Actually, Malone, nicknamed "The Mailman" (because he delivers), has cut back on the number of reptiles he owns, but still possesses some oddball pets. The 6-foot-9 forward has two 500-gallon aquariums in his home. One contains piranhas, the other a variety of exotic fish. He's down to one snake; he also owns a dog, Malone, last year's NBA All-Star MVP, hires a pet-sitter while on the road.

**Q** On which holiday do we buy the most candy?

Surprise — it's not Valentine's Day. As Easter we spend \$815 million on sweets.

**Q** ABC newsmen Forrest Sawyer seems so down-to-earth and believable. He's got a certain charm; I think he's going to be the next Walter Cronkite.

You sound a lot more excited about Sawyer than Sawyer. "I am painfully boring," contends the ABC Sunday night anchor and reporter. Boring, maybe, but definitely busy. Sawyer, a bachelor, started out as an Atlanta co-anchor in 1980, moved to CBS in 1985 and to ABC in 1988. Along the way, he's covered national conventions, reported from London, interviewed Margaret Thatcher, Poland's President Wojciech Jaruzelski and Presidents Reagan and Carter, and won a news Emmy. As for the Cronkite comparison: "It must have been my mom's idea."

**Q** Who had the longest-running sitcom ever?

Kelly Seerin, Mantua, Ill.

Go ahead and laugh, you Mr. A's/H mavens, Lucy lovers and Archie Bunker aficionados. The holders of the record

for longest-running situation comedy of all time are... Ozzie and Harriet Nelson, whose *The Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet* ran for 14 seasons from 1952-66. For quibblers — other comedy programs, such as *The Red Skelton Show* (20 years) or *The Jack Benny Program* (15 years) had longer runs, but mixed variety and music segments into their formats and don't count as pure situation comedies.

**Q** I would like to know the former professions of those in Congress. This is an important issue, because there can't be fair representation of all people if 95 percent of legislators are attorneys.

It's not 95 percent, but law is by far the No. 1 profession for today's congressional members. Of 100 senators, 63 are attorneys; of 432 representatives (three seats are vacant at press time), 209 are attorneys. Journalism (Sen. Paul Simon, D-Ill.), business (Sen. Robert Kasten Jr., R-Wis.) and teaching (Rep. Lindsey Boggs, D-La.) come next. Less prevalent professions in the House: Thomas Biley Jr. (R-Va.), funeral home director; Fred Grandy (R-Iowa), actor (Gopher on *The Love Boat*); Jim Bunning (R-Ky.), pro baseball player; Jim Leach (R-Iowa), propane gas marketer; Robert F. Smith (R-Ore.), cattle rancher. Senate: John Glenn (D-Ohio), astronaut; Charles Grassley (R-Iowa), farmer; Steven Symms (R-Idaho), fruit grower; Bill Bradley (D-N.J.), pro basketball player; Nancy Kassebaum (R-Kan.), broadcasting exec.

Rice, whose books about sympathetic supernatural figures have a huge cult following, also wrote novels as Anne Rampling (*Belinda and Exit to Eden*) and A.N. Roquelaure (three books very loosely based on *Sleeping Beauty*). Rice's vampire chronicles can be steamy. Trust us; the Rampling books are torrid, and as Roquelaure, Rice moves past torrid, through dirty and all the way to prurient. But she's proud of all her work, whatever the pen name.

# FUR RIGHT

**Protesters splash red paint**

**on fur-clad women,**

**shoot out fur store windows,**

**and shout 'shame' on**

**street corners. Some targets**

**are furriers, others agorize**

**and even hand over their**

**furs. It comes to a**

**vote Tuesday in Aspen.**

Aspen Mayor Bill Stirling is getting a lot of grief about the fur ban he proposed. "It's a very contentious outspoken little village."

Aspen, Colo., is the place where tourists from the Sun Belt can strut in their sables and sip drinks under mounted stuffed moose heads. It's an endangered way of life.

The fur is flying in this tiny, trendy ski resort over an ordinance to ban the sale of fur, which goes before the town's 3,486 voters Tuesday. Aspen, a ban-happy place, already has outlawed smoking and neon.

**A**If this fur ban passes, it would mean a mini-revolution in this Rocky Mountain village where residents like to joke there are more furs per capita than any other place in the USA. And that's a lot: Overall, 50 percent of women in the USA own a fur or fur-trimmed garment.

An Aspen ban would be a national milestone, creating the USA's first furrier-free zone and giving activists a major victory in the escalating stink about mink.

Gone are the frivolous Reagan years when fur was *de rigueur*. In the socially conscious '90s it's not hip to cop a critter's coat. Put on a pelt and you might be splashed with red paint. Or assaulted with a chorus of "Shame, shame, shame!"

"By next winter," says activist Dan Mathew, "the only practical accessory for a fur coat will be carplugs."

## **The second and the furry**

It's a brisk Sunday afternoon in New York City and outside the chic Remi boutique on Fifth Avenue fur-clad pedestrians are being pelted with insults by a group of animal activists.

"Those dead skins must have been beautiful on the animal!... Ugly, lady that fur is UGLY!... It adds 100 pounds to your body, babe... Killing isn't glamorous. Dying isn't glamorous. Boooooo!"

Some fur wearers stop to make obscene gestures or

shake their fists. A woman shouts, "Stuff it!" A man shrieks, "You all wear leather shoes!"

Street corner confrontations and \$10,000 coats bloodied with paint. Fur burials and burn-ins. Parades and demonstration store blockades. It's no wonder fur wearers and sellers are nervous.

Celebrities from Kim Basinger to Princess Di are joining the ever-louder chorus of "take back your mink." Singer Belinda Carlisle is headlining Rock Against Fur concerts. Actress Rue McClanahan is modeling for a catalog of products with appeal to animal activists. Giorgio Armani and other anti-fur designers are enjoying a run on their fake-fur garments.

And then there's the violent fringe. "We've had 11 fur stores with windows shot out in Washington, D.C., twice with customers in the store. One fur store burned to the ground," says Tom Riley, spokesman for the Fur Information Council of America. "I've had death threats. I've had them face to face and I've had them in the mail."

Furriers are biting back with a media blitz of their own. They've launched an ad campaign: "Today fur. Tomorrow leather. Then wool. Then meat..." They denounce the hypocrisy of some anti-fur protesters who still wear leather, which, in the words of skier-turned-furrier Sany Chaffee, is simply "shaved fur." Industry insiders predict that, despite a recent stagnation in the market and a drop in fur prices, the past year will prove to be fur's biggest ever, with \$2 billion in sales.

## **Aspen's trendy revolution**

The anti-fur pose in Aspen, supported by local luminaries such as cartoonist Berke Breathed, actress Kate Jackson and the Nixy Gentry Dirt Beard's Jimmy Abbottson, has placed newspaper ads, written letters to editors

and sponsored a float in the Fourth of July parade.

It was a cage full of humans wearing wigs, says Katharine Thalbreg, of the Aspen Society for Animal Rights and wife of Mayor Bill Stirling. "Someone in an animal suit would pull a human out of the cage, bash him over the head, rip off his wig and wear it."

At social gatherings, Thalbreg shows a video of minks scrambling madly in their cages. On Halloween she and friends promenaded in fur coats and death masks, carrying shopping bags with the logos Saks Fifth Avenue and Scream! Marcus. "Animals are at the bottom of the heap in this world and have no way to speak for themselves, so it's a very compelling issue."

Not to everybody. Last summer, a local leather trader put on wolf pelts, picketed Thalbreg's bookstore and cooked hamburgers on the sidewalk. A few residents are so enraged by the ordinance that they're mounting an effort to oust the mayor with a recall vote. And many wonder whether leather will be on the ballot next. Then meat. And then, God knows, Silksworm rights? Mandatory vegetarian diets for pets? Where will it end? And how will it affect the economy?

"It's a very anti-visitor issue," says Mark Kirkland, manager of the local Revillon fur salon, who fears not only for his livelihood but also for Aspen's future. Although the ordinance would not forbid the wearing of fur, Kirkland thinks it will turn off tourists. "The message the mayor is sending out is we only want you in Aspen if you don't have a fur."

For the moment, sales at Revillon are healthy. In November they were up 270 percent, as anxious customers seized the moment.

Sell, those who love their lynx are feeling nervous wingers. Sascha Kaelin, who owns a ski boutique, says out-of-town customers are calling, wondering if they should bring their furs. One woman told her she'll be going to Vail instead of Aspen because she doesn't want to be a pariah in her pelt.

"I think it will hurt our town because of the bad publicity we are getting," says Kaelin, who is wearing her coyote coat and fox jacket this winter despite all the fuss. "Both of my pet cats got killed by a coyote or fox last summer so I'm not too friendly with the coyotes."

And she'll be safe in her animal skins, because the fur fight has been civil in Aspen. As Mayor Stirling puts it, "People aren't rushing out to verbally confront others or spray-paint them."

### Anti-fur: A nationwide net

Elsewhere, the fighting is furious.

"It's time for an acceleration in tactics," says activist Dan Mathews, who campaigns against fur as a leader of People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) in Rockville, Md.

Mathews has been a vegetarian and leather-free since his teens. Now he's organizing speak-outs, where protesters stand in groups of three "and verbally harass anyone wearing a fur coat." This winter, PETA activists sneaked into a Washington, D.C., luncheon and handed a paint-splattered rabbit pelt to a fur industry spokesman.

"It's sort of an obnoxious thing to do, I admit that," says Mathews of the pranks and verbal abuse. "I know it's not attractive, but unless there is aggressive social behavior things stay as they are. We want to put the fur industry out of business."

Seated in a corner of his office are boxes of furs sent in by PETA members, whose ranks have grown from 60,000 to 300,000 in the past five years. PETA gets one to four furs a day from conscience-stricken turncoats. The furs are used in demonstrations.

When Mathews organizes a protest he tells his troops

to avoid physical contact, obscene language and "but jokes" about pelts that enlarge the wearer's posterior. He says PETA does not endorse extremism. "But we don't condemn it, either."

Mathews' personal tactics involve growling and snarling at people in fur. His snappy repartee includes remarks like, "Do you know how the animals were killed for that coat?" Or, "Do you know that 50 minks died for that?" And if an irate fur wearer threatens him with violence, "The line I use is, 'Go ahead. We know our rights and we bruise and sue easily.'"

Even the milder confrontations get ugly. Mathews' pet anecdote concerns a colleague who shouted, "How did you get the blood out?" to a fur-wearing fellow. The man retorted, "I sucked it out with a straw."

Mathews chides fur wearers wherever he sees them. Imagine the distress of a target who rode a plane with him from Seattle to Washington, D.C. "The woman across the aisle from me had on a coyote coat. I said, 'Excuse me, ma'am, is that coyote?' She said, 'Yes, isn't it lovely.' I said, 'Do you know they bite off their legs to get out of the traps?'"

Once at a cafe, he walked up to a woman in a fox fur and said, "Thank God I'm finished — I would get nauseous if I had to sit next to this. Madam, do you realize those foxes were anally electrocuted for that coat?"

### Pre-fur: Forget cruelty, it's bad business

Fur industry spokesman Riley allows that abuses can creep in. The electrocution of foxes, which is discouraged by the Fur Farm Animal Welfare Coalition, still is practiced. And questions of cruelty are troubling the fur-buying public.

But he disputes most activist claims of cruelty on fur farms and trapping torture: "Bad fur farms don't stay in business very long. An unhealthy animal is not going to have a pelt worth selling." He says that trapping animals is essential for wildlife management. Without trapping, there would be overpopulation and starvation.

Riley says furriers are researching more humane trapping methods, setting up a watchdog organization and hope to introduce labeling that will reassure customers that furs come from reputable farms.

### Guilt and confession: Are we animals?

But the pecky question, the one gnawing at the public conscience, is whether it's cruel to kill animals, period. Riley believes it's a matter of where your threshold is. "Animal rights people believe that most animals from shrimps on up have a nervous system that suggests a sense of destiny."

But is that realistic? What about those predatory instincts we inherited from our feral forebears? Isn't it human to kill animals for their meat and fur?

Mathews is incensed at the idea. "It was an ancient impulse to beat women," he snaps. "Slavery was a custom, but did that make it right? It's not healthy to pick and choose whom and what we should be kind to."

Riley understands, to a point: He loves his dog. But he, like most people, does pick and choose. If a raccoon strayed into his yard, "I'd want it taken away. In all probability it would be rabid and it wouldn't bother me that it was dispatched."

But others who have heard the cries of the animal activists are experiencing pangs of remorse.

Zsa Zsa Gabor has trimmed the fur off her suits and plans to give away all 28 of her pelts — except for a \$100,000 sable coat she got from her husband for Christmas 1988. "Honey, I gave my leopard and chinchilla away 10 years ago. They can say I slapped a policeman — although it's a lie — but they can never say I don't love animals."

Barbi Benton, a sometime Aspen resident who owns several furs, feels the conflict. She's against the ban because she's for freedom of choice. But she ruminates: "I have a coat that was trapped and it is painful just thinking about it. . . . I have somewhat of a guilt complex but they haven't gotten to me enough so that I won't wear what's already dead."

"I believe that mink are raised for being turned into fur coats and if we didn't wear fur coats those little animals would never have been born. So is it better not to have been born or to have lived for a year or two to have been turned into a fur coat? I don't know."

The Dirt Band's Ibbotson is voting for the ban because he doesn't approve of killing animals for fur. But he, too, feels torn. A friend gave him a muskrat hat and he doesn't know what to do with it.

"If I put that muskrat hat in the closet that muskrat died in vain. If I wear it and some kid says, 'Isn't that a cool hat, I think I'll wear one, too,' another muskrat dies." Still, some kids snubbed him on the ski lift: "They said, 'Hey mister, what do you feed your hat?'"

Another difficult issue, Ibbotson says, is that fur is biodegradable, whereas synthetic jackets fill up landfills.

Some choice. Destroying the planet or its creatures. Overpopulation or trapping. Is there no perfect solution?

Ibbotson doesn't have it, but he offers a guiding philosophy: moderation. "We all leave footprints on the planet as we go through life. You just try to keep them from being scars."

# Lean machines

Indoor rowers compete next weekend in national championships

**E**xercising on an indoor rowing machine is like *Proud Mary* sung by Ike and Tina Turner: You can do it nice and easy, or you can do it rough.

"It's a good way to compress a lot of work into a short period of time," says New York investment banker Dick Cashin, 36, who'll participate in next weekend's indoor rowing national championships. "It allows me to get my workout in and still spend time with my family."

Cashin is one of the rough ones, with a regimen that makes him athletically lean and one of the toughest rowers in the country — all for about two hours of indoor rowing a week.

"Four times a week I go as hard as I can for 24 to 28 minutes. Nothing at moderate power. You just keep thinking to yourself: This too shall end."

The workouts pay off. For the past six years, Cashin has placed either first or second in his class in the national championships of indoor rowing, the C.R.A.S.H.-B sprints (initials mean "Charles River All-Star Has-Beens").

This year's sprints will be held next weekend at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Cambridge, Mass., which flanks the Charles River, a popular place for outdoor collegiate rowing. More than 1,000 rowers will jump on Concept II ergometers, the machines that indoor rowers say best mimic rowing on water. They'll play beat-the-clock in electronically measured, all-out sprints to a lung-busting 2,500-meter finish.

Rowing machines (generally \$125 to

\$650 in price) are among the most popular pieces of indoor exercise equipment, says the National Sporting Goods Manufacturers Association.

The payoff? "The comment I get most from my women friends is it's obscene I can eat as much as I do and still stay slim," says Frede Ottinger, 46, an Alexandria, Va., interior decorator, who works out three or four mornings a week. "And I'm someone who has to run out in the afternoon for a Snickers."

But it's a svelte body that comes only with work. "It's not like running where you can see the sky and nature," she says. "You're captive on that piece of machinery." Her secret for sticking with it: "I do it first thing in the morning."

For those who would opt for a workout on the easy side, the benefits still are substantial. A good 20 to 30 minutes at a moderate pace offers more aerobic and strength-building benefits than using an exercise bike, according to a study by

Fritz Hagerman, head of Ohio University's exercise physiology program.

Another chief benefit is that rowing is easy on the joints. And it isn't bad for your back, as has been reported, says Hagerman. "At very high-intensity levels, there's some risk; but if you're just doing 'conversational' work, it's no problem." That means you should be able to carry on a conversation *while* you are rowing.

Depending on your intensity, you can burn up to 25 calories per minute — akin to cross-country skiing.

But to avoid injury and maximize the benefit of your workout, it's important to master technique. "The problem is, most people have no idea how to row," says rower Charles Thronson, a 39-year-old attorney in Salt Lake City.

Smooth rowing involves a straight back, leaning slightly backward from the hips and then a four-point motion: Begin the stroke by pushing out smoothly to straighten the legs; pull your hands holding the simulated oar handle to your chest; straighten the arms and slide your movable seat back toward your heels just as your hands clear your knees.

Beyond that, it's a matter of getting on the machine and cranking away. "I either wear a Walkman or watch MTV," says Thronson, who does 35-minute sets every other day.

Despite needing the incentive of hard rock to keep him inspired, Thronson says rowing is the best exercise he's hit on so far. "You name it, I've done it: jogging, racquetball, biking. Rowing has been the best all-around workout I've found."

How fast can you row 2,500 meters (about 1.5 miles)? If you do it within 10 or 11 minutes, you're doing great.

That's admittedly a little off the world record of 7:15.5 set in 1988. But that record was set by a 6-foot-10, 250-pound man training for the '92 Olympics.

You, too, can try to row your way into the 1990 world rankings. Most of the entries are in the 8- to 12-minute range. Here's how you do it:

■ Row 2,500 meters on a Concept II Rowing Ergometer — the official machine of competitions.

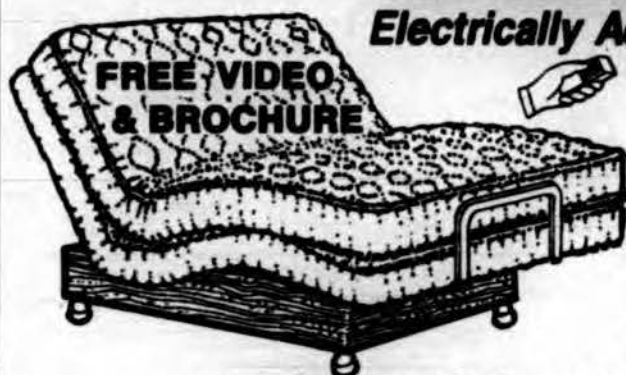

## Hear ye!

Here's the smart way  
to listen to a speech

**P**eggy Noonan is not exactly a household name. But her way with words — “a thousand points of light, kinder, gentler nation” — helped one of our bosses make a name for himself.

Now Noonan, who was a speech writer for George Bush and Ronald Reagan, is in the limelight with her Reagan-era memoirs, *What I Saw At the Revolution* (\$19.95, Random House), which hits bookstores this week.

