

## School changes could mean hectic schedules

■ With plans to open Rea and Davis as fifth- and sixth-grade campuses in the fall, some families will have children attending two schools.

NEWPORT-MESA — In the wake of last week's decision to open Rea and Davis Adult Education centers as fifth- and sixth-grade schools in the fall, parents and administrators are bracing for a chaotic academic year, adjusting

to new carpool routes and hiring teachers and support staff.

Though it will relieve overcrowding while trustees search for permanent school housing, the decision to reopen the two centers as satellite campuses for older, elementary-level students from six Costa Mesa schools may still spell a hassle when it

comes to logistics.

"There's a lot of logistical issues to be addressed," said Laura Yourex, parent of a soon-to-be sixth-grader at Davis and a past-PTA president of Sonora Elementary School. "I'm not worried because I live [nearby]. ... But most of us do take our children to school [by car] or walk them to school. We're going to have to learn to carpool."

Basic questions about the switch remain unanswered. Killybrooke Elementary School

Principal Ned Hall said most parents seemed less than satisfied with the plans for some 125 students to start at Davis. But he said he's had several "calls about when school hours are — that's the biggest concern [parents] have."

Paularino Elementary School Principal Brooke Booth, who will see just under 200 of her fifth- and sixth-graders start at Davis this fall, noted "there are questions [from parents] about who the staff will be."

For his part, Pomona Elementary School Principal Kenneth Kilian has seen few people upset about the decision to send about 100 of his fifth-graders to the Rea facility.

"I think parents feel a little more comfortable [because] the older students are going to the new location," he said, adding that Rea's location only a half-block away makes it "more like an extension campus."

Whittier Elementary School parent Eva Marin is resigned to

the fact that she will have to add another school to her list when her son starts at Rea in the fall. Whittier will have a dramatic change in enrollment, with some 250 fewer students on campus.

"Having four kids and having them all at different schools, it doesn't faze me," said Marin, a Costa Mesa resident who was also on the committee that studied the issue of student housing. "It's the lesser of two evils. That'd be great, if we have [children] all together at one school."

So that was my state of mind when I met Hank Panian and Dana Haynes. Panian, the board veteran, is an American history

## A positive CAT-ASTROPHE

Children of Minorca Drive neighborhood sign petition asking for speed bump or stop sign after pet is killed by speeding car

COSTA MESA — Nine-year-old Monica Conlon's cat, Oscar, hadn't come close to living all of his nine lives when a speeding car ran him down last weekend on Minorca Drive.

Oscar was just a kitten when he was given to Monica for her fifth birthday, two years ago. Her mom doesn't want her to have another cat unless the city installs

speed bumps or a stop sign to slow drivers down.

"Everybody cried," said Monica in a quiet voice.

Tears fell from the eyes of both children and parents in the neighborhood when they learned of the accident that claimed the life of their half Siamese, beige feline friend with the big blue eyes.

"He was everybody's cat," Monica's mother, Lois, said. "He went to everybody's house and ate everybody's food."

Lois Conlon said neighbors are now urging the city to place a stop sign at the corner of Andros Street and Minorca Drive to slow drivers down.

A petition circulated in the neighborhood will be given to traffic manager Peter Naghavi along with a petition signed by the neighborhood children.

The three children who witnessed the cat's death were pretty shook up, said Yasha Zimmer, whose son, Timmy, wrote the petition and got neighborhood children to sign it.

"We really need speed bumps," said Timmy, who remembers every detail of the accident that day. "We don't want anyone to get hurt or anything."

The accident has brought neighbors together; some fear one of their children could be next. A year ago, neighbors urged the city to paint 25 mph on the pavement along Minorca Drive, but it did little to slow motorists down.

Neighborhood children poked yellow and white flowers and an American flag into the edge of the curb, nearby where the cat was killed. They placed half a dozen signs on either side of the street pleading with motorists to slow down. The temporary signs appear to be working for now.

Amanda Chester was one of three children who witnessed the accident and later helped put up the signs.

"We did it so that people will slow down," said Amanda, 9. "So that the cars won't hit the kids."

