit of 26 large-scale ceramic symbolic works by contemporary American sculptor Stephen De Staebler, is the most exciting show I've experienced in years.

The near life-size pieces are hauntingly alive. Paradoxically, they also look like shards of old, discarded bodies. The artist's message is more subconscious than the philosopher's, however, as he tells us that unlike the snake who molts his skin only, we shed outworn personae and psyches as well.

Even the title of the exhibit, "The Figure," conveys many layers of meaning. Usually a figure is simply a likeness or a representation. In geometry, though, it will always be a surface or a space bounded on all sides by lines or planes. But a figure might also be a being of the imagination, as the poet Pope implies. What distinguishes De Staebler's work is that his figures manage to be a masterful blend of all these elements.

Amazingly, after viewing them, you find that each figure has its own personality. As with real ghosts, encounters with these specters of the collective unconscious, if you will, might disturb the timid. Not all of them are friendly.

"Lavender Torso with Mask, 1976/1985," for instance, is a raging entity. Done with low-fire clays and bound with leather, suggesting the mummy wraps of antiquity, she is one of the most evocative creations on exhibit. Like a mute freak, she pulls forth a mix of fear and pity from the viewer. Her large painted lips and her mask speak of her need to separate herself from society, as if her own real face, her true identity, is so fragile that to expose it would be to destroy it. Yet the identity she chooses to project is a lie.

In this way, De Staebler renders her a contemporary of so many of the "masked" women we meet every day, woman apparently afraid to be seen without their "faces," yet women who perhaps secretly seethe at themselves, in the manner of Lavender Torso, because they are victims of their own facade.

All that exists beneath De Staebler's woman begs to be noticed, however, through cracks and holes in the body surface, we are able to see bits of her soul which shine forth in delicate pale yellow, a color symbolic of life, as opposed to the death-

associated lavender.

That most of De Staebler's figures represent the wounded, the mutilated even, is obvious. That they have survived, exuding dignity in spite of their flaws, reflects the artist's love of life. He renders these creations: male, female, angel, archangel, as holy. Even lone limbs become pieces of the hologram of creation set before us for contemplation, demanding introspection by a man who definitively liberated ceramic sculpting from its kitchen quaintness to the apogee of artistic expression.

In "Man with Tar Heart, 1981," the heart area is actually preserved in real tar; yet it is as if only something dark and secret, taken from the earth itself, could truly preserve this organ which traditionally represents the spiritual in man.

Opposing, the head is blood-red with a garish luminescence to the paint, distracting us from the heart which is nearly imperceptible in the black, clearly charred-looking torso.

It is this constant attempt to pin down the existential truth, along with a compulsion to couple the mundane with the infinite, the earthly with the divine, that preoccupies De Staebler, setting him apart from so many of his fame-and-fortune-seeking contemporaries, marking the work, I'm convinced, an expression of genius.

How lucky therefore, that the exhibit presented concurrently at Laguna Art Museum and Saddleback College Art Gallery will run through Sept. 10, giving us ample time to get acquainted with De Staebler's ghosts.

He looks ordinary. But he is quite extraordinary.

Sculptor Stephen De Staebler is a medium-sized, happy-faced 53-year-old who shakes hands with an honest-to-goodness sincerity that makes you feel glad you are meeting him.

He is married to Dona, who is not an artist but, according to De Staebler, "has the best eye of anyone I know, a real touch." And he is the father of two sons, Jordan 28, a painter and David 26, a photographer. He lives in Berkeley, California.

His thick gray hair is thinning at the crown; yet it bounces slightly with his animated movements, like the hair of a youngster. As a result, De Staebler looks mature, but innocent too. Most of all, though, he could pass for a farmer — a man who holds the earth sacred, becoming part of it with time. Clay is his favorite medium.

Beneath this exterior, there is another deeper individual, one who

regards each day as a quest.

"Life is still such a mystery," he stresses, smiling broadly, revealing his wonder. His voice is passionate and rich as he speaks. "We are tied to the Whole, yet there is this feeling that we are alienated from that Whole. But, of course, that's the whole basis of Existentialism, man's attempt at immersion in Reality, while tied to the sanctity of life. Art has expressed both options — of fusion and separateness."

He admits he loves his work: teaching at San Francisco State University and creating in his studio. On the other hand, he refuses to explain his sculpture.

"I've finally learned not to attempt to put into words what the meaning of the work is. I've spent my whole life trying to put forth that meaning non-verbally," he emphasizes. "The whole experience of viewing it is personal, the idea is for people to put themselves into it. It's really not my role to translate into words what that experience should be."



"A hundred years ago look at how tough it was for artists. Gauguin, Van Gogh, Cezanne ... they lived in a very indifferent world. The Academy was very threatened by what they were attempting to do. He pauses, reflecting on this fact. "The world takes a long time to catch up."

Interestingly, though, De Staebler expresses concern that too much support of artists might not be a good idea. "All the money thrown around now is making everything distorted," he emphasizes. "Art is being made too commercial. It's forcing work to be put in vaults to protect it."

All the people connected with this exhibit deserve high praise, I'm sure. Without their help, the show which has been touring the country since Feb. 25 of last year would not have been possible, considering the expense involved with packing, shipping, and setting up an exhibition of this caliber.

How, exactly, did it happen?

Gregory J. Bishop, Dean of Fine Arts at Saddleback, had long wanted a national show at the Mission Viejo Campus. His wish began to come true when a few years ago Lynn Gamwell, curator at Saddleback Gallery at the time, and a long-time fan of De Staebler's work, decided to meet the challenge. She went to see Wendy Wetzel, head of corporate giving at the Mission Viejo Company and Wetzel liked her proposal. Wetzel in turn went to her parent organization, the Philip Morris Companies Inc., which gave the go-ahead.

Additional funding came from the California Arts Council and the Laguna Art Museum presentation was made possible by a grant from Wittenberg/Livingston Inc. of Newport Beach.

Subsequently, Lynn Gamwell became the curator of the exhibit, which visited San Francisco, New York, Washington D.C. and the University of Illinois at Champaign.