Noonan, who wrote commentaries for Dan Rather before moving to the White House in 1984, offers these tips for unraveling presidential rhetoric:

**Be on the lookout for “daydream time.”** Noonan admits “it is hard to follow a political argument for six, seven or eight minutes straight.” Most speeches last roughly 20 minutes. So good speeches include timeouts for the listener to relax and gather energy.

**Understand that nothing is accidental.** Every word was chosen for a reason. A presidential speech is checked and triple-checked for every possible misinterpretation. As soon as top aides read and edit, the president adds his thoughts — and the entire process begins again. Up to 50 people have input.

An example: In a speech for Reagan's election, a still-green Noonan used the phrase “I will be frank.” It quickly was deleted because it suggested Reagan wasn't always frank.

**Don't be swayed by body movements.** They can be deceptive; everyone these days is coached on how to perform before the unflinching eye of a TV camera.

“At the end of the Reagan era all the presidential candidates looked like local TV news anchors,” writes Noonan. “They talked with their voices low and cool, not going to the microphone but letting the mike go to them.”

**Don't always blame the president — or the speech writer — for lack of eloquence.** Blame the process, says Noonan. The speech editing that is meant to wipe out mistakes can delete the flavor.

“Think of a bunch of wonderful, colorful, shining, perfectly shaped and delicious vegetables,” she says. “Then think of one of those old-fashioned metal meat grinders. Imagine the vegetables being forced through and reduced into a smooth, dull, textureless puree.”

# ON THE COVER

This murder story depicts the violence beneath the surface.

**B**lind Faith" (airing Sunday and Tuesday, Feb. 11 and 13, on NBC) is the kind of story that almost invariably does well on TV: a real-life crime story with a bizarre twist.

Robert Urich stars as Robert Marshall, a successful insurance agent, model husband and loving father whose wife, Maria (Joanna Kerns), was shot to death on Sept. 7, 1984, when they pulled into a secluded rest stop on their way home to Toms River, N.J., after an evening in Atlantic City. In the weeks that followed, authorities began to suspect that Marshall, who had acquired some crippling gambling debts, was having an intense extramarital affair, and had taken out well over \$1 million in insurance on his wife, might have arranged her murder.

"What fascinates us and frightens us at the same time is how thin the veneer is between normalcy on the surface and this extraordinary capacity for violence and destructiveness underneath," says Joe McGinniss, who wrote the book on which the miniseries is based. He also wrote "Fatal Vision," the story of Jeffrey MacDonald, the Green Beret doctor who was convicted of murdering his wife and two young daughters, which was made into a highly praised 1984 miniseries starring Karl Malden and Gary Cole.

"I think every time something like this crops up, it shocks us again into an awareness that we know much less about everyone, including ourselves, than we might be comfortable thinking we do."

What attracted McGinniss to "Blind Faith" was the Marshalls' three teen-age sons: Roby (David Barry Gray), then 19; Chris (Jay Underwood), then 18; and John (Johnny Galecki), then 13.

"They had grown up all believing that their parents had a happy marriage," says McGinniss. "Both parents were very involved in all their activities. To the degree that the book has any power, it's the story of the three boys trying to keep loving each other despite their different attitudes toward their father's guilt."

But the story of the three boys is

only half the story of "Blind Faith." The other half deals with what their father did and his trial. And it is here that it becomes apparent that "Blind Faith" is no "Fatal Vision." The victims in "Fatal Vision" had as their advocate Jeffrey MacDonald's father-in-law, Freddy Kassab (played by Karl Malden in the miniseries). Maria Marshall had no such advocate. The accused hitman was judged "not guilty" because there was no physical evidence to tie him to the scene, and the police never did follow up on many of the people that Marshall apparently talked to when he was looking for someone to kill his wife. And the efforts of the prosecutor, Kevin Kelly (Dennis Farina), seemed to be centered less on proving that Marshall instigated the murder than demonstrating that he was a despicable hypocrite.

With "Blind Faith," one also gets the frustrating feeling that McGinniss is pulling his punches. Could the flack McGinniss has gotten over "Fatal Vision" (he has faced years of litigation and been accused of being less than straightforward with MacDonald when he began to suspect that MacDonald was guilty) made him a bit gun-shy?

"No," he says emphatically. "You can't go beyond what's there. If it didn't go as far as you might wish it had or I might wish it had, it was because I wasn't able to learn any more about what really happened. Everything I know is in the book."

Even though some car batteries describe themselves as being "maintenance-free," only those with the accompanying phrase "lead-calcium with zero antimony" truly are. Such batteries are sealed at the factory and are really maintenance-free. Most have an indicator, or "eye," which shows the electrolyte level in each of its six cells. A green eye color indicates a healthy battery. A dark indicator means a change is necessary. A yellow or clear indicator means that the battery needs to be replaced. Those "maintenance-free" batteries that do not have indicator eyes should be checked every three months for proper electrolyte levels.

In cold weather, a battery is less efficient, so your car is harder to start. That's why you need to check it more often. Otherwise, a weak battery could leave you stranded. 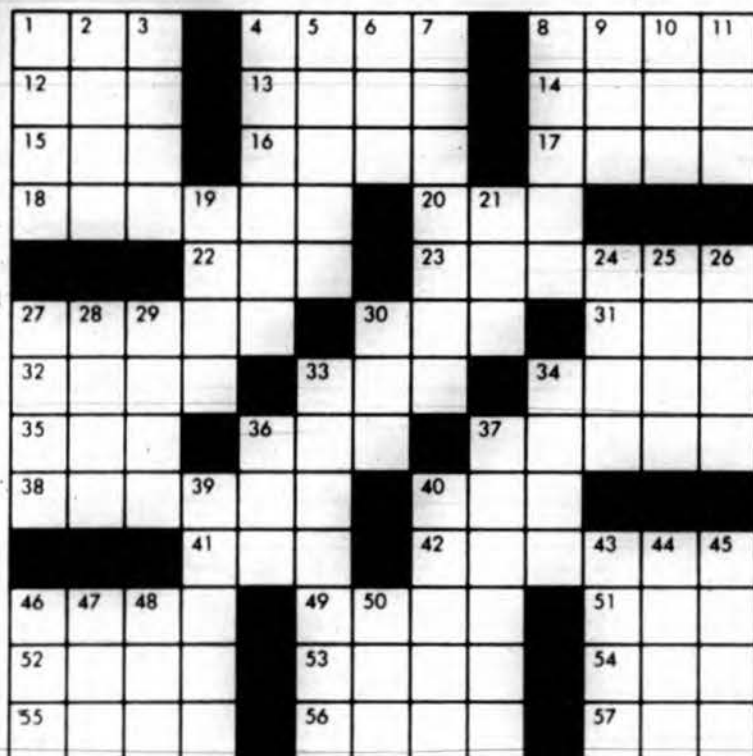

## Spill much larger than first feared

Officials estimate 394,000-gallon leak

The size of the worst oil spill off California's coast in 21 years was revised sharply upward Saturday as crews continued their cleanup efforts along the Orange Coast.

U.S. Coast Guard officials said the size of the spill has been estimated at 394,000 gallons, about a third larger than initially reported.

Late Saturday night, Sgt. Andy Gonis of the Newport Beach Police Department reported visible oil deposits washing up on the beach from 52nd Street to the Santa Ana River, although none had been found south of 52nd Street.

An aerial photo supplied by the U.S. Coast Guard showed four small oil slicks off of Newport Beach, Gonis said. On-shore patrols were scheduled to continue throughout the night and city officials were scheduled to meet daily to coordinate containment and cleanup efforts with officials from other agencies, Gonis added.

Fingers of the black slick continued to gain beachheads along an 18-mile strand of the Orange Coast during the day Saturday as workers on land and sea raced to minimize the damage.

Oil breached a boom across the Santa Ana River, causing some damage there, the Coast Guard reported.

But other booms across entrances to harbors and ecological preserves were blocking the oil.

By late Saturday, the main slick had grown to about 14 miles long by 7 miles wide and was stretching toward the Long Beach Harbor entrance. It remained centered 2 1/2 miles off the coast between Huntington Beach and Newport Beach.

Some 400 workers were on the sand, soaking up the North Slope crude with absorbent pads.

Skimming operations continued offshore, with more ships en route. USCG Capt. Jim Card said

## Freedom at last

Mandela to be set free today

CAPE TOWN, South Africa (AP) — Nelson Mandela, the symbol of South African blacks' struggle for equality, will become a free man today after 27 years in prison for fighting white-minority rule. President F.W. de Klerk announced.

De Klerk said Saturday he hoped the long-awaited release would halt decades of racial conflict and clear the way for negotiations that would extend political rights to the black majority.

The release "will bring us to the end of a long chapter," de Klerk told a news conference. "There can no longer be any doubt about the government's sincerity in seeking to create a just dispensation based on negotiations."

Six anti-apartheid activists conferred with Mandela about logistics of the release and told reporters the 71-year-old black leader, along with his family, would ride to freedom in a bulletproof Mercedes-Benz through the gates of Victor Verster prison farm outside Cape Town.

De Klerk said he met with Mandela on Friday night and was convinced the prisoner, jailed for helping launch the African National Congress' guerrilla campaign, was "committed to a peaceful solution."

The government released a photograph of the two leaders at their meeting — the first picture of Mandela made available to the public since the 1960s. He is shown next to de Klerk, hands folded in front, a big smile on his wrinkled face. Mandela's freedom has been a longstanding demand of black leaders in South Africa, as well as governments and human rights groups abroad, and the decision drew immediate international praise.

In Johannesburg and its main black township, Soweto, blacks thronged the streets in celebration.

"Our leader is coming!" shouted an excited black youth in Johannesburg amidst a din of freedom songs and car horns. Other blacks jogged through major thoroughfares holding aloft newspapers with the huge headline: "He's Free!"

But in Katlehong, another township near Johannesburg, police said five blacks were killed and 45 injured after officers used tear gas and birdshot to disperse a crowd of anti-apartheid protesters. The rally began

## Tug of war between cleanup officials, volunteers intensifies

Amid a gooey slick of black crude, a thousand points of light shined through. Thousands, actually. Trouble is, officials want to put the lights out.

Following the 394,000-gallon oil spill Wednesday off the Orange Coast, thousands of citizens called officials or showed up on the sand seeking to help save birds and clean the shoreline.

More than 2,000 volunteered in Huntington Beach alone to clean off oil-soaked birds.

Since the spill has killed about 36 and injured another 71 birds, that comes to about 28 volunteers per live bird.

Overwhelmed local and state officials decided Saturday to put the brakes on all the goodwill.

They announced the implementation of a comprehensive bird protection plan aimed at ensuring the safety of birds and people alike.

Huntington Beach Mayor Tom Mays said the city would provide up to 500 sets of protective clothing for volunteers trained to capture oiled birds.

Already, beaches in Newport Beach and Huntington had been closed to the public because of worries about liability.

Residents hoping to lend a hand were frustrated and angered when officials turned them away.

But British Petroleum, the firm that chartered the tanker American Trader to carry its oil from Alaska, also asked that citizens leave the clean up to hired contractors.

The company said it had nearly 500 workers on the beaches Saturday afternoon, in addition to a dozen oil-skimming boats offshore.

Frank Strasheim, regional administrator for the Occupational Safety & Health Administration (Cal-OSHA), said they were working with cleanup contractors to minimize the hazards faced by workers, too.

Studies also were under way to

determine if there were any health hazards from airborne pollutants generated by the spill, although they believed there were none, Strasheim said.

But untrained volunteers wearing non-protective clothing were exposing themselves to deadly chemicals.

"I would caution interested volunteers that this is a hazardous area," Strasheim said. "The same chemicals that kill the birds are dangerous to humans."

The benzene in the oil, for in-

stance, is a carcinogen known to cause leukemia and other cancers that could manifest themselves a year or more after exposure, he said.

"We're very concerned about the health hazard," he said.

They also were aware many of the hired workers were barely trained. Strasheim said they were permitting contractors to use workers with proper equipment and basic training until 4 p.m. Saturday. After that, employees had to complete more extensive training before they could work on the beaches, he said.

Likewise, officials wanted to prevent well-intentioned but untrained volunteers from helping with the cleanup of injured birds.

So many people were wandering the shoreline looking for birds that the creatures were fleeing back out to the ocean and drowning, officials said.

People also frightened a sea lion that came ashore Thursday night, officials said. Fish & Game workers had to remove it from the beach and release it back into the water.

Under the volunteer training program initiated by Huntington Beach and state Fish & Game officials, limited numbers of volunteers will be required to complete a basic course.

They will learn how to approach injured birds, wrap the birds in towels to warm them and protect themselves from the birds' natural self-protection responses.

Volunteers will stand away from the shoreline so that injured birds will come in. Then, at specific intervals workers will walk down and pick up the injured creatures.

"We need to help the animals and not stress them anymore," said Bruce Kinney of the state Fish & Game Department.

The volunteers won't do any cleaning of birds. All oiled birds will be taken to a Fish & Game center for washing and treatment, officials said.

skimmers had recovered about 900 barrels by Saturday.  
Skimming, however, is limited to the thickest patches of the spill. The thin sheen fanning out around the center can't be skimmed, officials said.  
They're hoping nature will aid the process.  
Coast Guard Lt. Gary Petrae said modeling studies showed that by Saturday night, 57 percent of the original spill would be left, with 14 percent evaporated and 29 percent naturally dispersed.  
Data obtained after the Exxon Valdez spill confirmed those numbers, he said.  
Lt. Reed Smith of the state Department of Fish & Game said they were studying the natural resource damages of the spill.  
"We'll be looking at not only the damages to the biological resources but to the losses to the people of California for not being able to use the beaches," he said.

Biologists are looking at sensitive habitats and watching that the cleanup effort doesn't further damage the environment, Smith said.  
Long-term damages to the ocean environment were difficult to assess, he said.  
"No question there's going to be damage to eggs, larvae and plankton," he said.  
Card said the revised estimate on the size of the spill was made after crews on the tanker American Trader pumped the remaining 90,000 barrels of oil from the ruptured tank and measured it.  
However, Mike Murphy, vice president of operations for American Trading and Transportation Co. of New York — which owns the tanker — admitted some oil from other tanks on the ship spilled into the damaged tank before valves could be shut off.  
Murphy said they have yet to determine exactly how the hull was punctured, but evidence pointed toward the anchor.  
The 811-foot tanker was maneuvering into an offshore mooring

before pumping the oil to onshore facilities when the accident occurred at about 4 p.m. Wednesday. About 24 hours later, the first globs of black crude splashed ashore.  
Videos taken Friday showed two gaping holes 6 feet apart on the bottom of the ship, one 5 feet in diameter, the other 4 feet.  
"We're not exactly sure it was the anchor, but I have a port anchor damaged to the point we have to take it off for repair," Murphy said. "There's no doubt the ship landed on something."  
The accident remained under investigation. The Coast Guard said drug and alcohol tests on the ship's officers were negative.  
Murphy said they will patch the holes with a sandwich of plywood, foam and steel plates, clean the hull and move the ship under its own power to Long Beach. Another 460,000 barrels of oil are still in the ship's tanks.  
Other than the holes, the ship was undamaged.  
"I realize this is a terrible incident, but there's nothing wrong with the

ship," Murphy said.  
Sanford Schmidt, president of American Trading and Transportation, said costs of the spill were unknown. The company is insured for \$400 million.  
Schmidt said they were prepared to deal with cleanup costs and other liabilities resulting from the spill.  
He knew about the \$1 billion lawsuit filed by the Sport Fishing Association of California and United Anglers of California.  
"I'm sure it's just the first of many," Schmidt said.  
British Petroleum America, Inc., the company that leased the tanker, on Saturday announced that cleanup of the spill continued to be the firm's "most urgent priority."  
Also on Saturday, Assembly Speaker Willie Brown said in Sacramento that legislators were attempting to address numerous concerns about the oil industry, such as the need for a traffic control system for tankers, training of tanker pilots, the availability of cleanup equipment and civil and criminal penalties in case of a negligent spill.

# Oil slick sidelines boaters, fishermen on Orange Coast

The big oil slick can't be seen from the bluffs of Corona Del Mar above the entrance to Newport Harbor, but its consequences are obvious: It could play havoc with the regatta season.  
From the terraces of the nation's most expensive residential real estate, high above the public beach, two containment booms can be seen strung across the harbor entry.  
Arcing with the tides, these floating barriers are intended to keep the oil from entering the big, beautiful harbor and fouling one of the world's great yacht fleets.  
"If you get that kind of oil on your vessel, you can't get it off," said Larry Lewis, chairman of the 61st Annual Midwinter Regatta. "It's terrible."  
Hundreds of millions of dollars worth of sailing and motor yachts is at stake, to say nothing of the world-class property values of the harbor-side homes around Lido Isle and the Balboa Peninsula.

and wondering how long it is going to last."  
The vantage-point down along the public beach offers a different view of the drifting slick and its impact on life in Orange County.  
At the foot of Newport Pier, 33-year-old Rich Breneman is one of 18 independent dory fishermen who make their living fishing. They clean their catch of cod and sea trout in a little outdoor market on the beach that advertises "the world's freshest fish."  
"We fish far outside the oil spill area and it hasn't bothered us nearly as much as it has bothered our customers," said Breneman, pointing to the few visitors to the market. "The traffic is down sharply."  
The clean-up seemed to be settling into a daily — and deadly — routine, and officials began predicting what people like Watts and Breneman fear most — that the process could last several weeks.

Newport Beach is what Southern California's freeway-driven rat-race is all about. Its rich marina area houses some of the state's deepest pockets, and the dreams of the upwardly-mobile.  
Here are the beautiful homes with the big yachts moored at the doorstep. The water is blue, the air clean, the climate balmy, the living easy.  
But life is not without sacrifice. The booms that are intended to keep the oil out also trap the pleasure boats inside the harbor.  
Balboa Yacht Club and Bahia Corinthian Yacht Club were forced Friday to announce postponements of weekend regatta races under their sponsorship. Down in the harbor, others have more plebeian concerns about the blockade.  
The skies were clear Saturday, the winds were calm and temperatures were in the mid-70s along Orange County's famous beach-lined shore.  
This mid-winter climate helps make tourism a \$5.5 billion industry in the county and attracted 35 million visitors last year.  
But the beaches are closed to swimming and surfing this weekend — and the boats are stuck in port.  
Owners of excursion vessels transport passengers to Catalina Island and take tourists on fishing, whale-watching and sight-seeing trips are counting their losses in thousands of dollars a day.  
Jim Watts, owner of Newport Landing Sportfishing, said boat owners were "holding our breath

In the calm seas and mild off-shore breezes early each day, the oil mass lays just beyond the breakers. With the wind shifts of the afternoons and the high evening tides, some small part of it gets caught in the surf and comes lathering onto the beach in tiny globules and a foamy brown sludge.  
Dozens of yellow-suited clean-up workers are dispatched to sop up the residue with their white absorbent pads — and then to wait for another tide-cycle to begin.  
Just to the north, along big Huntington Beach, there seems to be some logical connection between the community and the spill.  
A few off-shore drilling platforms are visible, and the rocking arms of working wells come right down to the beach. A big sign advertises the entrance to Huntington Beach High School — "Home of the Oilers."  
But Newport Beach is most definitely not the home of the oilers, and this charmed community makes no concessions to unsightly industry.  
Along Newport Beach, where even modest houses on Oceanfront Avenue sell for \$700,000 and up, the oil is a special affront.  
Don't be fooled by the surfboard shops and the beach-bum motif of beer bars like "Blackie's" along Oceanfront. This is a strictly-enforced "No Litter Zone."  
On Newport Beach there is no alcohol, no glass, no littering, no fires, no fireworks, no driving or parking of motorized vehicles. On Newport Beach, there are no dogs all day from June 15 to Sept. 15, and no dogs from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. from Sept. 16 to June 14.  
Aside from that, enjoy.