## Newport weighs idea of auto mall

■ Officials look for ways to compete for sales revenue with neighboring cities.

NEWPORT BEACH — When it comes to revenue-producing businesses in the John Wayne Airport area, Newport Beach just doesn't measure up to neighboring Irvine.

So a committee is now weighing the city's options — including creating an auto mall, attracting bigger businesses and putting car rental agencies in one central location.

The city's Economic Development Committee has been scrutinizing the airport area for more than a year but recently hired a consultant to study the problem. The businesses around Campus Drive, MacArthur Boulevard, Birch Street and Bristol Street just don't generate sales tax revenues like their Irvine neighbors, Newport City Manager Kevin Murphy said.

"We need to look at the land uses out there," Murphy said.

Newport Beach faces a few obstacles in culling sales tax from the commercial land near the airport. For instance, special land use restrictions mean builders have to pay the Irvine Co. if they want to add on to buildings. Also, the glut of car rental agencies produce no taxes for the city because their point of sale is at the airport, which is county property.

Improving the land uses could mean more offices or more hotels — or even an auto mall or a car rental "mall." Plans won't take shape until the committee considers recommendations.

"We'll see if there is any interest by some property owners in bundling parcels," said committee member Richard Luehrs, president of the Newport Harbor Area Chamber of Commerce. "If we do that, all of a sudden it goes from a couple of attorneys or offices to a substantial million-dollar sales tax generator."

## West Newport feels slighted

■ While city will spend \$540,000 polishing up the peninsula, West Newport residents feel they've become the 'forgotten land.'

NEWPORT BEACH — Ken Kuhlmann swears the residential streets in West Newport look no better than they did when he moved there in 1977. And no better than the streets in Los Angeles when he was born there in 1935. And no better than Mexico, where he vacationed recently.

The utility poles, stuck right in the middle of the sidewalks and casting a virtual net of criss-crossing wires over the street, really irritate him. In fact, he's pretty sure that getting rid of those could be the key to solving the area's

chronic problems: absentee landowners, transient tenants, unkempt houses, higher crime.

Kuhlmann, 62, hasn't gotten involved in past efforts to underground the neighborhood's utility poles, but now he knows the problem isn't going away.

"This is one of the richest towns in the United States," he said. "But West Newport Beach is the forgotten land."

City officials have heard Kuhlmann's complaints a thou-

# Traffic fees just got cheaper for developers

■ But some council members are concerned lowering levy for builders will mean millions less in coffers.

COSTA MESA — A decision by City Council members Monday night to lower traffic impact fees by 25% may make the city more "business-friendly," but some city officials say the city can't afford to lose the estimated \$11 million for basic road maintenance and improvements.

City Councilwoman Heather Somers, who voted against the reduction, explained the current fees barely paid for street maintenance.

"It makes me really upset because people say, 'Why don't you fix the roads in this town?' and I say we don't have the money ... we're just getting ourselves farther and farther and farther behind," Somers said.

Peter Naghavi, the city's manager of transportation services, said the city's 1991 General Plan calls for \$177 million in traffic improvements over the next 20 years, yet current traffic levies, called trip fees, already leave a shortfall of nearly \$132 million. The new trip fees will increase that shortfall by \$11 million to

\$143 million, he said.

The city charges trip fees to developers that build new developments or to those expand existing developments, thus generating new traffic.

When there is more traffic, city streets and intersections could require improvements such as widening freeway off-ramps. So the one-time fees, assessed at the time the development is built, are based on the number of trips the development generates.

The local business community, however, has complained for years that the city's trip fees for new developments are one of the highest in the county. In some cases they are six times higher than surrounding cities.

Three years ago the fee was \$228 per trip, but a year later the council voted to reduce it to \$200 per trip. The city adopted a city-wide fee of \$228 per trip in 1993. Before that, since the 1980s, developments north of Baker Street were assessed a \$668 per trip fee.

"I congratulate the council on taking one more step in the right direction by making the fees in Costa Mesa more in parity with those around us," said Ed Fawcett, executive director of the Costa Mesa Chamber of Commerce.

The fees are part of the eligibility requirements for the Orange County Measure M program and are designed to pay for

traffic improvements caused by any traffic generated by the development.