## Beachgoers still pound sand despite spill

Had it not been for the cleanup crews — prominent in their bright yellow suits — Saturday might have been just another day on Huntington Beach's glistening white stretch of sand.  
Although the huge spill of oil from the tanker American Trader last week kept the city's beach officially closed Saturday, its popular bicycle path was still crowded with tanned, long-haired, blond skateboarders and cyclists.  
Under bright blue skies a concessionaire sold "Pier Group" T-shirts near the city's storm-damaged pier. Profits were earmarked for a fund to rebuild the popular structure.  
An independent merchant sold "I Survived the Huntington Beach Oil Spill, 1990" shirts out of a car parked nearby. Few were buying, however.  
"The money should go to rebuilding the pier or cleaning the beach, not for profit," said Jeffrey

Weinberg, 41. "Between the closing of the pier and this, it's been a pretty trying time for Huntington Beach."  
"I don't think there should be oil. I hate oil. I even got it on my feet," said Weinberg's 11-year-old daughter, Alexis.  
Overall, little oil was visible on the beach near the pier Saturday, and the damaged tanker that had spilled it was barely visible, partly obscured by a heavy fog as it lay a little more than a mile offshore.  
As a gentle surf lapped at the beach, dozens of the curious arrived as they have each day since the Wednesday night spill. Many stopped to gaze out toward the tanker.  
Twenty-year-old Mary Ashcroft spun around on her skateboard on a concrete embankment near the pier.  
"I skateboard here every day," she said. "I'm not surprised that it happened and I don't think the protests are going to stop it."  
"There's been a lot of sewage spilled here before that has closed the beach."

## Governor: Spill does not mean offshore drilling ban

SACRAMENTO (AP) — Gov. George Deukmejian said Saturday that the Southern California oil spill doesn't mean that future offshore oil development should be banned.  
"This accident had nothing to do with oil development taking place off California," the Republican governor said in his weekly radio speech. "It involved a tanker bringing needed Alaskan oil into our state."  
"If we want to reduce oil tanker traffic into our state, we must increase — not decrease or ban — our efforts to produce more domestic energy, both on land and off our coast."  
Deukmejian said he would support "any reasonable steps to improve the safety of these shipments," but did not elaborate.  
He also said he will make sure "those who were responsible for this

serious spill pay every dollar of the cost of cleaning up the oil and dealing with any environmental damage that results from it."  
Deukmejian said critics of oil shipments can't ignore the fact that Californians use 2 million barrels of crude oil a day, twice as much as the state produces.  
"This oil tanker accident illustrates the hazards both to our economy and our environment when we are so dependent on imported oil from far away places," he said.  
"It is important that we continue with a prudent policy of conservation, development of alternative energy resources and environmentally safe development of our petroleum reserves in order to reduce the need for transporting oil by tanker into California."

## Beach businesses get crude awakening

The key word for beach businesses this weekend is food. If you sell it, you're in business. If not, you may be in trouble.  
Hotels, souvenir and surf shops and tourist attractions such as ferries, sports-fishing and whale-watching boats all reported at least minor suffering in the wake of Wednesday's oil spill.  
"We've been booked up, but I did have a couple of people leave because of it," said Irene Garfinkel, manager of the Huntington Surf Motel in Huntington Beach. "They left to try to find bluer waters. They were here for a week and were going to extend for another week."  
Garfinkel said three groups of surfers from Japan had decided to stick it out, going up and down the

coast in search of the waves.  
"Business is lousy. I think it's because of the oil spill," said Huntington Harbour Motor Inn manager George Lee. He estimated the hotel's occupancy at 30 percent.  
But down the coast in Newport Beach, hotel business was booming despite the booms across the channel mouths.  
"It's pretty much what we expected," said Lucius McKelzy, desk manager at the Little Inn on the Bay in Newport Beach. "Most of our reservations were made about two weeks ago but we haven't had any cancellations. We're about 93 percent full for Friday and Saturday, and it looks like about 50 percent for Sunday."  
McKelzy said tourists seem unfazed by the spill.  
"People are riding their bikes down to look at the beach. I've

heard a couple of complaints because the whale watching and fishing is cancelled, but most of the people weren't really going to use the beach anyway at this time of year."  
With the harbor closed off, fishing and whale watching excursions were cancelled until at least Monday.  
The one thing that seemed to fare well in the wake of the harbor closures was food.  
"We're extremely swamped, in fact I was sort of hoping it would slow down," said Crista Haley, a hostess at Maxwell's restaurant by the Huntington Beach Pier. "A lot of people are asking for the terrace (overlooking the beach)."  
At The Cannery in Newport Beach, manager Terry Hatleberg said business was about what is expected on a holiday weekend. "We have a lot of people talking about it, a lot of people upset over it but we

haven't really seen a decline in business. We've had a lot of people here who said they came down to help the birds."  
City officials closed the beach for the weekend because of the contamination from the oil spill and to allow commercial crews to clean up the mess without hindrance.  
But the closure on a three-day holiday weekend spells doom for the bikini, souvenir, pizza and donut shops that line West Ocean Front near the pier, employees said.  
Garfinkel of the Huntington Surf Motel said she was concerned about the longer-range effects of the spill on tourism.  
"The oil company is going to pick up the bill for the cleanup, but who's going to pay for all the business we lose in the tourism trade?"

Mayor Mays said the city would provide gloves, boots, jackets, hats and name tags for volunteers who had completed the training sessions. Individuals and businesses in the community were donating the equipment, he said.  
Training sessions will take place at the lifeguard headquarters at Pacific Coast Highway and Lake Street.  
Officials implored residents not to try cleaning the birds themselves.  
Dr. Victor Leipzig of the Bolsa Chica Conservancy said, "We want to make sure volunteers don't harm themselves by contact with the oil and toxic substances."

He said some birds, though coated with oil, will be able to fly inland. Residents who spot injured birds in their yards, streets, parking lots and elsewhere shouldn't try to capture the birds themselves.  
Instead, they should phone officials at 536-1455.  
Kinney said they had received reports that some people were trying to clean birds with liquid soap and other concoctions.  
"Chances are you're going to do more damage than good," he said.  
They also had reports that injured birds were being taken to private animal clinics. Kinney said they were asking that all birds be taken to collection centers.

## Ship pilots strike, cite safety

SAN PEDRO — Los Angeles Harbor executives said that pilots who decided to strike on Saturday are being unfair in their salary demands.  
The disgruntled ship pilots, who steer tankers and freighters into the Los Angeles Harbor, cited poor working conditions.  
Complaining that unresolved problems could lead to another major oil spill, representatives of the 10-member Los Angeles Pilots Association voted to keep tankers from port.  
The pilots claim that they are overworked and under

paid. They also portend that new-hires are not adequately trained.  
Port executives see the situation differently.  
"We have been negotiating with the pilots since June of 1989 and we are shocked and dismayed at this action," said Port of Los Angeles Executive Director Ezunial Burtis. "Most city employees are getting a 4 percent pay increase this year and so for the pilots, who are also city employees to demand more than a 50 percent increase and strike just 10 days prior to a salary mediation session which had already been scheduled for February 20, 1990, is unbelievable."

"They said that we require them to work too many hours and that it's a safety hazard, yet when they returned to the negotiations, they offered to work more hours for additional salary," Burtis said.  
The local longshoremen's union Saturday respected the AFL-CIO sanctioned strike, which began at 3 a.m., police said.  
Capt. Joe Silva, president of the association, said that another Valdez is waiting to happen.  
He cited a near collision on Jan. 24 in Los Angeles Harbor when two boats allegedly passed dangerously close to one another in the early morning hours.

## Huntington man among four hurt in plane crash

LONG BEACH — Four people, including a Huntington Beach man, injured Saturday in a small plane crash at Long Beach Airport were "extremely lucky" to have survived the mishap, a fire department spokesman said.

The pilot of the plane, Richard Houston, 37, of Lakewood, was the most seriously injured, suffering severe cuts and a knee injury, said Long Beach Fire Department spokesman Bob Caldwell.

Houston and his wife, Ella Mae, 22, were both listed in stable condition at St. Mary's Medical Center in Long Beach.

The two passengers, Brian Beamer, 27, of Garden Grove, and Jim Michel, 35, of Huntington Beach, both managed to walk away from the crash and were treated at Long Beach Memorial Medical Center for cuts and bruises and released.

Richard Houston lost control of his 1959 twin-engine Apache Piper when he apparently flew close to

another plane on the runway and was forced to veer away, Caldwell said.

The plane was directly behind a single-engine Cessna and may have been getting too close when the pilot was told to "break away," said Art Morrison, duty officer for the Federal Aviation Administration.

"According to bystanders, the plane was coming down and tried to lift up when (Houston) saw the plane in front of him," Caldwell said. When he tried to pull away the plane probably

"stalled out, which is typical for low speed," he added. The plane's wing then struck the ground and "did some cartwheels" next to the runway, Caldwell said.

"If this plane had not veered to left the way he did there is a strong possibility it would have ignited," Caldwell said. "The wings were sheared off and there was airplane fuel all over the area, but they landed on the soft dirt which probably saved them."

The Cessna apparently took off just after the accident, authorities said.

## District attorney's office opts against murder charge

A Newport Beach woman who allegedly ran down her son-in-law with her car during a family dispute was charged with involuntary manslaughter, rather than murder, because a prosecutor said Friday he could not prove she intended to kill him.

Betty Young Davies, 58, pleaded not guilty to the manslaughter charge, as well as felony hit and run, during her arraignment in Harbor Municipal Court.

The victim, James R. Ward, died four days after he was hit by Davies' Mercedes-Benz near his Congress Street home in Costa Mesa on Dec. 19. Ward, 31, was married to Davies' step-daughter, Wendy.

Police earlier had anticipated Davies would be charged with murder. But Deputy District Attorney Lew Rosenblum said the charges he filed were based on the evidence and "inherent limitations of the system."

"I'm not saying she didn't try to kill him, but I'm limited by what I

can prove," Rosenblum said. "It's very difficult to determine a person's state of mind. I can't speculate; I have to come forward with proof."

Davies had a history of harassing the couple, according to authorities. Police reports showed four incidents in three years — when she allegedly vandalized their cars and made annoying telephone calls.

Those past complaints would not have an impact on the most recent case, Rosenblum said.

Wendy Ward said she was not angered by the filing of the lesser charges.

"I'm trusting the DA to do his job, and I hope justice prevails," she said in a telephone interview.

When Davies first surrendered to Costa Mesa police on Dec. 19, she was freed on \$75,000 bail. After the arraignment, Judge Richard Toohy reduced bail to \$10,000.

Defense attorney Marshall Schulman argued that Davies should be released on her own recognizance because she is not a flight risk. She has been a lifetime resident of California and is a homeowner and has children and grandchildren, he said. The judge also ordered that

Davies have no contact with Wendy Ward, who attended the hearing with other family members.

Davies faces a maximum seven-year prison term if convicted. A preliminary hearing was set for April 6.

The prosecutor said his decision to file the lesser charge was one of the most difficult during his two years on the felony panel of the district attorney's office.

"My obligation is to only file those charges I feel I can prove beyond a reasonable doubt," he said.

Police this week conducted a re-enactment of the tragic incident. It was determined there was no mechanical failure with Davies' car, Rosenblum said.

Investigators are now awaiting the results of impact tests to determine whether the injuries Ward suffered, wounds on the front and rear of his head, were consistent with other evidence.

On the night of the incident, Ward, a mechanic, had escorted Davies to her car after she was seen lurking in their front yard, a neighbor said.

## Costa Mesa loses another round in ex-policeman's civil rights suit

The city of Costa Mesa, earlier ordered to pay \$65,000 to a former reserve police officer for violating his civil rights, Friday was denied a motion for a new trial and ordered to pay \$45,000 in attorney's fees.

Scott Heger sued the city in 1988, a year after he was fired without notice amid several misconduct complaints from residents. A Superior Court jury in December found that Heger was entitled to compensation but voted he not be reinstated to the position he held for six years.

Heger was fired for taking meal breaks outside the city, showing disrespect to a supervisor, failing to conform with rules and regulations, conduct unbecoming and discourtesy to the public, according to court records.

On Friday, Judge James Ross in Fullerton denied the city's request to set aside the jury's verdict and order a new trial. The jurist also awarded Heger the attorney's

fees, in addition to the earlier damage sum.

"Justice has been served," Heger said. But Steve Filarsky, a Los Angeles attorney who represents the city, said he will appeal the decision next week.

"It's all going to be subject to appeal. He's not going to see a penny of that money for years," Filarsky said. Heger's attorney, Richard Levine, said the lower court's decision was proper.

The appeal is "an attempt by the city to avoid legal responsibility on this case," he said. "Apparently the city just can't accept the fact that it fell short of the legally required behavior."

Heger claimed he was singled out for firing for reasons he doesn't know. He said he was terminated without notice and not given a chance to respond.

The city claimed that Heger was an "at will" employee and not subject to notice or appeal. In court testimony and documents, police officials questioned Heger's judgment and his willingness to accept criticism.

## HB woman held in attempted murder

A Huntington Beach woman was in custody at the Huntington Beach jail for allegedly trying to kill a visitor to her home Saturday morning.

Karen Thomas, 42, was being held in lieu of \$250,000 bail Saturday after witnesses told police she fired a revolver of unknown caliber at Timothy Savage, 25, of Colton, leav-

ing him with a bullet wound to the left shoulder. Police Lt. Roger Parker said.

Savage and the friend had been visiting at Thomas' home in the Del Mar Mobile Home Park, 19251 Brookhurst Ave., since Friday night when he had an altercation with Karen Thomas' husband, James Thomas, Parker said.

After the fracas, Thomas chased

Savage and a mutual friend from her home around 5 a.m. Saturday, firing at least two shots at them, a witness told police.

Savage was reported in good condition at UCI Medical Center, Parker said.

Karen Thomas, who was held on suspicion of attempted murder, was scheduled for arraignment Wednesday, he said.

#### Mesan clings to life after wreck

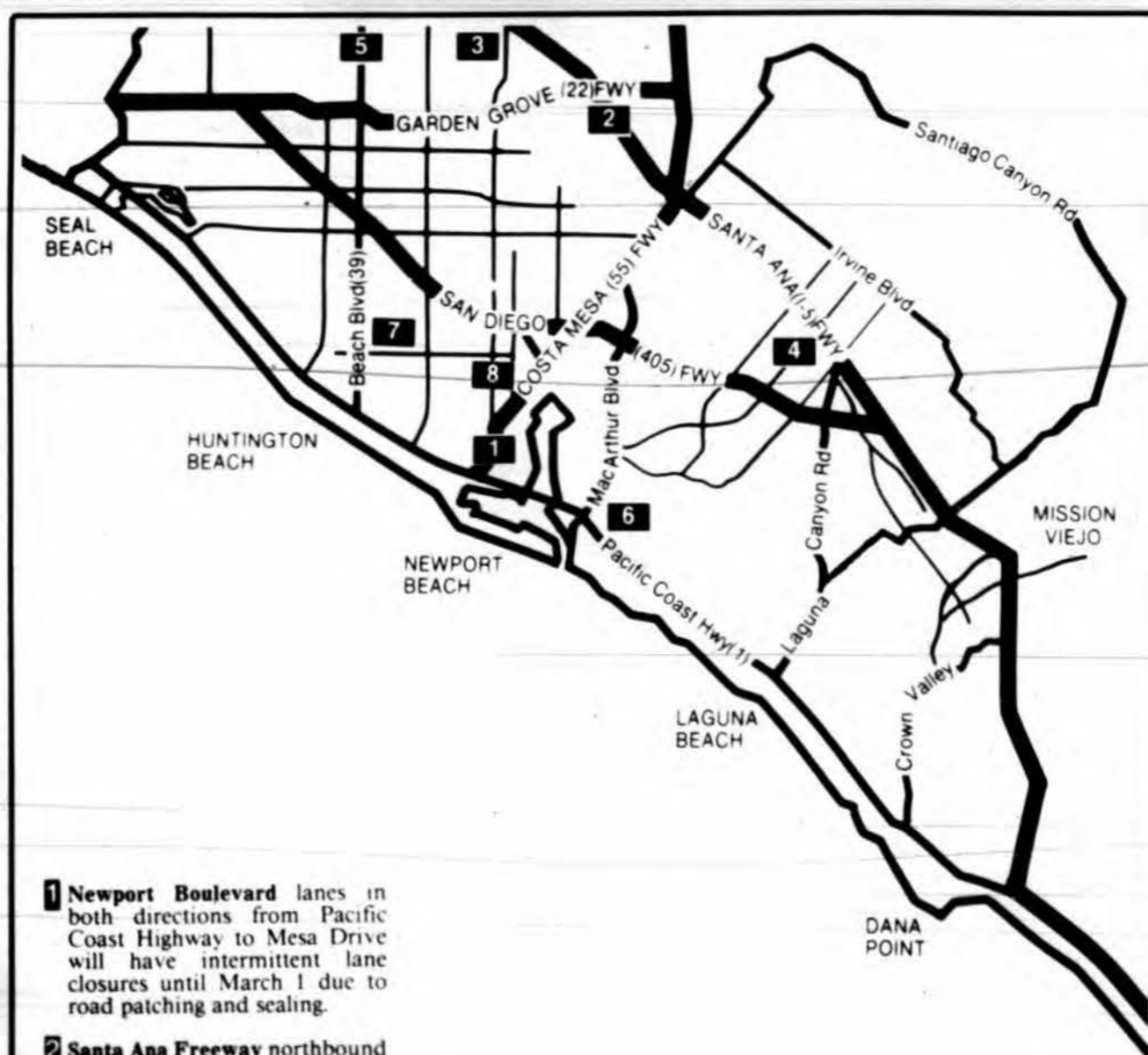

## Protesters chant 'Hang Mandela!'



On the day that South African President F.W. de Klerk announced the release of Nelson Mandela, right-wing extremists called for his death at a rally in Church Square. A crowd of about 2,000 demonstrators then marched through the streets of Pretoria calling for the overthrow of the present government.

PRETORIA, South Africa (AP) — Hundreds of extreme right-wingers yelling "Hang Mandela!" marched through the streets with swastika flags Saturday to demand the overthrow of President F.W. de Klerk.

Members of the Afrikaner Resistance Movement, dressed in khaki uniforms and armed with whips, knives and pistols, marched to government headquarters with a tiny white coffin representing whites killed in terrorist attacks. Marchers dumped the coffin after police refused to accept it.

"Hang de Klerk!" and "We are ready to fight!" the column of about 2,000 marchers yelled on their way to the Union Buildings. "Hang Mandela!"

The march began before de Klerk made the long-awaited announcement that black leader Nelson Mandela would be freed from prison today. But the news spread quickly among the demonstrators as the march progressed.

Blacks throughout the country celebrated the news. Mandela, leader of the African National Congress, has been in prison for more than 27 years.

Police said five blacks were killed and 45 injured after officers fired birdshot and tear gas to break up an anti-apartheid demonstration in the township of Kathlehong outside Johannesburg. Authorities provided no further details.

Hundreds of police, who authorized the white march in Pretoria, stood guard along the way. Marchers scuffled with some journalists and onlookers but there were no other incidents. Police ordered blacks to leave the area to avoid confrontations.

Eugene TerreBlanche, leader of the white resistance movement, told about 3,000 people at a rally before the march that de Klerk's plan to negotiate with blacks on extending some political rights to them was a betrayal of South Africa's white minority. He said the government's move

would trigger a massive white backlash. "We will launch a revolution to save our freedom," he told the cheering crowd. "We won't give up a centimeter of South Africa."

TerreBlanche said de Klerk's legalization of the ANC and other anti-apartheid groups Feb. 2 was an acceptance of terrorism. He said the president was crippling the white security forces and preparing the way for black domination.

"He's inviting the murderers of the ANC to the table for talks," TerreBlanche said.

His supporters, including hundreds of men, women and children in the group's khaki uniforms, applauded and waved the group's swastika-style red, white and black flags. Some protesters carried Nazi swastika flags.

"No blacks" and "Hitler was right," said signs carried by marchers.

Local journalists said the crowd attracted by the resistance movement was much larger than its other recent meetings in the Pretoria area.

## World leaders welcome news

LONDON (AP) — World leaders welcomed South Africa's announcement Saturday of Nelson Mandela's impending release from prison, and international rejoicing began to build for an event so long awaited by so many.

Britain said it was time to resume contacts with the internationally isolated Pretoria government, but anti-apartheid campaigners warned against any reduction of pressure on South Africa's white-led government.

In Lusaka, Zambia President Kenneth Kaunda, whose country has been a refuge for the exiled leadership of Mandela's African National Congress, said his first reaction was to kneel down and thank God.

In the Soviet Union, Moscow radio broadcast news of the announcement, then added, "Nelson Mandela has become the world's most famous political prisoner, put in jail for the struggle against apartheid in South Africa."

Amsterdam's central Leidseplein square was temporarily rechristened Nelson Mandela Square.

In London, a jubilant crowd of about 120, some waving pictures of Mandela, celebrated in the pouring

rain outside South Africa House in Trafalgar Square.

In a statement released by her 10 Downing St. office, Mrs. Thatcher said, "We believe that the steps President de Klerk has taken merit a positive, practical response."

"We believe it no longer makes sense to discourage new investment in South Africa — a restraint which in our case in any event has been voluntary — and we shall be discussing this with our EC partners," she said.

In 1986, the EC banned imports of South African iron, steel and Kruggerand gold coins, and barred new investment in the country. It had already frozen scientific and cultural relations.

Britain regards the iron, steel and coin embargoes as mandatory, but not the investment ban, and has already announced that it is no longer observing the scientific and cultural embargo.

In London, Bob Hughes, chairman of the Anti-Apartheid Movement, said he was delighted at the news, which he called "a tremendous victory for the people of South Africa and for the international sanctions campaign."

## Bush invites de Klerk, Mandela to Washington

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush telephoned President F.W. de Klerk on Saturday to praise his planned release of imprisoned black activist Nelson Mandela and pledge "U.S. willingness to help create a climate for negotiations" between black and white South Africans, an aide said.

De Klerk's announcement that Mandela would be set free today opens the way for lifting of U.S. sanctions against Pretoria, one administration official said.

During their five-minute conversation Bush invited de Klerk to meet with him at the White House and told him he was issuing the same invitation to Mandela, said

White House spokesman John Herrick.

He also expressed his admiration for the significant initiatives announced by the South African government in recent days, and reiterated his hope there would be continued progress toward a negotiated solution in an atmosphere of non-violence," Herrick said of the call Bush made from the presidential retreat at Camp David, Md.

"President Bush stated U.S. willingness to help create a climate for negotiations, and his plan to continue meeting with a broad spectrum of South African leaders," Herrick said.

shortly before the announcement of Mandela's release. Police would give no further details.

The South African Press Association, an independent domestic news agency, quoted Mandela as saying in a recent interview that he sought to promote unity between blacks and whites.

"Whites fear the reality of democracy," he was quoted as saying. "We must work towards a common destiny, and that can only be achieved through a non-racial society and not one in which whites continue to demand special political treatment." The news agency did not specify

when the interview was conducted or how it was arranged. Mandela is not known to have received any journalists as visitors.

De Klerk, who stunned South Africans on Feb. 2 by lifting a 30-year ban on the ANC, said Mandela would be freed unconditionally at 3 p.m. (5 a.m. PST) today at the gates of Victor Verster prison.

Bulelani Ngcuka, one of the activists who met Mandela late Saturday, said police had expressed concern about his safety.

"We thanked them, but said the security of Comrade Mandela is our own affair," Ngcuka said. "We will do all in our power to protect him."

They said Mandela would make a statement to the press and give an

address from the balcony of Cape Town's City Hall.

At his news conference, De Klerk also said the 3½-year-old state of emergency could be lifted soon if there was no upsurge of unrest. He expressed willingness to negotiate the possible release of remaining political prisoners.

Mandela, in recent talks with the government, had demanded freedom for all political prisoners and an end to the state of emergency.

Mandela has been jailed since 1962 and is serving a life sentence for helping plan the start of the ANC's guerrilla campaign. Many South African blacks consider him their paramount leader, and he would be a favorite to win the

presidency if blacks were allowed to vote.

Under South Africa's system of apartheid, the 28 million blacks have no vote in national affairs. The 5 million whites control the economy and maintain separate districts, schools and health services.

The Rev. Jesse Jackson, on a 12-day visit to South Africa, said he welcomed de Klerk's "bold and courageous" acts but urged nations to maintain pressure on the government until all segregation laws are abolished.

There was no immediate comment from Mandela's wife, Winnie, who left the family home in Soweto shortly before the announcement was made.

When some young blacks spat at white bystanders, other blacks stopped them. Many white motorists honked their horns seriously and some drove at high speed, sending black marchers scattering but causing no injuries.

Some whites in high-rise apartments hurled bottles as a column of marchers, shadowed by police cars, reached the multiracial neighborhood of Hillbrow. No one was hit. Young blacks pantomimed firing at police with make-believe Soviet-designed AK-47 automatic rifles, the symbol of the ANC's military wing.

But Tutu said one of Mandela's main tasks would be to try to bring South Africans together and obtain social justice for blacks.

"What Nelson is going to be doing is to focus all those aspirations (of the people), and we'll be able to draw people of different points of view together in bringing about this new, non-racial, non-sexist democratic South

Africa," Tutu said.

President F.W. de Klerk told a news conference in Cape Town that Mandela would be freed at the gates of Victor Verster prison on Sunday afternoon.

The rest of the world heard the news before most South Africans. It was not broadcast on government-run radio and television until an hour later, and a black-oriented TV channel did not interrupt its coverage of a soccer game. But later the entire news conference was shown, and the story took up all of the evening news programs.

Most of Soweto's 2.5 million people got news of Mandela's release by word of mouth.

Mandela's wife, Winnie, attended a funeral earlier Saturday for Clayton Sizwe Sithole, boyfriend of her youngest daughter, Zindziwe-Sithole was found hanging in a cell at police headquarters two weeks ago after being arrested in the investigation of a year-old murder.

## German reunification on fast track

MOSCOW (AP) — West German Chancellor Helmut Kohl said Saturday that Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev promised to respect German reunification, and he declared it a "very good day for Germany."

Kohl and Foreign Minister Hans-Dietrich Genscher also disclosed that they expect a reunification plan with agreement of the four victorious World War II Allies to be ready this year to present to a pan-European summit meeting.

At a news conference following 2½-hours of talks with Gorbachev, Kohl gave a glowing assessment of relations with the Soviet Union and the Kremlin's attitude toward the accelerating developments between East and West Germany.

Kohl said he acknowledged in his talk with Gorbachev that de facto reunification is occurring faster than anyone expected and said the two Germanys along with the Allies must work out a program for controlling it.

Gorbachev agreed that the decision on reunification "is the sole right of the German people," including the time frame and the method, Kohl said.

The official Soviet news agency Tass carried a report on the Gorbachev-Kohl meeting that supported Kohl's assessment.

Kohl said the World War II Allies — the United States, Britain, France and the Soviet Union — should be consulted in reunification planning.

"This should happen between the two (Ger-

man) governments, but not behind the backs of the four powers," the chancellor said.

"At the end of this year there would be an opportunity within a summit-level European conference to discuss and announce these results," Kohl said. The Soviets had previously suggested such a meeting.

"General Secretary Gorbachev told me unequivocally that the Soviet Union will respect the decision of Germans to live in one state," Kohl said. "This is a very good day for Germany and a happy day for me personally."

Kohl and Soviet Foreign Ministry spokesman Gennady I. Gerasimov indicated that a clear promise to respect the current boundaries outlining East Germany and West Germany also would be contained in a reunification plan.

## Four killed, 3 hurt in robbery shooting

LAS CRUCES, N.M. (AP) — Robbers shot seven people in a bowling alley office Saturday, killing a man, his two young daughters, and another girl before setting a fire to try to cover up the crime, police said.

"What we have here is a very vicious crime, the assassination of kids," said Las Cruces police Capt. Fred Rubio. "A whole family was assassinated."

The three survivors and residents living near the Las Cruces Bowl lanes gave police a description of two men believed to have committed the robbery and shootings.

Rubio said officers were looking for two Hispanic men, one described as about 5-foot-11 with short, kinky hair and in his 30s; the other as 5-foot-6, dark, heavyset and in his late 40s or early 50s.

Officers were manning 10 roadblocks into and out of this city of about 55,000 people, about 45 miles north of the Mexico border. A helicopter was being used and 80 percent of the

police department's criminal investigation staff was working on the case, Rubio said.

Rubio identified the dead as Steve Turan, a bowling alley worker believed to be in his 30s, and daughters Paula Turan, 7, and Victoria Turan, 2, and another girl, Amy Houser, 13.

He said Victoria was alive when the victims were found, but was pronounced dead on arrival at Memorial General Hospital.

The three survivors were taken to the hospital where they were in critical condition, Rubio said. He refused to release their names, citing security reasons and concern for their safety. He said one was 12, one was 30 and the third was in his or her 30s.

The police captain said a fire was reported at the bowling alley at 8:33 a.m., a half-hour after it opened.

Firefighters found the seven victims in the office.

"According to our preliminary investigation, they were rounded up and taken into that

particular office," Rubio said. "They were concentrated in one area and shot in one area."

The robbers then started a fire in the office. "It appears it was to cover up the crime scene," he said.

Rubio said the apparent motive was robbery, "and apparently they decided to rid themselves of any witnesses."

"You're talking about a 3-year-old. What could a 3-year-old testify to? This is why I say it's the worst," he said.

Police did not disclose the amount of money taken, but Rubio said:

"What makes it even worse, is not only the amount of people who were shot for the amount of money taken... if you start adding up all these ages you're going to come up with 100 years of life that was just gone by some ignorant people that did this."

Authorities said junior league games for youngsters had been scheduled to start at the bowling alley at 9 a.m.

### Galileo experiences camera troubles

PASADENA — Galileo's camera shutter snapped uncontrollably for five hours Saturday after the spacecraft zipped around Venus, but officials said it shouldn't endanger the \$1.35 billion, eight-year mission to Jupiter.

Engineers at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory shut off the television camera while diagnosing the problem, which apparently involved faulty software that made Galileo's computer send incorrect commands to the camera, mission director Neal Ausman said.

The engineers believed an error in computer commands they sent to Galileo made the shutter snap when it wasn't supposed to, and they were "pretty certain there's nothing wrong with the computer or camera," said NASA spokesman Bob MacMillin.

### Italian fugitive caught entering U.S.

LOS ANGELES — An Italian fugitive sought for more than a decade in connection with the botched kidnapping of a wealthy businessman's son was arrested when he tried to enter this country under his own name, authorities said.

Pasquale Valitutti was taken into custody at Los Angeles International Airport last Nov. 22, authorities revealed at a federal court extradition hearing Friday.

The hearing, to determine whether Valitutti, 43, should be returned to his native Italy, was continued until March 7. He is being held at downtown's federal Metropolitan Detention Center.

Valitutti was convicted in absentia of conspiracy in the attempted kidnapping in Florence of the son of Italian industrialist Tito Nero in October 1977.

### Insurance firms face investigation

SAN FRANCISCO — A state Department of Insurance official promises that a probe of insurance companies that violate the good driver provisions of Proposition 103 won't "be a long, drawn-out investigation." "We hope to have something in our attorneys' hands within the next week and a half," said Dennis Ward, chief investigator for Insurance Commissioner Roxani Gillespie.

"It is unbelievable that some insurance companies believe they can avoid insuring good drivers," he said in an interview published in Saturday's editions of the San Francisco Chronicle. "That is a key provision of Proposition 103."

## NATIONAL BRIEFS

### Copter bursts into flames after crash

NEW YORK — A sightseeing helicopter carrying four tourists and a pilot went down Saturday afternoon in the East River, bursting into flames after it crashed into the water near a heliport, police and witnesses said.

Police divers and a rescuer in a yellow life raft went out to save the passengers and pilot, with some of the survivors holding onto a board extended by the boater until help arrived, witnesses said.

Eighteen people were taken to the hospital, including a 14-year-old boy on the helicopter who was in critical condition after his heart stopped, said Lt. Joseph Apuzzo of Emergency Medical Services.

### Severe storms slash Southeast

Severe thunderstorms slashed through parts of the Southeast with tornadoes and high winds overnight and early Saturday, killing four people, injuring dozens, knocking out power to thousands and damaging buildings and automobiles.

In the Atlanta area, two people died Saturday morning when trees fell into their bedrooms, and a woman in north central Louisiana was killed Friday night when a wind gust flung her mobile home 30 feet, authorities said.

The thunderstorm line, moving east overnight, brought reports of tornado touchdowns in Louisiana, Georgia, Florida and the Carolinas, and high winds at one point knocked out power to 112,000 utility customers in Alabama and 300,000 in Georgia.

Winds up to 50 mph knocked down trees, and pea- to golfball-size hail knocked out windows in buildings and cars in northern Louisiana.

The storms brought gusts of more than 80 mph in Atlanta and Macon, with tornadoes damaging structures in Columbus, Americus and other parts of northeastern Georgia.

## WORLD BRIEFS

### Superpower negotiations successful

MOSCOW — An emerging chemical weapons accord and significant progress on arms control marked a mostly successful marathon negotiating mission here by Secretary of State James A. Baker III that wound up Saturday with an unprecedented live debate with Soviet legislators.

The net result before Baker flew off to Sofia for talks with government and opposition forces in Bulgaria, an East European country in a rocky transition from hard line communism, is that President Bush and Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev can anticipate signing possibly two accords to curb chemical and nuclear weapons when they meet at the summit in Washington in June.

In an exceptionally glowing joint statement issued before Baker's departure, the superpowers stressed that while "certain significant differences" remain between them, the relationship "is increasingly marked by understanding, cooperation and the search for mutual advantage."

### 9 die as Burmese attack rebel camp

MAE SOT, Thailand — Burmese troops crossed into Thailand while launching intense attacks on a rebel camp inside Burma and nine soldiers were killed, Thai border patrol police said Saturday.

The Burmese have failed to capture the Karen rebels' base, Kaw Moo Ra, after four days of stepped up fighting that has included intense mortar and rocket barrages, said police officers who requested anonymity.

The Karen are among a dozen ethnic minorities fighting Burma's military government for greater autonomy. In recent months, Burmese troops have overrun a string of Karen bases along the frontier.

### Cosmonauts set off for space station

MOSCOW — Two Soviet cosmonauts prepared to blast off for the Mir space station this morning to replace a pair of fellow spacemen who have spent six months in orbit, the official Tass news agency said.

The Soyuz-TM capsule carrying Anatoly Solovyov and Alexander Balandin was scheduled to rocket skyward at 9:16 a.m. Moscow time and link up later with the Mir. Their mission is to last six months.

Soviet television said the launch would be carried live, and a quartet of American astronauts — Jerry Ross, Ron Grabe, Paul Weitz and Dan Brandenstein — were invited to witness it at the Baikonur Cosmodrome in Soviet Kazakhstan.

The cosmonauts now aboard the Mir, Alexander Viktorenko and Alexander Serebrov, are scheduled to return to Earth Feb. 19.

# War against drugs progresses, but trade flourishing

WASHINGTON (AP) — The drug trade in the United States is still flourishing more than a year after President Bush declared war on cocaine and other illegal substances.

As Bush prepares for a drug summit this week with Latin American leaders, the administration cites record cocaine seizures, hardening public attitudes against drugs and declines in casual use as evidence of progress in the war. The Colombian government also appears to be making some headway against the world's major cocaine cartels.

Yet as he unveiled his most recent battle plan Jan. 25, Bush acknowledged, "Given the headlines we've seen recently, it's clear we're only getting started."

Among those headlines:  
 • The mayor of the nation's capital, Marion Barry, faces a misdemeanor drug charge, and the FBI says it has videotapes of him smoking crack cocaine.

• Bloodshed, most of it drug-related, continues to ravage inner cities, where dealers sell drugs to neighbors and to suburbanites who transport the illicit purchases to their seemingly safe areas.

• Tens of thousands of babies are born addicted to cocaine and other drugs taken by their mothers, and preliminary reports indicate drug-related hospital emergency room incidents showed no signs of decreasing from 1988 to 1989.

In an effort to further the war on drugs at the source, Bush travels Thursday to Cartagena, Colombia, for a summit with the presidents of Colombia, Peru and Bolivia, where most of the world's cocaine is produced.

Representatives of the four countries agreed Jan. 14 in Bolivia to launch, through coordinated use of their armed forces, an "unstoppable assault on drug traffickers," although South American officials said the accord would not permit direct U.S. intervention. The agreement is expected to be signed at the summit.

William J. Bennett, the federal

drug control policy director, says the war's most important advance has been the increasing hostility of Americans toward drug use and the corresponding decline in casual use.

"We don't take credit for that," said Bennett, noting that the administration completed its initial drug war strategy only in September. The national survey reflecting the decline in casual use was conducted in 1988.