Mayor Peter Buffa suggested the city consider using a portion of its sales tax revenue to make up the shortfall. Naghavi was directed to compile a list of options for the council to consider.

City Councilman Gary Monahan believes the fees are still too high at \$150. He said the city needs to be competitive if it wants businesses to locate here.

"Our traffic fee is one of, if not the highest, in the county," City Councilman Gary Monahan said. "The fee has become so high that it's become a discouragement for new development."

Belushi's band had been set to perform a free concert as a headline act during the 17-day fair, which begins July 11. A conflict with the band's European tour forced the cancellation, officials said.

Fair officials said a replacement act will be named soon.

## Arches bartender hospitalized after nighttime brawl

NEWPORT BEACH — A Newport Beach man was arrested Monday night after allegedly slugging a 63-year-old bartender at the Arches Restaurant, knocking him to the ground and sending him to the hospital.

David McCullough, 48, was arrested around 9:15 p.m. on suspicion of battery with intent to commit great bodily harm at the restaurant in the 3300 block of Coast Highway after apparently striking bartender Charles Gambino, also of Newport Beach, police said.

According to one witness account, McCullough challenged Gambino to a fight, and the two walked out of the restaurant together, said Newport Beach police Sgt. Fred Heinecke.

The witness then heard a sound, as if someone had fallen against a wall, and found Gambino outside on the ground with blood coming out of the right side of his head, Heinecke said.

Gambino, who was listed in stable condition at Western Medical Center in Santa Ana on Tuesday, only recalled walking out of the restaurant and then the medics helping him, Heinecke said.

Those in the restaurant during the assault said they were baffled about how it happened.

"I'm totally confused," said waiter Bob Behmanesh, 49, who said he's known Gambino for about 20 years. "Where did they go? What happened? We don't know how it happened."

Behmanesh described Gambino as a reserved, controlled man who is not prone to bar fights. He

said he thought Gambino had suffered a stroke when he saw him lying semi-conscious in the parking lot.

"When I got close to Charlie, I saw so much blood, I couldn't believe it," he said. "It was like a bathtub."

McCullough posted bail and was released Tuesday morning, police said.

## Legends of the fall

■ Cross country, football and water polo got Costa Mesa boys athletics off to successful start in 1996-97.

COSTA MESA - If, as many believe, the success of a school's fall athletic programs has a dynamic and lasting effect on student-body morale, things should certainly have been upbeat this year at Costa Mesa High.

For when it came to boys sports, the back-to-school bunch of cross country, water polo and football did much to proliferate pride throughout the Mustangs' campus.

Cross country produced the school's only Pacific Coast League team title, while football (third place in league) and water polo (second) joined Coach Joe Busi's harriers as the school's lone team representatives in the CIF Southern Section postseason.

Cross country, which also made school history by making its first-ever appearance at the CIF State Championships in Fresno, featured three of the school's two-sport standouts in Eric Solis, Jaime Carrillo and Bruce Hancock.

Other notable dual-sport stalwarts included Julius Vasquez (football and baseball), Vince Hamade (football and wrestling), Jeremy Lefever (football and wrestling) and Bryan Leahy (basketball and track), while junior Ben Felter (football, wrestling and baseball) and Todd Hylton (water polo, basketball and swimming) spread their considerable talents over eight months of the school year.

Here's a sport-by-sport review of 1996-97 Mustang boys athletics:

• **Cross country:** After sneaking up on the competition to win the 1995 PCL crown, the Mustangs stood up to the pressure placed on any front-runner to claim back-to-back titles.

Following a 5-0 league dual-meet campaign, Busi's brigade won PCL Finals, behind the Carrillo-Solis-Hancock triumvirate which became known as "three big dogs."

Hancock, a sophomore, finished second at league finals (15:40), where seniors Carrillo (15:59) and Solis (16:15) claimed third and fourth place, respectively.

Hancock continued his torrid postseason by finishing fourth at CIF Southern Section Division IV Finals, where Solis was eighth and Carrillo 11th to pace a fourth-place team finish.