This year, the administration is spending \$9.5 billion on the drug war. The vast majority of the money is devoted to law enforcement, including \$1.5 billion for new federal prisons. Drug-treatment funds increased 51 percent to \$1.3 billion

and drug-prevention money increased 65 percent to \$1.1 billion.

About one-fourth of the federal drug war budget is allocated for block grants to states. As of Feb. 5, the Alcohol, Drug Abuse and Mental Health Administration awarded grants to 18 states and had 20 other state applications pending.

For 1991, the administration proposed a drug war budget of \$10.6 billion. Seventy-one percent is earmarked for law enforcement, including \$1.2 billion for the Pentagon. The rest of the money would go for treatment and prevention.

The drug war strategy urged states to impose harsh penalties on drug

users, including taking away driver's licenses and autos used during drug purchases.

In the past two years, 14 states made driver's license revocation for drug violators either mandatory or gave judges the right to take them away, while similar legislation is pending in 11 other states, according to the American Legislative Exchange Council. New Jersey, which imposed the first such law in 1988, took away the licenses of 9,600 drug violators last year, said Larry Cirignano of Bennett's office.

Meanwhile, he said, five states — Colorado, Georgia, Mississippi, Missouri and New Jersey — are con-

sidering denial or suspension of professional licenses of drug violators — another Bush proposal. The licenses would affect professions ranging from barber and hairdresser to lawyer, physician and architect.

Pollsters say significant majorities of Americans approve of harsh penalties against even casual users, but not everyone has turned against drugs.

The 1988 federal survey that indicated a decline in casual drug use revealed also that those who do use them are using them more frequently.

The number of hospital emergency room visits during the first half

of 1989 for problems related to cocaine, heroin and methamphetamine kept pace with 1988, said Andrea Kopstein of the National Institute on Drug Abuse. She stressed that seasonal variations may change the picture when all the 1989 figures are in.

Meanwhile, several well-known personalities either have been charged with drug crimes or have revealed current or former drug addictions, including Mayor Barry, violinist Eugene Fodor, Washington Redskins football player Dexter Manley, entertainer Sammy Davis Jr., teen-age actress Drew Barrymore and Olympic sprinter Ben Johnson.

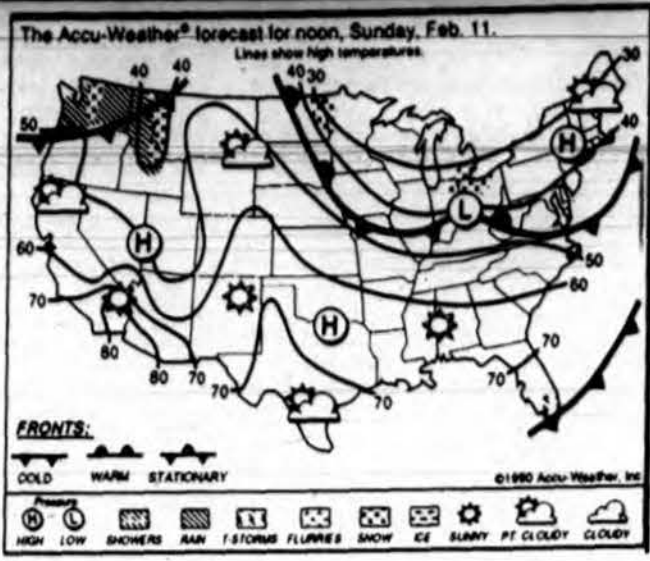

## Israel isn't racist state some portray

It has often been said by the Jews "never again." This saying was made popular by the Jewish Defense League which was founded by Rabbi Meir Kahane. The saying "never again" refers to the pogroms and persecutions of the Jews both ancient and recent. It reinforces in the Jewish mind that they will never allow themselves to be persecuted or massacred again.

I've heard it said by some, "What a hypocritical thing to say in light of the way the Jews treat the Arabs and Palestinians who live among and around them, the Palestinians have a right to revolt and rebel!"

Rabbi Meir Kahane is from the United States. Now in his early 50s, Kahane was born in Brooklyn, N.Y., was ordained as an Orthodox rabbi (the strictest of the sects of Judaism) and later served in two synagogues in Queens, N.Y. When people want to justify the anarchy and chaos of the Palestinian uprising, they usually bring up the name of Meir Kahane as the justification for their accusations.

Rabbi Kahane is famous for his denunciation of the Arabs and Palestinians, calling them "dogs" publicly. When he does this (and other defamatory things), it usually leads people in the West to the conclusion that the Palestinians are justified in their rebellion; that they have the "right" to rebel against the governmental body that is over them. If one were to search deeper, though, one would find that Kahane is not widely supported in Israel.

According to H. L. Willmington in his book "Israel at Forty," when Kahane was elected to the Knesset (the Parliament of Israel), "Condemnation of Kahane and shock... was almost universal. Every other Knesset faction declared its unwillingness to be identified with (Kahane) or to be in any way politically aligned with (him). Even the president of Israel intimated that he might break with tradition and not meet with the newly elected faction head."

We now begin to see that the government of Israel is not as racist as some people would paint it. The people of Israel are not much different. When Kahane set out to do his first official public act, that of expelling the Arabs from the city of Ummel-Fahm and later all of Israel, Willmington writes: "Hundreds of Israelis traveled to the village and spent the preceding night with Arab families as a means of expressing their disgust for Kahane's action and their sympathy for the Arab residents. Several Arabs told the Jerusalem Post that the presence of the Jews would 'add to the improvement of relations between the Jews and Arabs.' Among the overnight guests were about a dozen members of the Knesset."

These are true sentiments of the Israeli government and people. What right do the Palestinians have to rebel? I don't think that they have any right at all. No one has the right to maim and kill and destroy like they have over the prejudices of one person. Oh, it's true that there are racists in Israel but, it's clearly not the majority. Neither is it fair to say that all the Arabs in Israel support the uprising. They don't.

It's a minority doing these things and levying these charges. I have Jewish and Arab friends tell me that it's better that the Jews are in control of Israel. Arabs and Jews living in Israel both know that as soon as the Israeli flag goes down and the Palestinian one goes up, there'll be no religious freedom for anyone, neither the Jew nor the Christian nor the other sects of Islam, only the one that's in power at the time (such as is the case in Iran). The Palestinians aren't educated enough to run a democratic government and neither do they want to be.

The Israeli government from its inception in 1948 offered education to the Arabs, but it has only been met with a mediocre reception by the Palestinians. An uneducated person perceives (falsely) prejudices against himself a lot easier than an educated person. Kahane really gets to the heart of the issue about racism in Israel in his Oct. 6, 1988, statement in The Los Angeles Times when he says, regarding his upcoming court hearing, "If I am racist, Judaism is racist, and I want the high court to say so." The courts may very well do that after listening to such an extreme radical as Kahane. Fortunately, one person does not make up an entire nation's beliefs.

We here in the West can understand how one can be of one ethnic origin and have totally contrary beliefs involving the same. The same is not true in the Arab mind. Is it any wonder that after an Arab reads or hears of the Jews religious dogma (especially when they hear it espoused by Kahane), they come away with the idea that it must be OK to kill and persecute the Arabs according to the Jewish religion? Since many Arabs are illiterate, it's easy to see how the ones who are educated can whip the ones that aren't into mass hysteria by repeating the often misquoted verses of the Torah that sound racist.

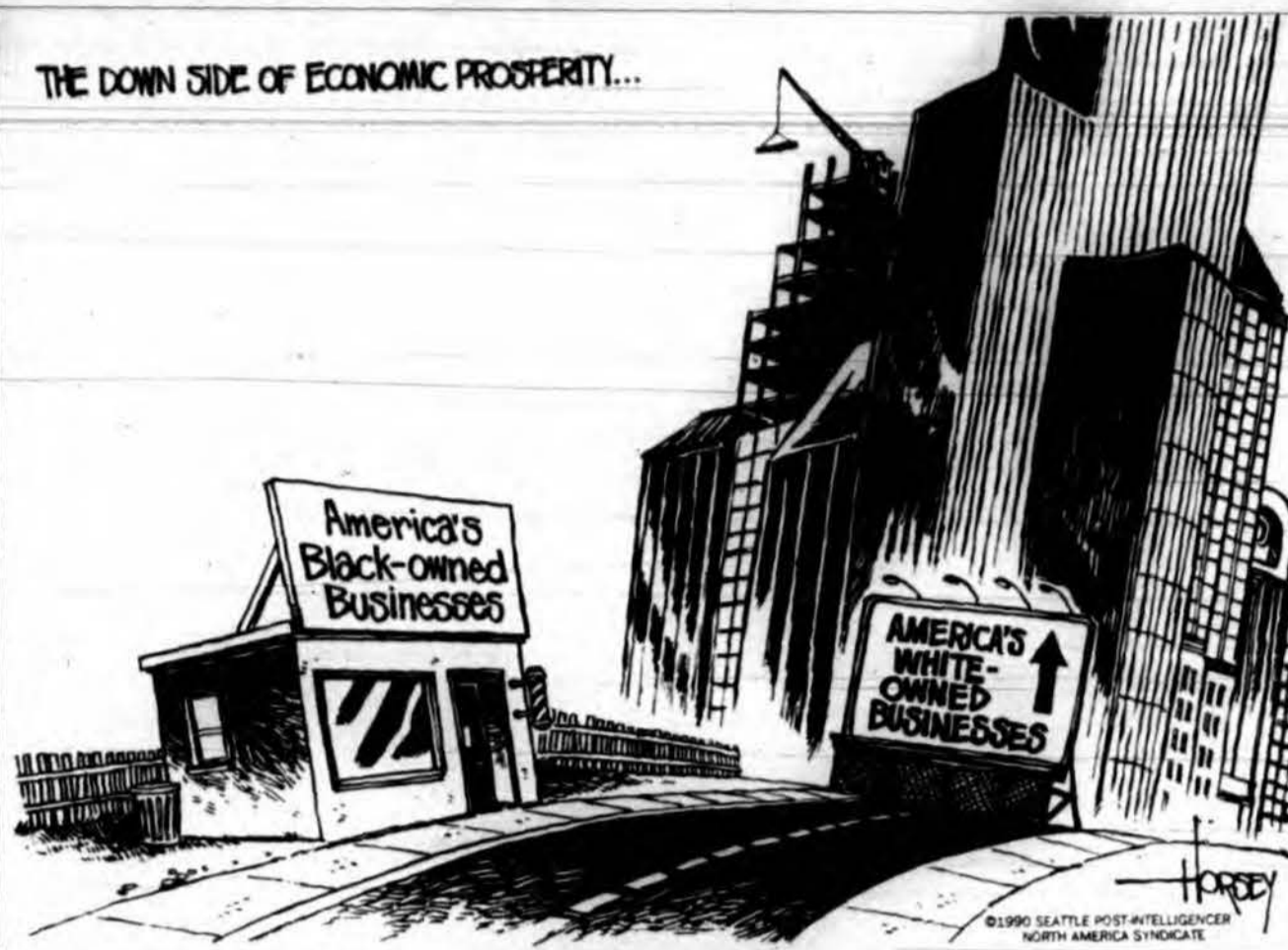
An uneducated person reading the Torah might very well think Judaism is racist if he or she didn't know anything about the historical time the Torah was set in or the other mitigating circumstances that shed light on any historical work. The people who are against the state of Israel use this ignorance to their advantage and exploit the Arab people to their own end. It is well known that the radio of Syria was behind a lot of the Palestinian uprising by organizing the places of protest through radio broadcasts to the Palestinian villagers — a shameful act of using people to obtain their own ends.

In light of all this, are the Palestinian people justified in their demonstrations and rebellion? I think not, not when there are so many Jews that support the Palestinians both in the government and among the people. Will peace ever come to the Middle East? Even if the Arabs and Jews were to overcome many of their cultural misunderstandings and all the Jews and Arabs were educated, I still don't think that peace would prevail.

The only time there will be peace in the Middle East is when the Prince of Peace is enthroned in Jerusalem.

## Many local agencies help needy

To the Editor:

This is an incomplete answer for Sandi Howe, who asked on Jan. 22 where her family could donate food and clothing to the homeless. You've raised a very good question, Sandi.

Have you followed the saga of Share Our Selves in Costa Mesa? I also live in Huntington Beach and have donated to SOS for years. They have had an excellent program that provided weekly bags of groceries to those in need. They often ask for pop-top individual cans of fruit cocktail, tuna, puddings, etc. that can be used by those living on the streets; they are especially handy for children. Those living in cars or on the streets can get food more than once a week because they have no way to store things.

SOS also provides clothing and emergency money for gas to get someone back and forth to work. At times SOS is able to put a family up

at a motel for a few days.

There was a soup kitchen next door, but that was forced out by neighbors who complained of the numbers of people walking on the sidewalks on their way to eat. I always thought that was why we had sidewalks!

The soup kitchen now operates at the South Coast Christian Church on the corner of Placentia Avenue and Victoria Street, again in Costa Mesa.

But now SOS itself is being evicted for the same reasons. And your letter hit home! Where are our distribution centers? There are none!

There used to be a free clinic here in downtown Huntington Beach but it's gone. Because of cutbacks in the governor's office the clinic must now charge, and it has moved to 1792 Beach Blvd. It does use volunteers there to keep the costs down, and it is now called the HB Com-

munity Clinic.

The SOS Free Medical Clinic remains at Rea Center in Costa Mesa. I volunteer there to translate for the doctors. They serve a largely Hispanic population of the working poor people who work for minimum wages without medical benefits.

I think every city should have its own center like SOS. Or at the very least, our City Council should participate and assist Costa Mesa financially.

There is a Huntington Youth Shelter in the works. I'm sure the city could inform you about who to contact to offer your assistance.

On occasion, I have taken used furniture and household goods to Commodore Circle — there are always people there eager to take anything you offer. Just drive down to the Circle and speak to young people and ask them to see if their families need what I have. They

soon come back with folks ready to carry the articles away, and I leave knowing they will be put to good use.

The Goodwill fills a need, but it is only one niche. There are many of the most needy for whom their prices are too high. We need a free outlet.

We are a truly generous people and extremely fortunate. We discard so many useful items, often into the trash, because we simply lack direction on what to do with them. Can't someone come up with a solution? Perhaps the Daily Pilot could publish a periodic listing of agencies much like the list it publishes periodically of our elected officials with addresses and phone numbers so we can contact them.

Perhaps people will write in with some other ideas for Sandi and others.

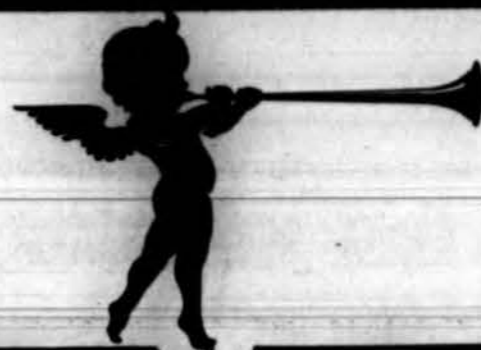

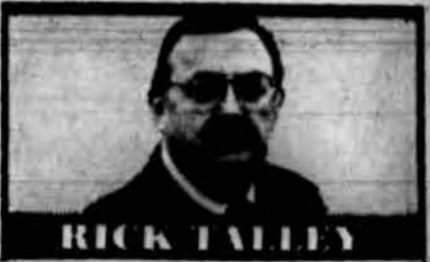

Unbeatable Mike joins the ranks of mere mortals

TOKYO — Mike Tyson was on the floor, his face a mask of pain and defeat, as the referee counted over him. Across the ring, James "Buster" Douglas watched as the heavyweight champion of the world struggled to get off the canvas.

In doing so, he stripped away the cloak of invincibility that Tyson had worn so proudly since first becoming champion in 1986.

"I wasn't afraid of the man. I'm only afraid of God," Douglas said.

He admitted that he had often looked mediocre in past fights — his desire often was questioned — and said, "It was time for the real James Douglas to come out."

The real James Douglas betiddled Tyson with movement, jabs and quick right hands. The real James Douglas got up from an eighth-round knockdown when it appeared that he would be remembered only for giving Tyson a tough fight.

The real James Douglas landed a right uppercut followed by a left and right to the head that dropped Tyson in a heap in Douglas' corner. There, his left eye closed, Mike Tyson, who once said he would have to be killed before he would give up his championship, was counted out.

"A fighter cannot afford to lose if he's a pro," Tyson said a few days before the fight.

Never was a defeat more costly. It cost Tyson millions of dollars for a scheduled defense against Evander Holyfield June 18. It could have cost him what he most cherished — a place alongside the great heavyweights

# He flies over the Florida Panhandle, as well as through the air in the CBA

PENSACOLA, Fla. — When he was a boy, Gerry Wright told some people he planned to be a pilot or astronaut. He told others he wanted to play professional basketball.



Now those ambitions have come together over the Florida Panhandle.

A full-time Navy flight student, Wright is a part-time reserve forward for the Pensacola Tornadoes and slam-dunk champion of the Continental Basketball Association.

He loves both, but there's no comparison between flying and playing basketball.

"It's a hell of a lot harder to fly a plane than run up and down a basketball court," says the 26-year-old, who learned to fly on instruments through "goopy" fog and clouds. "I can always find the basket. There's no gooo."

Wright was drafted by the Detroit Pistons in 1988 after graduating from the University of Iowa where he was known as "Sir Jamalot." But he spurned the NBA to join the Marines, later switching to the Navy.

Now he's an ensign at Whiting Field, about 35 miles north of Pensacola, where he flies T-34C TurboMentors. He is near the end of primary flight school and will go on to helicopter or multi-engine propeller training at Whiting.

He once dreamed of flying jets, but at 6-6 is too tall for the cramped cockpits.

Passing up the NBA was a tough decision, but

Wright was looking for challenge, responsibility, satisfaction and reward he couldn't find in professional basketball.

"When you get back home and go to the grocery store, no one's going to go after you for an autograph if you've been out hunting a Russian sub," Wright says. "It's a different kind of reward. I didn't play for the fame and the fortune. Maybe I'm just old-fashioned."

Wright seemed destined to fly. He was born on an Air Force base, the son of a flight engineer.

Gerry (pronounced 'Gary') is the youngest of four children of Henry and Alma Wright, now of Austin, Texas. His father retired after 24 years in the Air Force and is a postal worker. His mother is a teacher.

"I feel had he gone to the Detroit Pistons he'd still be there," Henry Wright says. "But that was his decision. I think he made a decision he can live with."

The elder Wright said he didn't try to influence his son, telling him only to the best at whatever he did — or, as the advertisements for the armed services put it, "be all that you can be." It's what prompted Gerry to opt for the Navy rather than Air Force, where he didn't have to follow in his father's footsteps.

He got his chance to play pro basketball when a Tornadoes coach, not realizing he had played in the Big Ten, saw him in a pickup volleyball game.

Wright was invited to the Tornadoes rookie camp and received permission from Navy Secretary H. Lawrence Garrett to play with the CBA team in his free time. He has played only in home games except for one road trip during Christmas vacation.

"It's been a load, but one that I welcome," says Wright.