Solis, perhaps foreshadowing the unprecedented track success he would accumulate in the spring, ran the "race of his life" to finish 11th at the state meet.

Marcelo Martinez, Francisco Ortiz, Alex Martinez and Jesus Gonzalez also earned valuable points for Busi, who praised his runners' hard work.

"Us going to State Finals is the best thing to happen to this team, to the school, to this program," Busi said.

• **Track and field:** Solis, who lost his junior postseason to leg injuries, worked fervently in the off-season to insure no such fate would befall his swan song as a prep.

Mission accomplished.

Solis, who openly coveted Robert Grego's 1981 school record in the 800 (1:55.3), broke it no less than four times during the postseason, including an Orange County season-best 1:54.51 for his fifth-place state-meet showing.

Solis' performance in Sacramento earned him the school's inaugural state medal among boys track athletes, according to veteran coach John Carney.

Solis was also fifth at the Masters Meet (1:54.88), second at CIF Division III Finals (1:54.90) and topped the PCL Finals field in the 800 and 1,600, the latter in a personal-record 4:25.4.

Additional PCL gold medals claimed by Carrillo (3,200) and Matthew Rudesill (shot put), as well as top-three showings by Rudesill (third in the discus), Hancock (second in the 800 and third in the 1,600), Richard Price (third in the 110-yard high hurdles and the 300 intermediates), and Leahy (second in the high jump) helped put Mesa in position to upset Laguna Hills with a victory in the 1,600 relay. A dropped baton, however, cost them their title hopes.

Hancock, whose 4:24.65 clocking in the 1,600 at CIF Division III Preliminaries shattered his previous best by five seconds, went on to finish third at section finals.

Rudesill, who also posted a PR at CIF Prelims (54-2), finished third in the Division III Finals with a put of 52-3 1/2.

• **Water polo:** While first-year coach Scott Taylor led the Mustangs to the CIF Division II Quarterfinals, the Mustangs saw their 10-year reign as PCL champions come to an end in a dramatic, 11-10 double-overtime loss to Laguna Beach.

Sunny Hills upset the fourth-seeded Mustangs, 8-7, in the playoffs to finalize

their record at 19-8. They were 4-1 in league.

Hylton, a mantis-like 6-foot-6 junior two-meter man, led the team with 95 goals and was first-team All-CIF Division II.

Justin Taylor, the team captain who broke the head coach's school record for single-season saves with 311, was also first-team All-CIF, while junior Chad Cleaver (39 goals) was third-team All-CIF.

The aforementioned trio earned first-team all-league laurels, while teammates Alex Soria and Jimmy Walters, both juniors, as well as sophomore Hunter Taylor, were second-team All-PCL.

Junior Kris Montgomery earned honorable mention.

• **Football:** An inspired 17-0 triumph over cross-town rival Estancia keyed a 3-2 league record, a third-place finish, and a berth in the CIF Division VIII Playoffs.

A rain-soaked field proved problematic for the Mustangs' smashmouth, ground-oriented offensive approach in 14-0 first-round loss to Sunny Hills, however, finalizing the Jerry Howell-coached squad's record at 6-5.

Junior running backs Steve Herzog (1,112 yards and 15 touchdowns) and Hamade (943 yards and 11 TDs) keyed the offense, en route to first-team All-PCL and All-Newport-Mesa District laurels.

Vasquez, a senior inside linebacker, Jeremy Via, a junior lineman, and junior defensive back Ronnie Lievanos were also first-team all-league and all-district.

Lefever, Jeremy Siedsma, and Felter were all-district and second-team All-PCL, while Jose Ayala and Donny Causey were second-team all-league.

• **Wrestling:** Hamade and Lefever won league titles in their respective weight classes after finishing second last season, to pace Coach Anthony Ybarra's squad to a fourth-place league finish.

Chris McBride was second at PCL Finals, where Felter and Gus Sandoval claimed bronze medals.

• **Swimming:** Hylton won the league crown in the 100-yard backstroke with a personal-best 57.36 clocking and was ninth in the 100 freestyle (50.88) to help pace Coach Scott Perry's squad to a fourth-place finish at PCL Finals and a 2-5 dual-meet record, 2-3 in league.

P.J. O'Brien joined Hylton at the CIF Division III Prelims, after finishing fifth in

the 200 free and seventh in the 100 breaststroke at PCL Finals.

Gene Nguyen (sixth in the 200 individual medley), James Spunagle (seventh in the 500 free) and Cleaver (eighth in the 200 free) also made league championship final appearances.

• **Baseball:** Graduation depleted a talent base that produced back-to-back playoff trips and the Mustangs finished 7-17, 2-13 in league, despite a 6-3 start.

Vasquez earned all-district recognition for the second time in his three-year catching career, after hitting .360 with one homer, nine doubles and 20 RBI.

Senior Layne DeTemple hit .347 with 13 RBI and posted a 1.68 ERA in 25 mound innings to also garner all-district recognition, while Felter did the same by hitting .323 with two homers, eight doubles and 11 RBI.

Vasquez, DeTemple and senior infielder Al Lambert were second-team all-league choices for fourth-year coach Doug Deats.

• **Basketball:** Senior guard Matt Chaisson averaged 13.6 points en route to all-district accolades and joined Leahy on the coaches' all-league second team.

First-year coach Erich Allen garnered Daily Pilot Coach of the Year honors in the PCL.

Though the Mustangs finished 4-20, 0-10 in league, they lost four PCL games by a combined nine points, as Allen got the most out of his overmatched squad.

## IN THIS CASE TALK WAS EXPENSIVE

Estancia High player's pregame pronouncement helped propel Mustangs to 17-0 cross-town football victory.

COSTA MESA - Wingbacks say the darndest things.

That was the case Oct. 25 at Newport Harbor High, where an Estancia High senior backfield standout said the wrong thing to the wrong guy - Costa Mesa football defensive coordinator Tom Baldwin - at a most inopportune time.

According to Baldwin, the Eagle standout boasted to him during pregame warmups that he'd be taking up residence in the Mustangs' end zone that night.

To Baldwin, whose competitive fires have burned on Orange County sidelines for four decades, it was like squirting lighter fluid on white-hot charcoal.

"I'm so fired up. I'm totally fired up," Baldwin fumed to a nearby reporter. I'm tired of hearing all this talk about (Estancia's backs). Hey, Estancia (5-1 at the time and ranked 10th in CIF Division VIII) has played five cardboard cutouts."

Baldwin spent the rest of his pregame peppering inspirational verbiage at Mesa players, prompting concern from head coach Jerry Howell that the veteran assistant would blow a gasket.

"I told Tom he was going to have to get his blood pressure down, because I didn't want to perform CPR on him," Howell said.

The already emotional atmosphere surrounding the 30th Battle of the Bell between cross-town and Pacific Coast League rivals was significantly enhanced on the Mesa sideline.

This additional motivation, added to an already solid game plan and hard-nosed execution on both sides of the ball, produced a surprisingly commanding 17-0 victory for the Mustangs.

Estancia, averaging more than 36 points and boasting a wingback duo that had amassed more than 1,500 rushing yards and 20 touchdowns in six previous games, was thoroughly throttled by the Mesa defense.

Offensively, Mesa produced a 14-play 80-yard touchdown drive on its second possession for all the points it would need.

The victory, Mesa's 11th in the series, not only reclaimed the perpetual Bell Trophy that goes to the annual winner, it vaulted the Mustangs ahead of the Eagles in the race for third place and the league's final guaranteed postseason berth.

Mesa standout Steve Herzog noted afterward that the win met the first of three goals established for the season: 1) Have a winning season; 2) Get The Bell back; and 3) Make the CIF Playoffs.

The Mustangs, after seizing city bragging rights and enjoying the traditional postgame rib feast that goes to the game's victor, eventually accomplished all three.

They also likely limited Estancia's pregame conversation for the 31st showdown.

## LOWSMAN TROPHY TO MCADA TONIGHT

Mr. Irrelevant XXII, Army's most heralded QB, gets toasted and roasted at Hyatt Newporter.

NEWPORT BEACH - As the signature event of the bizarre, mad-cap festival known as Irrelevant Week, tonight's All-Star Celebrity Lowman Trophy Banquet to salute an Army quarterback will be anything but irrelevant.