## Eagle gives Green lead

## Two lose in arbitration

NEW YORK — R.J. Reynolds and Joe Hesketh lost their salary arbitration cases Saturday and Jamie Moyer and the Texas Rangers settled on a one-year contract for \$340,000.

Arbitrator Gil Vernon picked Pittsburgh's figure of \$535,000, a raise of \$110,000, instead of Reynolds' figure of \$785,000.

Reynolds, 29, batted .270 in 125 games last season with six home runs, 48 runs batted in and a career-best 22 stolen bases.

Pittsburgh has have won two of three arbitration cases this winter. The Pirates beat third baseman Bobby Bonilla and lost to left-hander Bob Kipper.

Hesketh, a left-hander who will be 31 next week, was 6-4 in 1989 with a 5.77 earned-run average and three saves. He pitched in 43 games, all in relief.

## Schrader wins Daytona pole

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. — Ken Schrader earned a piece of history on Saturday by taking the pole position for the Daytona 500 for the third straight year.

The 34-year-old Schrader, driving for Hendrick Motorsports, came into the opening round of qualifying at Daytona International Speedway as the heavy favorite. He did not disappoint, ignoring the pressure and easily handling a bothersome 15-20 mph wind while turning a lap of 196.515 mph.

That was not quite up to the 196.997 lap he ran on the 2.5-mile, high-banked oval in 1989, but it was good enough to knock Dale Earnhardt's 195.767 lap off the pole.

Those two, both in Chevrolet Lumina, will lead the 42-car field next Sunday at the start of the 500-mile race.

The rest of the lineup will be determined in the Twin 125-mile Qualifying Races on Thursday. The fast laps by each driver — other than Schrader and Earnhardt — from Saturday, as well as Monday and Tuesday's upcoming qualifying sessions, will set the lineups for Thursday.

## Trenary U.S. skating champ

Smiling her way through one of her best routines ever, Jill Trenary won her third U.S. Figure Skating championship on Saturday in Salt Lake City.

Trenary even got a perfect 6.0 for style in finishing first with all nine judges in the free skate. She had 14 5.9s altogether in becoming the first woman since Rosalyn Sumners to win three American crowns. Trenary also won in 1987 and last year.

Skating last, Trenary merely needed to stand up to take the gold after her closest pursuers, Kristi Yamaguchi and Tonya Harding, had rough trips over the Salt Palace ice. Yamaguchi wound up second again, while Harding dropped to seventh.

Local favorite Holly Cook of Bountiful, Utah, was fourth in the long program and moved up to third overall. The top three will go to next month's world championships.

Lemieux, who is six games shy of Gretzky's 51-game streak in 1983-84, was held to a second-period assist and Gretzky also had only one assist in the second showdown this season between the NHL's two leading scorers.

Brown had his second three-goal game of the season for Pittsburgh and Luc Robitaille had two goals

for the Kings.

"It was a weird game, but sometimes that's the way it goes ... sometimes you put a couple of big scorers out there and you get these kind of games," said Lemieux, who has 102 points during his streak and 120 for the season.

Gretzky, who had three goals in the Kings' 8-4 victory in Pittsburgh on Oct. 31, thinks Lemieux will break his record — if he scores tonight in Philadelphia.

"If he gets it (the record), that's fine," Gretzky said. "I don't have a problem with anybody breaking my records. I think he'll do it. But I think (today) will be the toughest game of the streak. If he gets by the Flyers, he'll break it, no problem."

The Penguins, rallying in the third period for the second consecutive game, trailed 5-3 but tied it on goals by Brown and Troy Loney in a 39-second span.

With Steve Kasper in the penalty box for interference, Brown scored his 25th of the season at 11:14,

# Wilkins becomes dunking king

MIAMI — Michael Jordan should've stuck to dunking.

Dominique Wilkins did, and he joined Jordan as the only two-time winner of the NBA slam-dunk contest.

Jordan switched to the 3-point shooting contest on All-Star Saturday and matched the lowest-scoring round in the five-year history of the event with five points.

Jordan's teammate, two-time finalist Craig Hodges of the Chicago Bulls, won the 3-point contest after three-time winner Larry Bird also was eliminated in the first round.

"It was good for me to get out and feel that type of competition," said Jordan, the dunk champion in 1987-88. "It's different from dunking. I'd like to come back and try it again. If you don't do well, you want to come back and do better."

Wilkins, who won the slam-dunk title in 1985, outpointed surprise finalist Kenny Smith, 146.8 to 145.1 in the final round. Smith was the more creative dunker, with several off-the-floor, off-the-glass slams, but he couldn't overcome the power of Wilkins, who at 6-foot-8, is five inches taller.

"We were both using our creativity out there," Wilkins said. "People don't realize the degree of difficulty. There's only so many dunks you can do."

Smith received 49.8 points for his second of three dunks in the final round. Smith bounced the ball off the floor and the backboard before reverse dunking.

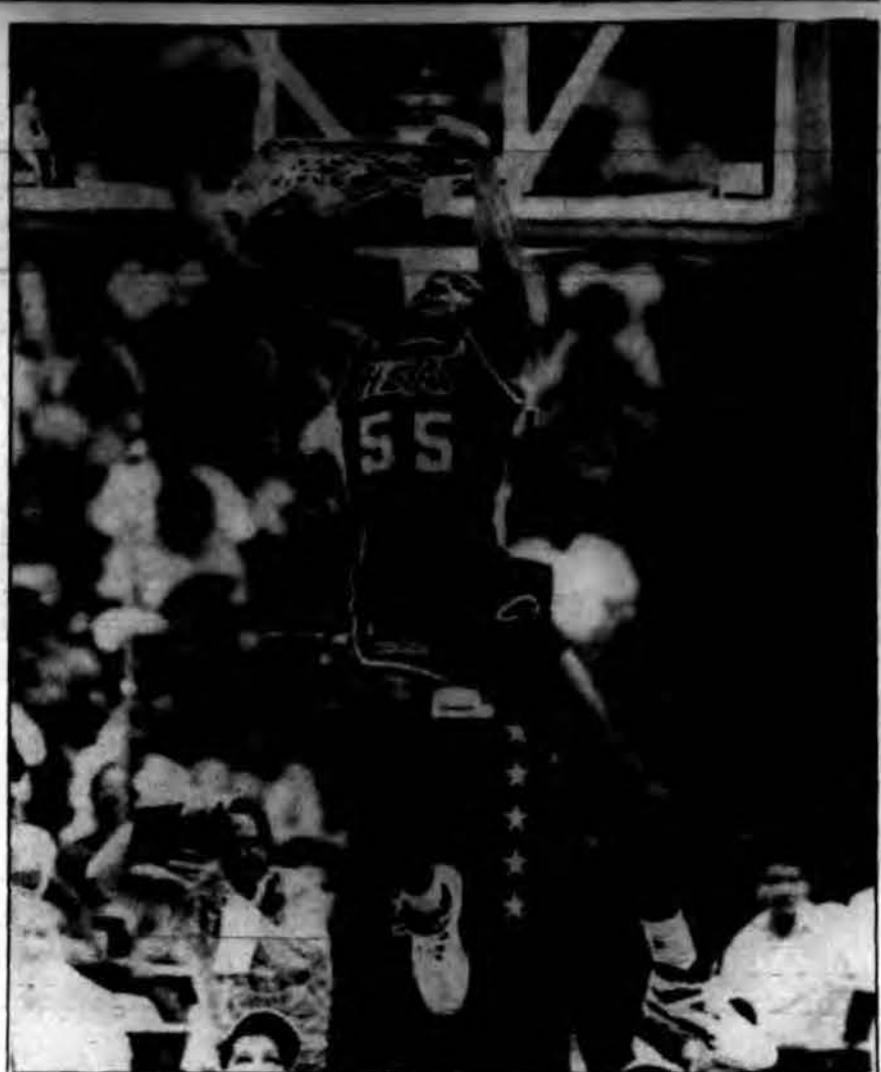
Wilkins, who was going to skip the contest this year until injuries to other entrants allowed him to change his mind, was only .3 behind after scoring a 49.7 with a soaring one-hander.

In the final round, Smith tossed the ball high in the air but lost control before softly dunking it through the net. If he had missed completely, he would've had another chance to try his final dunk.

"It's the only time you get penalized for doing well," Smith said. "I slipped on the takeoff. I had to grab the rim. Unfortunately, it went in."

Wilkins' two-handed dunk in the final round earned 49.2 points, more than enough to pass Smith.

Hodges had 19 points and Reggie Miller of the Indiana Pacers 18 in the 3-point final shootout after

Hodges outpointed Jon Sundvold of Miami 9-7 in a 24-second shootout after they tied in the semifinals.

Hodges, who set a record for a single round in the contest with 25 points in the first round in 1986, lost in the finals to Bird in 1986 and Dale Ellis last year.

Hodges said the music that plays during the event made it difficult to concentrate.

"The music shocks you when you first start shooting," said Hodges, the NBA 3-point percentage leader at 47.7. "My son asked me to get the 3-point trophy after seeing Larry Bird win it, but I told him it wasn't going to be that easy."

Bird, who won the contest in 1986, 1987 and 1988 before missing last year with an injury, had 14 points in the first round and failed to make the semifinals, finishing behind Hodges' 20, Miller's 16 and 15 each by Sundvold and Bob Hansen of Utah.

"I feel like I went to Las Vegas and lost \$20,000," said Bird, who failed to shoot the 25 balls allotted for one minute.

"I couldn't believe I didn't get off all the shots," Bird said. "When the horn went off, and I had balls left, I couldn't believe it. I've never had trouble getting off all the shots before."

Jordan had five points in the first

round, matching the worst round by any player. Detlef Schrempf had five in the 1988 semifinals.

In the Legends Game, Cazzie Russell, who played 12 seasons with the New York Knicks, Golden State, the Los Angeles Lakers and Chicago, hit a baseline jumper with 17 seconds left, giving the East a 37-36 lead that held up when Dave Cowens missed for the West in the final seconds.

"I was supposed to pick and roll, but I don't know what happened to the roll," Russell said. "I just spotted up and hit a baseline jumper."

Russell said that since he is an assistant coach with the Atlanta Hawks, "I can't afford to have a big stomach. I did some running for the game to prevent pulled muscles. You don't want to be embarrassed out there. We have some pride in how we look."

Arizona gets physical to drop UCLA, 83-74

Sean Rooks said he and his Arizona teammates knew, going into their key matchup with UCLA, they had to have an aggressive inside game to stay in the Pacific-10 Conference race.



They did, and paced by Rooks' 24 points and eight rebounds, No. 22 Arizona beat the 19th-ranked Bruins 83-74 Saturday.

With the win, Arizona (16-4, 10-3) moved into second place in the Pac-10, a half-game ahead of the Bruins (16-5, 9-3), and extended its home winning streak to 44 games, the nation's longest.

"We needed to be more active in the middle and hit the boards. We had to take up room and get physical," Rooks said.

"We knew we had to have this game or we would have been knocked out of the Pac-10 race."

Rooks said Arizona lost Jan. 13 at UCLA 73-67 in part because "the big men weren't active and we knew we had to be today."

Don MacLean, who had 26 points and 14 rebounds for UCLA, said, "Their big men didn't come to play at Pauley (Pavilion, UCLA's home court), but they played hard today."

Aizona Coach Lute Olson said, "We knew the key would be our inside strength. The big guys have been making good progress. They're going after it and scrapping to get to it. We're much more aggressive."

Olson said his team had to adjust defensively at halftime to try to slow down MacLean, who scored 17 points in the first 20 minutes.

"We came out with a box-and-one. Then, after we shut him down, we went to a man-to-man for a while and then alternated," Olson said.

MacLean added only nine more points the second half.

UCLA Coach Jim Harrick said, "Jud Buechler boxed and chased MacLean. There aren't too many guys that can do what he (Buechler) can at 6-6."

Arizona committed only four turnovers, tying its record for fewest in a Pac-10 game.

In other Pac-10 games: ■ USC 88, Arizona State 63: Harold Miner scored 22 points, Robert Pack 18 and Ronnie Coleman had nine of his 14 in a decisive 21-4 first-half run as USC romped.

The win snapped a five-game road losing streak for the Trojans, now 8-11 overall and 3-9 in Pacific-10 Conference play.

Arizona State (12-10, 5-8) lost its second straight home game and suffered its most lopsided defeat to USC since 92-60 in 1967.

The Sun Devils, down 7-0 early, took a 12-9 lead 7:52 into the game after six straight points by Alex Austin, who finished with 21.

Coleman then scored the next three baskets on a jumper and two layins to start the 21-4 run for a 30-16 lead 5:3 before halftime.

USC led 39-26 at the half after making 61 percent of its field goals (17 of 28) while the Sun Devils shot just 30 percent (8 of 27).

Trailing 44-28 two minutes into the second half, Arizona State closed to 46-35 on Isaac Austin's layin with 13:53 remaining.

Coleman had a jumper and a three-point play in an 11-0 run to make it 57-35 with 11:01 left.

Miner, who had 16 second-half points, notched four consecutive baskets for a 78-50 Trojan lead with 3:57 to play.

■ California 69, Washington State 51: Keith Smith scored 16 of his 21 points in the second half to lead California to the victory. David Sanders had 14 points and eight rebounds for the Cougars (7-16, 1-12), who have now lost 12 straight games. Freshman Brian Hendrick added 14 points and seven rebounds for the Bears (17-6, 8-4).

Washington State scored the first basket of the second half to take a 31-21 lead. But Hendrick responded by scoring eight straight points to cut the lead to two. Bryant Walton then hit a 3-pointer and the Bears had their first lead of the game.

With starting center David Butler on the bench early with foul trouble, No. 9 UNLV plugged in some little-known talent Saturday to beat Oklahoma State.

Reserve forward Moses Scurry came of the bench to score a career-high 23 points and key two first half streaks as the Runnin' Rebels beat the Cowboys 100-84.

"You learn to expect that from a team loaded with talent," said Oklahoma State Coach Leonard Hamilton. "You can't stop everybody and we couldn't stop him."

Five other UNLV players scored in double figures as the Runnin' Rebels used another balanced attack to win for the fifth straight time.

"They can beat you in a lot of ways," Hamilton said. "It's going to take a team that plays mistake-free basketball to beat this team."

Scurry scored 16 of his points in the first half, including seven in a 10-0 spurt that erased a 20-16 Oklahoma State lead with 13 minutes left in the half and put UNLV ahead for good.

Scurry, a 6-7 senior, also had seven points during a 10-3 spurt late in the first half after the Cowboys had pulled to within three points and Oklahoma State never got

closer.

"It was his best game as a Rebel," UNLV Coach Jerry Tarkanian said. "Moses has really been playing, he's running, he's getting steals, he's getting up."

UNLV (19-4) used pressure defense to hold the Cowboys (13-9) to only one field goal in the first six minutes of the second half.

Elsewhere in the Big West: ■ New Mexico State 66, UC Santa Barbara 64: Rick Fluckey hit a 3-pointer with 21 seconds left and New Mexico State (20-2, 11-1) overcame a 14-point halftime deficit to beat UC Santa Barbara (16-4, 9-4).

The Gauchos had two chances to score in the final 18 seconds, but Lucius Davis' 12-foot jumper off the back run and Carrick DeHart's half-court prayer at the buzzer fell short.

The Aggies posted their first back-to-back 20-win seasons in 20 years, while the loss ended a five-game winning streak for the Gauchos.

The Gauchos led 44-27 with 18 minutes left when the Aggies went on a 15-0 run. Keith Hill's baseline jumper and free throw with 13:51 left capped the run as the Aggies pulled to within 44-42.

■ Pacific 78, Cal State Fullerton 73: Anthony Woods and Dell Demps scored 16 points each to lead Pacific (13-9, 6-7) to the win over the Titans (12-10, 6-7).

Woods scored eight of his game-

"I wanted it for my mother," said the 29-year-old Douglas, whose mother died Jan. 18. "God bless her. I was clearly focused, I came to fight. I fought my fight."

Douglas kept Tyson off balance with short rights to the jaw and left jabs in the first seven rounds. Then suddenly, late in the eighth, it looked like his fine effort would be wiped away by the power of a single Tyson right uppercut.

"I got careless and he hit me with a good shot," Douglas said. "I knew he would come on. He's a champion."

Douglas landed on his back, then struggled up at the count of nine. In the excitement of the moment, it was not clear if the bell had rung before Douglas had got to his feet. Even if it had, the count would have continued since the bell cannot save a knocked-down fighter.

An estimated crowd of 40,000 at the Tokyo Dome was charged with excitement as Tyson came roaring out of his corner in the ninth round, intent on finishing the job.

At the end of the ninth round, the crowd was still abuzz. Now, however, many were sensing an upset. In that ninth round, Douglas closed Tyson's left eye. He backed

him into the ropes with a barrage of at least five punches to the head and hurt him on two or three more occasions during the round.

Then, just past the minute mark of the 10th round, Iron Mike became the tin man. Douglas hurt him badly with a right uppercut, and then knocked him down with the left and right.

At the time of the knockout, the three judges had scored like this: Larry Rozadilla, Douglas leading 88-82; Ken Morita, Tyson ahead 87-86; and Masakazu Uchida, 86-86.

The Associated Press had Douglas leading 85-84.

"Him being the champion, I knew it would be difficult for me to get the decision," Douglas said.

Tyson left the dome without speaking to the media. "I saw them putting the belt on other guys," Douglas said, recalling his spotty past. "I said one day it's going to be me. Thank God it's now."

At 1:23 of the 10th round referee Octavio Meyrom tolled 10 and Douglas was the new heavyweight champion.

Now he will replace Tyson against Holyfield June 18 at Atlantic City, N.J.

Holyfield was at ringside and his immediate reaction was that he didn't care who he fought as long as he fought for the title.

Disbelief initial reaction from Douglas' neighbors

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — Everybody talked about it, but nobody believed it was possible: Columbus native James "Buster" Douglas fighting — and beating — heavyweight champion Mike Tyson seemed all but impossible.

So when Douglas knocked Tyson out in the 10th round today to capture the heavyweight championship, the initial reaction was mostly disbelief.

"We managed to get a Japanese feed on one of our satellites, but it was real snowy, and the announcers were speaking Japanese, so we had it on a little TV upstairs for whoever wanted to watch it," said Scott Dye, bartender at The Scoreboard Lounge, a sports bar.

"The vast majority were paying attention to the slam dunk competition at the NBA All-Star Game on the big screens. But everybody went nuts when the word came on our sports ticker."

"What an upset. The biggest upset in boxing history. It's not too often you get a heavyweight champion from Columbus, Ohio, but you've got one now, and an Indy 500

winner (Bobby Rahal), and don't forget Jack Nicklaus.

"I don't know if we're going to do anything special about this, but there'll be a lot of partying tonight, and a big parade. I'm sure," Dye said.

Douglas, who had dedicated the fight to the memory of his mother, knocked out the seemingly invincible Tyson with a left-right-left combination to the head that dropped Tyson in a heap in Douglas's corner.

Douglas had narrowly escaped defeat when he struggled up at nine from a one-punch knockdown late in the eighth round.

A man who answered the telephone late Saturday night at the Don King Training Camp in Orwell, Ohio, where Tyson regularly works out, said a group watched the fight there.

The man refused to give his name or put anyone else on the phone. His only comment was, "No, I'm not upset. This is just one fight. Anyone can lose one fight. It doesn't mean he's not a champion. We have a lot of champions here."

# Give peace dividend to people

NEW YORK (AP) — There is no peace dividend yet and there may never be one, but proposals for spending it already are being offered by individuals and groups with a cause.

Now comes an original one: Don't spend it. Give it back to the people.

The proposals to spend the dividend, some say, are examples of the urgency with which advocates, activists, elected officials and supporters of big government promote private agendas at the public's expense.

As imagined, the peace dividend would result from a quick cutback in the United States defense budget as world tensions ease, freeing billions of dollars for use elsewhere.

But it will never exist, says economist Stuart Butler, "so long as Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union remain in turmoil and so long as there is no consensus in the United States regarding future defense needs."

In spite of this, Butler and his Heritage Foundation colleagues said they found advocates of various programs already holding news conferences to propose ways in which to spend the money. Therefore, they offer theirs.

Butler, director of domestic policy studies at Heritage, a conservative think tank, proposes 11

- tax cuts totaling more than \$107 billion a year in relief. Each member of Congress was scheduled to receive a copy this week:
- Reduce the tax burden on the elderly by eliminating the Social Security earnings test.
- Currently, Americans between ages 65 and 69 who earn more than \$9,360 are required to give up \$1 in Social Security benefits for every \$3 they earn.
- This is an effective 33 percent tax on earnings, on top of all the other federal, state and local taxes that are deducted," according to the paper. The effect, it says, is to drive such people out of the work force.
- Index the Social Security benefits tax for inflation.
- Roll back Social Security payroll taxes and return Social Security to pay-as-you-go financing. This is the proposal already put forth by Sen. Daniel Moynihan, D-N.Y.
- Increase the personal income tax exemption to \$6,300 for each child under 18 years of age, from its current level of \$2,000.
- Commentary: If the tax burden on families were reduced, "most families could meet their children's needs according to their own priorities and would not need new government programs."
- Provide tax credits to households to cover medical expenses and health insurance

- premiums.
- Provide tax incentives for the purchase of long-term care insurance.
- Designate 100 federal enterprise zones to spur economic development in the inner cities.
- Reduce the capital gains tax.
- Expand the Earned Income Tax Credit, or EITC.
- The EITC is a tax credit for low-income workers with children. Butler and staff maintain that when combined with other welfare programs, an expanded EITC might lift a single mother from poverty even if she earned the minimum wage.
- Provide a toddler tax credit.
- The Heritage Foundation says the current child-care crisis, as it is sometimes termed, could be solved by giving money directly to parents so they could determine how best to care for their children.
- Restore IRA eligibility to all individuals.
- The 1986 Tax Reform Act sharply curtailed the number of people who could qualify for Individual Retirement Accounts, in which savings accumulate free of taxes.
- Says Butler: Remind your representatives in Congress that dividends are normally paid to investors (the people) not kept by the corporation (Congress).

LONG BEACH — McDonnell Douglas announced Saturday it has awarded \$21.6 million in contracts to four companies, including one local firm, for production of wing components for the C-17 airlifter.

The companies are Beechcraft Corp. of Wichita, Kan., for the winglets; California Contour Industries of Brea, for spar caps and stringers; Kaman Aerospace Corp. of Bloomfield, Conn., for ribs and bulkheads; and Reynolds Metals Co. of McCook, Ill., for wing skins.

CHICAGO (AP) — Top executives who feel badly about not knowing good grammar, irregardless of their education or rank, can learn the basics from a group that teaches the ABC's of grammar to corporate America.

Anyone who thinks that sentence reads right is a good candidate for The Grammar Group, whose founder says "feel badly" and "irregardless" are among the top 10 grammatical errors in written business communication.

"Most business letters and memos probably have at least one grammatical or punctuation error," Zacharias Rosner, the group's founder and owner, said Tuesday.

Mistakes often are made not by the secretaries who type the memos but by the company heads who write them — and that hurts a company's image, Rosner said in a telephone interview.

Even heads of state make mistakes. A letter from former President Reagan to business executives he had worked with is used to illustrate that fact in courses Rosner's group teaches to companies like Ford Motor Co., AT&T and Amoco Corp.

"It's a letter written by someone on his staff but he signed it," Rosner said.

"The president starts off, 'I wanted to tell you how much I appreciated the help you gave ...' The implication is he doesn't want it anymore and doesn't appreciate it anymore," Rosner said.

Rosner said his courses are for educated people who "haven't been taught correct usage of the language."

"They're the people who are speaking for the company and they're the ones whose words matter," said Rosner, whose Chicago-based group teaches grammar to between 7,000 and 10,000 people a year.

"My whole job is writing. I can't think that class enough. I even correct my boss at times," said Jerry Pompa, an organizational planning analyst in Detroit for Ford, the group's largest client.

Roy Leinweber, president of Gannett-Outdoor Co. of Michigan, is another ex-student. His outdoor

advertising company had two seminars with the group.

"It started out with the secretaries on grammar questions and eventually we brought all our office people in, sales people and department managers," said Leinweber.

"It was very effective. I think our sales proposals are better, our correspondence is better," he said.

What did Leinweber learn from the course? "It was a refresher," was all he'd admit to.

"It's really a back-to-basics type of program, all the things you never learned or forgot," said assistant personnel manager Vicki Cohen at the Chicago office of Alexander & Alexander Inc., an international insurance brokerage. She and several managers there took the course.

"People also found out that there's no such word as irregardless," she said.

Grammar Group's instructors — 10 former public school teachers — instill such easy-to-learn rules as:

"feel badly" should be "feel bad," unless you mean you're feeling with your fingers or feet.

Rosner, 54, formed the company in 1979 after giving a party at which several fellow English teachers tested each other on basic grammar and failed.

Rosner, who taught in New York and New Jersey public schools, said he realized "there must be a need out there for a service that teaches the basics of language to literate people in an upbeat way."

For the first five years, Rosner was his only employee, teaching grammar to businesses in his spare time. As he attracted more clients, Rosner moved to Chicago to make the business a full-time job.

The group has over 90 clients, many of them Fortune 500 companies. Clients pay \$4,950 for 12 hours of instruction to groups of up to 25 employees.

"Last year, The Grammar Group had our first \$1 million in sales," Rosner boasts.

## Grammarians teach ABC's to executives

### Workers fight to keep their shipyard open

LOS ANGELES — Los Angeles City Councilman Robert Farrell Saturday sided with workers at the Long Beach Naval Shipyard, who want Defense Secretary Richard Cheney to reconsider closing the facility.

Even if it is closed, Farrell said, the change could be effected slowly, possibly as part of a transition to private ownership of the 4,100-worker shipyard.

"How do we prepare for the dislocation that comes when government, as a major employer, makes a decision to divest itself?" he asked.

Flanked by representatives of the Metal Trades Council, the International Federation of Professional and Technical Engineers and the American Federation of Government Employees, Farrell introduced a motion to make a formal request to the federal government to keep the shipyard open.

### Milken, Drexel Burnham defendants in S&L suit

LOS ANGELES — Lawyers in a shareholders' civil lawsuit against Lincoln Savings chief Charles H. Keating Jr. have added Drexel Burnham Lambert and junk bond pioneer Michael Milken as defendants, an attorney said Saturday.

William Lerach, a lawyer for the plaintiffs in the federal class-action suit, said Milken and Drexel aided Keating and others involved in the Lincoln Savings and Loan collapse in perpetrating securities fraud.

The shareholder suit charges Keating and other officers of Lincoln's parent company, American Continental Corp., with conspiring to inflate ACC's stock price by false and misleading public statements and financial filings.

Lerach said Drexel and Milken helped facilitate a series of improper real estate and securities transactions between ACC and what Lerach called the "Drexel daisy chain," a network of companies and individuals that provided Drexel both a market for and a source of high-yield, low-grade "junk" bonds.

The transactions "helped to improperly inflate ACC's reported income," he said.

Milken's spokesman Ken Lerer and Drexel spokesman Steven Anreder both said they hadn't seen the suit and could not comment on it.

Lawrence Cox, a lawyer representing Keating and his son in the shareholder action, said he could not respond in detail to the new charges since he had not seen the amended complaint.

"It's interesting that they're trying to enhance the facial appeal of their case by naming Drexel and Milken," he said.

Keating and the other defendants have denied the charge that they tried to inflate stock prices, he said. "It's our position that the financial statements the stock price were based on were accurate and used generally accepted accounting principles."

"Relating" was far simpler in 1940, when Bill and Denny Markas first met. Dr. Michael Gonzales, human sexuality teacher at UCI, spends a good deal of time studying the attributes of successful relationships.

Yet, the 1990s, offer a great deal of hope to single people as well as married folks, according to Dr. Gonzales. "We've discovered over the past decades what doesn't work. And this hard-won knowledge is leading the way to far healthier and lasting relationships."

What is being left behind is the belief that singleness, doing one's own thing, and life in the fast lane equal freedom.

"I'm a perfect example of this trend toward a more conservative approach to coupling," explains Kathy Evans, a 32-year-old executive secretary. "The party life and short-term relationships just don't hold much appeal anymore."

Still, looking for love, avoiding the pitfalls of one-night stands, and rethinking casual sex are not easy tasks for today's singles.

"I've all but given up on dating," declares Mike Ray, 37, of Huntington Beach. "Seems that the rules keep changing and I find

meeting 'her' to be discouraging at best."

Dr. Gonzales has created a blueprint for singles like Evans and Ray who are leaving the free and easy 1980s, embarking on the far more conservative decade of the '90s.

"Before an individual considers dating," outlines Dr. Gonzales, "it is wise to take time to be introspective. Through reading, classes, therapy or spending quiet time thinking and writing, a person needs to define his or her values on a mental, physical, emotional, spiritual and financial level."

Men in particular are guilty of being out of touch with themselves, and consequently present an image of who they think a woman wants them to be.

"This proves to be disastrous after the initial few weeks of dating," continues Dr. Gonzales. "When the man relaxes and becomes himself, there is a lot of confusion and usually the relationship ends."

To avoid this problem, Dr. Gonzales encourages individuals to ask themselves about their likes and dislikes, short- and long-term personal goals, and how a mate would fit into one's present life-style.

Following this inward look comes a time of action.

"If a woman values health and appearance, yet finds herself night after night in front of the

When it comes to writers, Orange County is the most romantic spot in the nation.

In case you doubt that, consider this: The Orange County Chapter of the Romance Writers of America is the largest in the country. Among its 326 members are the names of 82 published romance novelists — as well as 72 authors published in other genres. Every one of them not only believes in happy endings, but is committed to working hard to make dreams come true.

Besides its remarkable success at nurturing and launching fledgling



writers, the chapter provides ongoing support for veteran writers and maintains an extensive list of members who are much-sought-after speakers throughout the country.

The burgeoning group, which began just nine years ago, rapidly outgrew various meeting places before coming upon its present site at the Fullerton Public Library (353 W. Commonwealth in Fullerton), where its meetings are held on the first Saturday of every month.

Meetings start at 10 a.m. with a pre-meeting workshop, conducted primarily for unpublished authors. Concurrently, a publish-

ed author's workshop addresses concerns of its veteran authors. The published authors are presently developing an advocacy group to educate writers about contract negotiations, the pros and cons of pseudonyms, misleading book covers, and other relevant issues.

Both workshops are followed by lunch (an opportunity for the general membership to network), a brief business meeting, and a guest speaker with special expertise who is not a member of the group. January's speaker, Kathy Fair (assistant to the director of television movies at CBS),

gave a practical talk about how to sell a book to TV networks.  
The group maintains its own lending library of paperbacks, sells tapes of workshops, provides the latest tip sheets, and sends out a monthly newsletter that covers market news, conferences and classes, and announces its members' current releases (four in January, five in February).  
It is a dynamic organization, with about 150 members attending each meeting to keep in touch with the market and to celebrate their victories. They present red roses to authors who publish a novel-length romance, and white roses to members who publish in any other field.  
The group encourages its members to enter national contests such as the national organization's Golden Medallion (best published novel) and Golden Heart (best unpublished novel) Awards. The chapter runs its own contest for non-published authors and supplies judges, who are published writers, to all of the contests.  
According to Gini Wilson, regional adviser for Romance Writer's of America, judging is a herculean feat, with as many as 1,440 entries on the national level. The local contest alone draws more than 200 entries annually.  
"It's important to understand the scope of this organization," said Wilson. "We are not a club. We are

a literary association which supports writers in their endeavors to publish or to republish."  
According to Wilson, Romance Writers of America (which is celebrating its 10th anniversary this year) is based in Houston, Texas. The Orange County Chapter is part of Region 6, which covers California, Nevada, Arizona, Hawaii, New Zealand, Australasia and Guam. The organization has more than 4,000 members worldwide, but the Orange County Chapter is — by far — its largest and most active.  
In spite of its size, the organization has an extensive outreach program and strives to maintain a personal approach. The local chapter has a Mentor Program that pairs expert novelists with proteges. At a recent meeting, Barbara Joel was presented a red rose by her mentor, Jill Marie Landis.  
According to Joel, unpublished members who have completed three chapters of a novel are eligible for the Mentor Program.  
"In the two years I worked with Jill by mail and phone, she became more than a teacher and mentor, she's a real friend, who supported and encouraged me constantly — because there's so much more to writing than just putting down words on paper."  
Landis's historical novels have won both the Golden Heart and the Golden Medallion awards. Joel's first novel (a contemporary romance) is due out later this year.

Rita Rainville — another award winning author, whose contemporary romances are deftly spiked with humor — has published 15 successful novels in the past six years. Yet besides serving as secretary for local group, Rainville manages to find time to stay active in her community's Literacy Program, where she matches up tutors with adults who want to learn to read.  
Many of the chapter's established writers help beginning writers outside of the organizations. Although some of their members were English majors in college (a few hold advance degrees), many romance authors began as readers, who decided to try their hand at writing and went on to take classes to learn the craft.  
Some started without training, but found their odds of success were small, since dramatic storytelling is far more complex than it initially appears and readers are growing increasingly more discriminating. Developing well rounded characters, intriguing situations, and realistic dialogue is a major accomplishment for fiction writers regardless of genre.  
Members are committed to upgrading their image as writers and work hard at their craft. To help successful writers — who are also gifted teachers — offer courses.  
Maralys Wills, a past president of the Orange County Chapter who is active in the published authors'

workshop, has published four fiction and two non-fiction books and is currently working on a techno-thriller. For the past six years, Wills has conducted workshops through Orange Coast College.  
Her latest class, "Helping Unpublished Writer Get Published," meets from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m. on Wednesdays at Costa Mesa High School, Room 204. It's a practical course for fiction writers regardless of genre. It includes hands-on critiques of students' works-in-progress, tips on plot, characterization, beginnings and endings, avoiding common mistakes, and an emphasis on attitudes that lead to success.  
According to Gini Wilson, Regional Adviser for Romance Writer's of America, "The members of OCRWA are constantly sharing their expertise — all over the country. They have the greatest roster of speakers and are in very high demand for meetings and conferences."  
Wilson says the reason for the chapter's incredible success is based upon the generosity of its members.  
"It's members are constantly training what outsiders may perceive as competitors, but our authors just don't look at it that way. Instead of thinking 'Why should I help someone get started who is going after my job,' they take the attitude that 'Success breeds success.' What's great about it, is that it works."

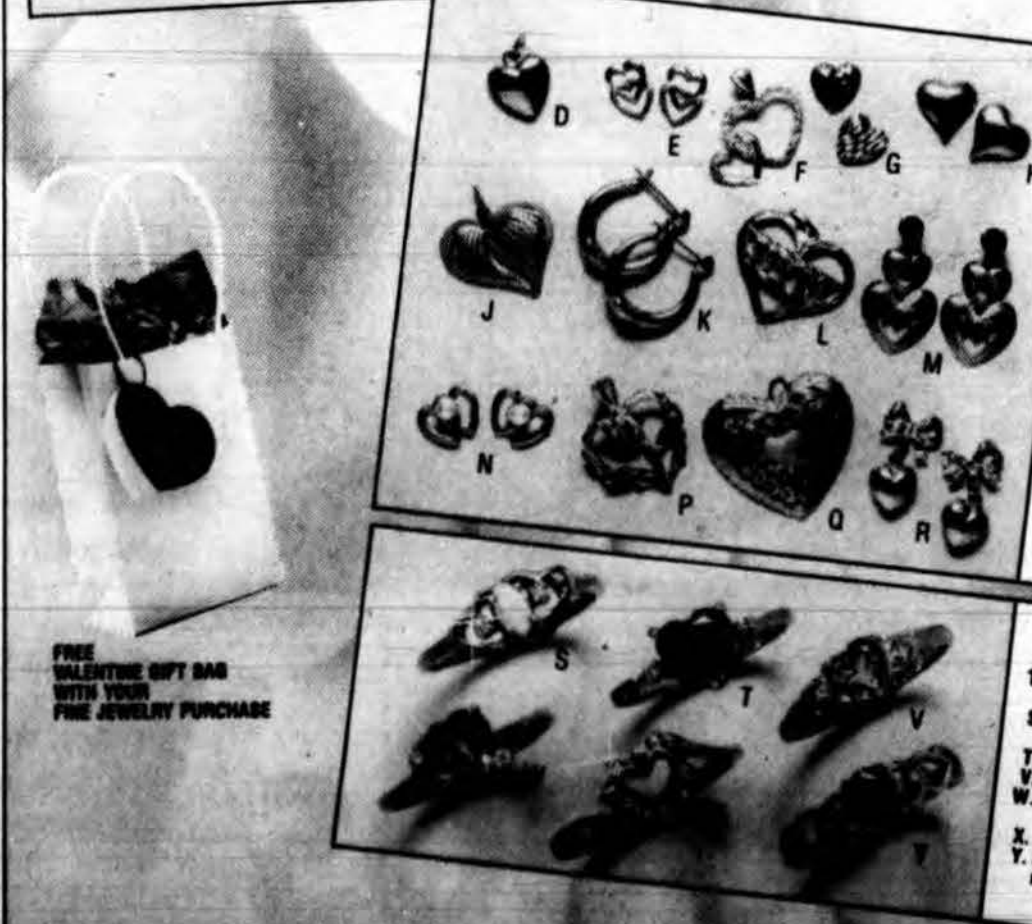

television, she must make some changes," says Dr. Gonzales. "If a man smokes, but refuses to date a woman who does the same, he needs to make the appropriate change in his own life."  
In essence, the individual works to become the very best person possible — for oneself. Says Dr. Gonzales: "It is important that men and women strive for personal excellence — not to find someone to couple with — but to satisfy the natural desire to feel good within oneself."  
And then something magical happens, according to Dr. Gonzales. "When people set boundaries for themselves in terms of health, sexual practices, basic lifestyle, and so on; when they participate in activities outside of work and home; and when they willingly reach out to others in social situations — people are drawn to them as never before."  
"Looking for love becomes unnecessary. Love comes looking for the person who has gone to the trouble to invest time and energy into himself or herself. There is a big

difference between the individual who is out there 'searching' and the one who is simply enjoying life to its fullest — and more often than not, attracting that special someone."  
In his classes at UCI and private practice alike, Dr. Gonzales has found that his approach to "love and sex" works as well for those already involved in relationships as for the single adult.  
"There is a very obvious shift in the attitude of couples that come in for counseling," reports Dr. Gonzales. "They are no longer looking for a way out of the relationship — assuming the grass to be greener somewhere else. Couples now tend to look for ways to stay together."  
Like Bill and Denny Markas, Dr. Gonzales believes that lasting relationships are built on old-fashioned values.  
"Instead of looking to society and the times to determine how we should think and act," concludes Gonzales, "we can find comfort in principals of being and living that don't change — that are as eternal as love in all its forms. Perhaps that is our greatest hope for the single, couple, and family of the 1990s."