Not to be outdone by the New York Athletic Club, which honors college football's top player with its heralded Heisman Trophy each year, the University Athletic Club in Newport Beach will present its Lowman Trophy to the NFL's last draft pick for the 22nd consecutive year, as Cadet signal caller Ronnie McAda, Mr. Irrelevant XXII, leads the charge in a festive formation at the Hyatt Newporter (6 p.m.).

In the past, some of the biggest names in sport have attended the banquet. Its commander in chief, Irrelevant Week founder Paul Salata, surprises guests each year with marquee names.

And tonight, to salute Army's Navy-killing quarterback who was selected 240th and dead last in the NFL draft by the Super Bowl champion Green Bay Packers, will also feature the "Parade of Legendary Quarterbacks," as host and emcee Salata aims to bring every passer in the civilized world to Newport Beach for his ever-expanding annual week-long circus to help pay homage to this year's honoree.

"The Heisman winner isn't treated to a full week of parties and tributes and showered with a thousand gifts, is he?" Salata said.

Former USC quarterbacks Craig Fertig, Rodney Peete, Paul McDonald, Sean Salisbury and two-time Notre Dame-beater Scott Tinsley are only a few ex-throwers expected to help roast and toast the Army quarterback who guided the Cadets to their school-record third, fourth and fifth consecutive victories over Navy during his three years as a West Point starter.

McAda, commissioned a second lieutenant last month following his graduation from the U.S. Military Academy in West Point, N.Y., will have no chance for audibles tonight, nor will he give any orders. McAda may be used to strict schedules, but there's no timetable or deadline to complete tonight's ridicule.

McAda, who went to West Point to play Division I football, not to become a career military man, is the first Cadet to win the highly coveted Lowman Trophy, following the postseason footsteps of three Heisman winners - Glenn Davis, Doc Blanchard and Pete Dawkins.

McAda's Lowman Trophy, clearly an honor at the opposite end of the football awards spectrum from its more famous counterpart, was created in 1979 specifically to be awarded to the honoree of Irrelevant Week.

Though similar to the Heisman in appearance, the Lowman depicts a player dropping a football with his mouth open. The Lowman is an original bronze sculpture designed by Huntington Beach-based artist Jim Crockett.

McAda, who will receive a replica at the banquet (the original is on display at the University Athletic Club), got a break in scheduling his storied Army heroes before him never received - a 12-game season, including a berth in the Independence Bowl.

The Cadets finished 10-2 last season with McAda running the wishbone, most wins in academy history, even topping the days of Davis and Blanchard when they won back-to-back Heismans in the 1940s for unbeaten, untied Red Blaik-coached Army teams.

played only a nine-game schedule and weren't allowed to accept postseason bowl invitations.

McCada, considered an outstanding cutback runner, set an Army record for career total offense in Army-Navy competition (533), shattering the mark previously held by Davis.

Last season, McCada capped the regular season when he led the Cadets to a miracle comeback against the Midshipmen, rallying Army from 18 points down at the start of the fourth quarter to post a classic 28-24 triumph as the Cadets earned a bowl invitation. It was the greatest comeback in the history of the legendary Army-Navy series.

McCada, the first player to ever capture the Philadelphia Sports-writers' Most Valuable Player

Award for an Army-Navy game two years in succession, will begin a two-year military commitment Aug. 5, when he reports to Fort Sill, Okla., for an officer-training course.

McCada, in town for Irrelevant Week with his parents, Ronnie Sr. and Donna, and his fiancée, Laura Batris, will report for Green Bay training camp July 8.

He will not be eligible to join the Packers full-time until May 31, 1999.



sand times before from a thousand different residents over the years. But with the City Council recently setting aside \$540,000 in this year's and next year's budgets to revitalize the nearby Balboa Peninsula, some West Newport residents are feeling a little left out.

Kuhlmann said he sees no point in fixing up the peninsula — which he doesn't think is so bad as it is, especially with what he sees as much worse conditions in West Newport.