We are indebted to a reader, D. Bruce Graff of San Jose, Calif., for this hand from a recent Swiss Team event. It illustrates an oft-stated principle: Don't put all your eggs in one basket. See if some other lie of the cards won't deliver your contract.

Four hearts is a perfectly normal contract, reached here after a Stayman sequence. Three no trump, difficult to reach, would have made as the cards lie.

West got the defense off to an excellent start with a trump lead. With one club and two diamond

losers, four hearts needed a good dollop of luck—declarer was going to have to bring in the spade suit without losing a trick.

The most likely combinations involve a winning finesse and a 3-3 break, or else a successful finesse and a 4-2 spade split, which permits the fourth spade to be ruffed as long as the hand short in spades holds no more than two trumps.

Once you have worked that out your line of play becomes obvious. Since you still have some chance if the spade finesse loses (you might be able to discard a diamond from dummy on the fourth spade and ruff a diamond on some distribution), you should lead a spade to the jack at trick two. If that wins draw a second round of trumps, cash the ace of spades and continue with a spade to the king.

If spades are 3-3, draw the last trump and claim your contract. If they are 4-2 and the distribution is as in the diagram, West cannot ruff the king of spades, so ruff your last spade for the 10th trick.

VIDEO

Indy's back again, this time on videocassette

Here are short reviews of some movies recently releases on videocassette:

"Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade" 1989, 127 minutes, PG-13. Paramount Home Video, \$24.95.

It may look like an Indiana Jones adventure, talk like an Indiana Jones adventure, and walk like an Indiana Jones adventure, but "Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade" is actually "Field of Dreams" disguised as a two-fisted action flick. Deep down, it's a great big teddy bear — a male sooper about a neglectful father and his resentful son finally Making Peace.

and although it is often in conflict with itself, you have to hand it to director Steven Spielberg and executive producer George Lucas, who were in the unenviable position of competing with themselves. Instead of trying to top their two previous films, they go with their patented sure-fire action formula, even trudging out Nazis again as the villains. The "plot line" — a bunch of action sequences, one unraveling into the next in rhythmically charged succession — is familiar and even predictable. The difference is the familial relationship at the center.

It's impressive, but I don't want to make any exaggerated claims for this movie, because "Indiana Jones and

the Last Crusade" never achieves full greatness. It plays around a little with motivation, that's all.

The more literal-minded among us probably will view it as being about a mad rush for the Holy Grail in and out of secret chambers and caverns, when it's really about Indy in pursuit of his father. When they meet up and join forces for a common goal, they, well, rediscover, one another.

Sean Connery, who plays Indy's father — Professor Henry Jones — plays him as a recognizable figure: He's a great man who's also a bad father, and Connery gives him a slightly twerpish air. The character actually has a little depth.

What's odd, however, is that "Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade" is exactly like its two predecessors. Like them, the enjoyment is only in the watching; there's nothing to chew on afterward. It's still a movie of boys'-book exuberance, adolescent fantasies, and primal cinema, which is fine. It's still '80s pulp material done with natty '80s craftsmanship, which is also fine. But the feeling of freshness — of discovering something new — is gone. And the movie is a little too preening, a little too self-conscious of its own effects and of its status.

But then this is a movie by the two leading forces behind post-literate cinema. Lucas and Spielberg are reliving the shows they loved as kids. They're like Citizen Kane, the man whose most powerful image in his life was a boyhood sled; they intricately reproduce their childhood adventure films, but without ever articulating exactly what it is about the genre that fascinates them.

I recommend it wholeheartedly, if only half-headedly.

Visually, "UHF" is high camp. It's a tapestry of oddball characters, lead by Kevin McCarthy as the sleazeball owner of Channel 62's cross-town rival. But the jokes wear thin almost before they're delivered, and the plot is so predictable as to be a parody of itself. The result is a video that'll make you smile more often than not, but leaves only the

faintest residue of entertainment. — By Mike Pearson

"Slipstream" M.C.E.G./Virgin. VHS-Beta, 92 min.

The future isn't what it used to be in "Slipstream," a bleak tale of life in the 21st century where a tenuous line divides good from evil. But that very pseudo-apocalyptic tone serves this video well, despite a lot of incongruities in a plot about two law officers (Mark Hamill, Kitty Aldridge) in pursuit of an android (Bob Peck) who murdered his master.

Set in an era when the Earth has revolted against man — creating a barren, wind-swept landscape — the video offers a "Road Warriors" setting for what is basically a formula western.

When the law officers take android Byron into custody and proceed back to the settlement, where he'll be hanged, a bounty

hunter (Bill Paxton) intercepts the trio and rescues Byron so that he can claim the reward. With the cops in hot pursuit, he crosses the countryside aboard his flimsy aircraft encountering two shadowy civilizations not known to have existed since the end of the planetary war.

The plot gets a bit redundant and there's no clear definition of just who the protagonist and antagonists are. The roles are ever shifting. But the video boasts superb special effects by two-time Oscar winner Brian Johnson, and there is some splendid interplay between the roguish Paxton and the devilishly proper Peck. Indeed, the latter adds a delightful human dimension to androidism.

But enjoying "Slipstream" means sticking with it through the slow spots. If you've got the patience, it delivers the goods.

With all the vigor and whimsy of a youngster and the wit and wisdom of an 85-year-old, Dr. Seuss has created yet another amazing world of words and pictures in "Oh, the Places You'll Go!" (Random House, \$13.99, all ages).

No one would fault this giant in children's literature if he were to rest on his substantial laurels, but he doesn't. Nor does he muss a beat in his new book. If anything, it's his best yet.

Unlike his works that aim at a specific audience, such as his 1986 best-seller "You're Only Old Once," his new work talks to people of all ages and stages of life, youngsters just starting out and adults coping with life's successes and failures.

You have brains in your head.  
You have feet in your shoes.  
You can steer yourself  
Any direction you choose.

Couched in his trademark of playful rhymes, invented words and spunky images, Seuss offers some sage advice about making choices, about succeeding and failing:

I'm sorry to say so  
But sadly it's true  
That bang-ups  
And hang-ups  
Can happen to you.

About depression (being in a slump) and climbing out (un-slumping). About confusion as to which way to turn. About all the fun that's to be done. About being alone:

All alone!  
Whether you like it or not,  
Alone will be something  
You'll be quite a lot.

Loaded with color, especially canary yellow, mauve and pale blue-green, Seuss's simple line drawings delight with fantasy, at once comforting in their similarity to his earlier works and vigorous in their freshness.

No Seuss fan will want to miss this sparkling gem.

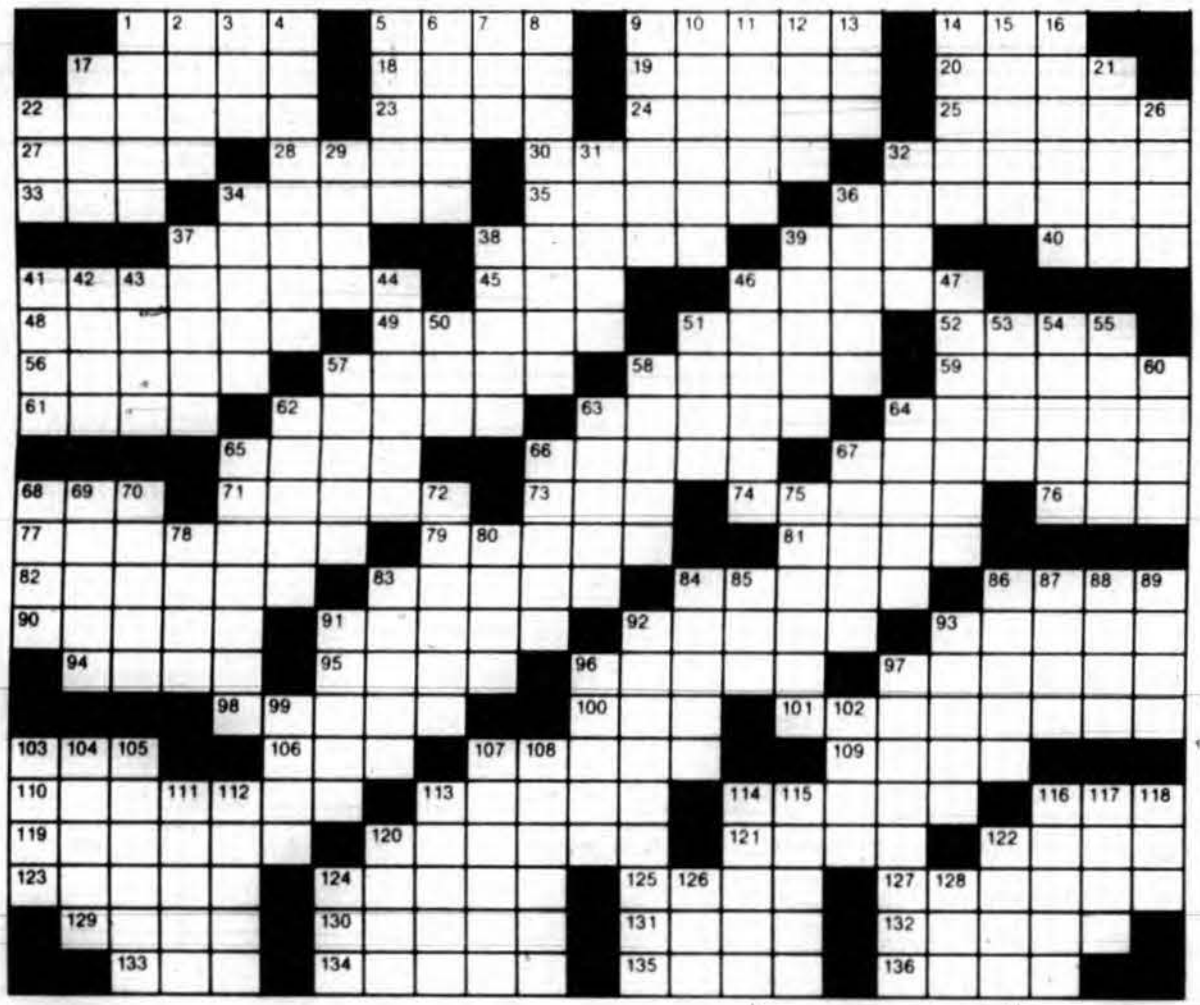

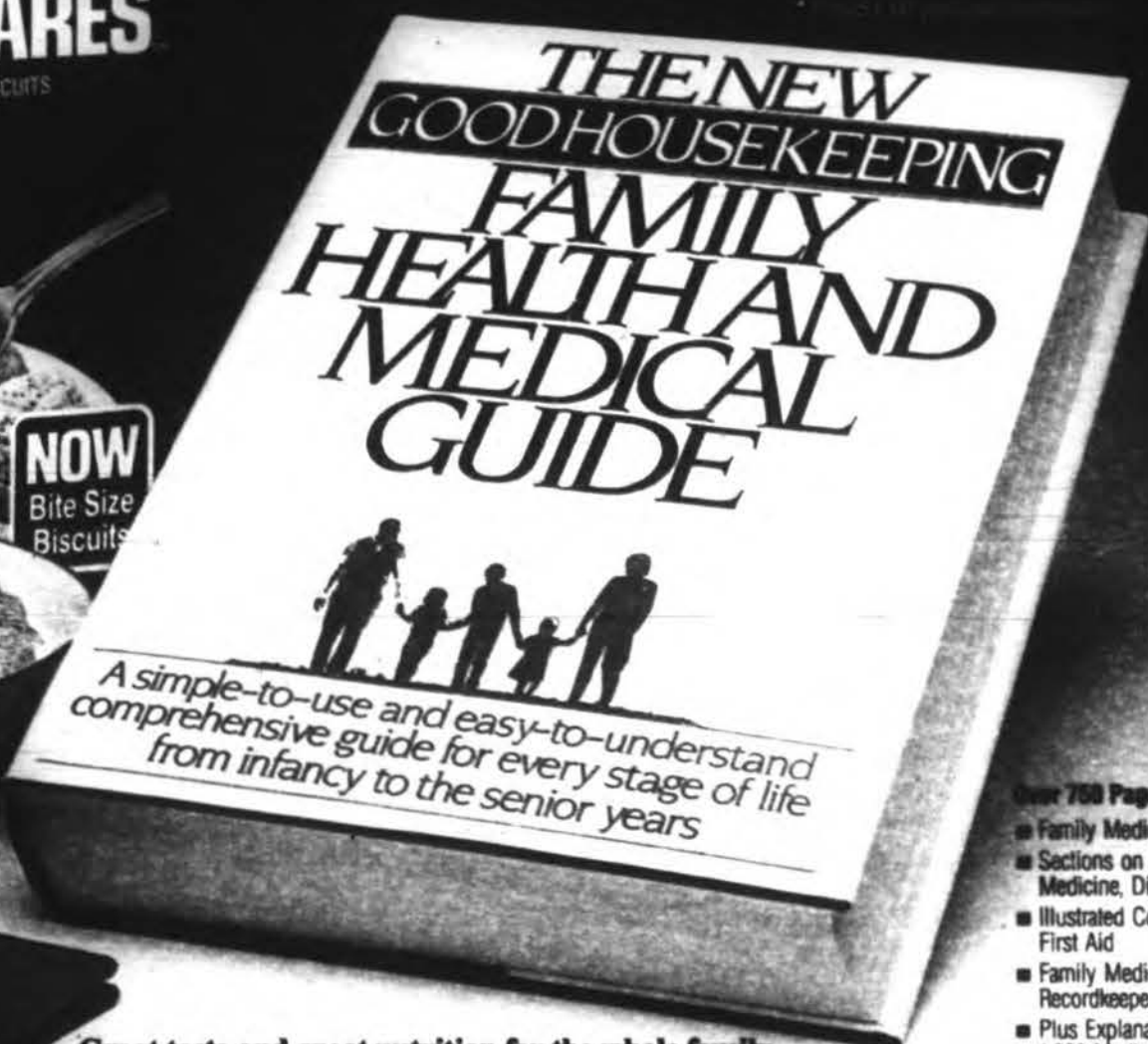

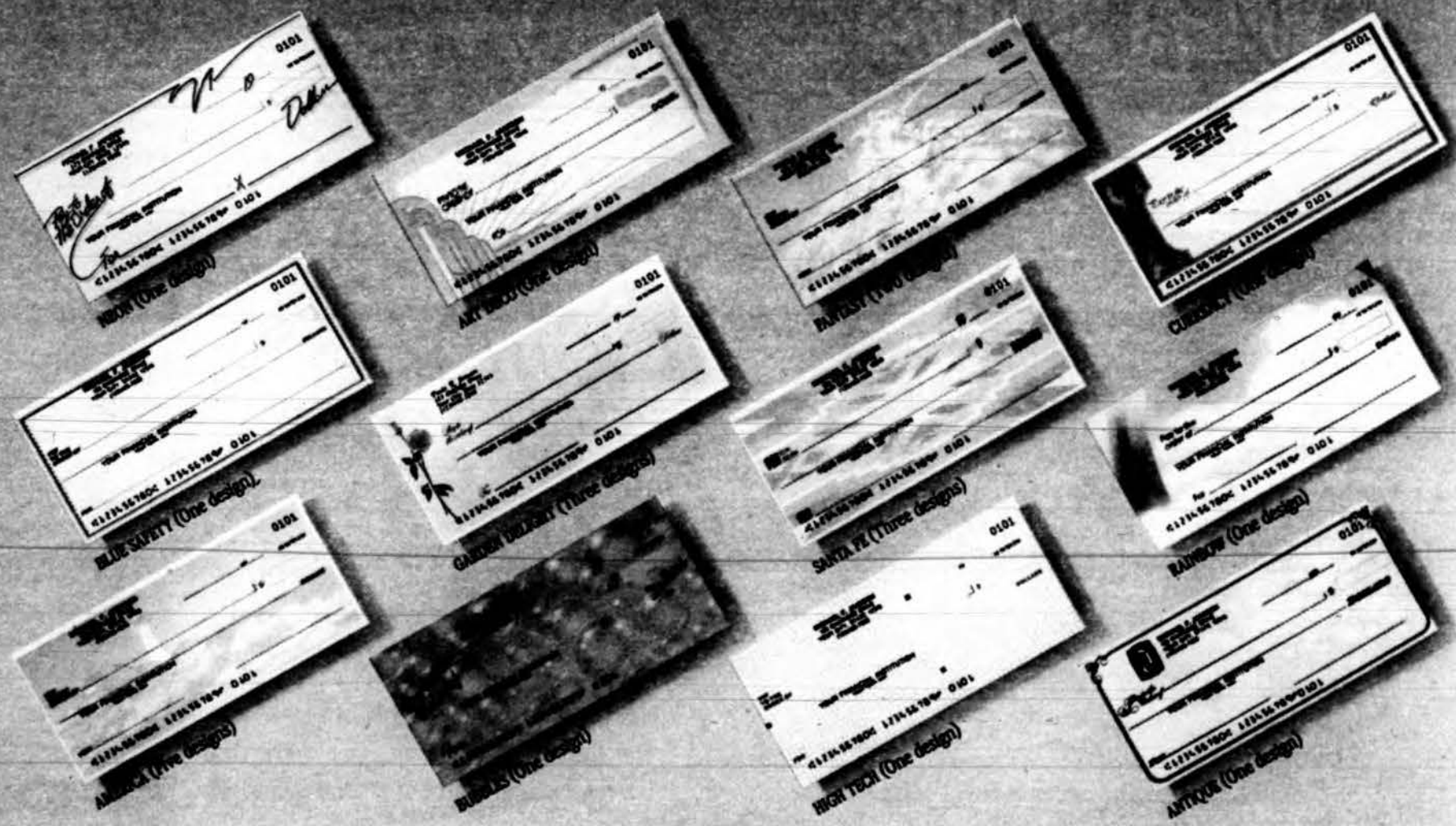