And the only way to do that, he said, is to start with the utility poles. Jumbles of wires run from the houses to the poles, the poles to the houses, across the tops of the narrow alleys and streets. And poles, encrusted with rusty staples, sit in the middle of sidewalks, prompting passers-by to turn sideways to squeeze by fences.

He'd like the city to use the peninsula revitalization money to buy a bond instead, then have property owners pay their share of it when they sell their property.

City Manager Kevin Murphy said the money the council has allocated for the peninsula will be used for the peninsula only. And, he said, the city has no other funds to pay for underground utilities, which he estimated could cost as much as the city's entire

\$4-million capital improvements budget.

Standard operating procedure for underground utilities calls for at least 60% of the area's property owners to agree to pay a portion of the costs. Balboa Coves, Newport Island, Balboa Island and Corona del Mar homeowners got their utilities underground that way.

Years of other West Newport efforts have come up short. "I think the property owners would take pride in their property if the wires were gone," he said. "Nothing has improved in the 20 years we've been here."

Newport Island resident Bob Small spoke at the last City Council meeting to complain about conditions on 39th Street.

"It is the worst it has ever been," he said. "We need to rally an army of people to constantly bombard the place to get the people out who make it that way."

When Mayor Jan Debay first ran for a council seat in 1992, she pledged to help clean up West Newport. She said she's the first to admit the neighborhood doesn't look nearly as good as the master-planned Irvine Co.-owned areas

of the city east of the bay.

"If you look out at it, it looks awful," said Debay, a former Seashore Drive resident. "It has been a topic of discussion since I moved here in 1979."

Debay and Murphy both point out progress made in West Newport in recent years. The city tackled one of the area's biggest problems — excessive partying — with a 1995 ordinance that increased fines on landlords and tenants. About \$250,000 of next year's city budget will go toward repaving River Avenue. And police have stepped up their West Newport patrol efforts over the last few years on July 4.

She said she'd also like to see better code enforcement and less street-side parking in the neighborhood.

Debay said large chunks of the money earmarked for improving the peninsula simply can't be used for West Newport. Some of the funds are coming from restrictive federal grants and city accounts designated for certain types of improvements.

And she said the only way for a residential neighborhood like Kuhlmann's to get underground utilities is to persuade property owners to pay from \$4,000 to \$10,000 each. Some sections of Seashore Drive have enough support, Debay said, but large portions have to get together before it can be done.

"If the complainers would get involved, it would happen a lot quicker," she said.

professor at Orange Coast College. Haynes, the new guy on the block, is a consulting engineer who came out of UCLA with a master's degree in water resources engineering. Both were affable and comfortable.

They came armed with many documents, some of which I read, most of which I didn't because they dealt with technical subjects in which I have no expertise. Their position was that the customers of both Mesa and Santa Ana Heights would be far better served by a Mesa takeover. If they have some devious purpose beyond this, it wasn't apparent to me in the two hours I spent with them.

Whatever their motivation, it is powerful enough to convince Mesa to file a lawsuit seeking an injunction to prevent the sale of the Santa Ana Heights Water Co. to IRWD, which has now been pledged enough Santa Ana stock to exercise its option to take over the company. By the time you read this, a court will be considering that injunction.

I asked Panian and Haynes two questions up front, and most of our time was devoted to tributaries of those questions.

First, I wanted to know why Mesa had apparently left the field to the IRWD, then came charging back at the last moment as a spoiler. And second, I asked if Mesa was prepared to spend the time, money and effort that would be required to flog this matter through the courts.

In answer to the first question, they took me back to a decision of the Santa Ana board made over a year ago to reject a request by Mesa for an independent study of the value and condition of the Santa Ana system. According to Panian, such a study was a condition of Mesa staying in the bidding, and when it was rejected, Mesa pulled back. "We relapsed," said Panian.

Then in November, two newcomers were elected to the Mesa board. One of them was Dana Haynes. They took a hard look at the "relapse" and decided to get back in the fray. "Aggressive?" I suggested to Haynes. "Progressive," he answered.

They admit freely that their timing was atrocious, but, says Haynes, "bad timing doesn't dissuade us from the merit of what we are doing."

Their answer to the second question was that Mesa is, indeed, prepared to pursue whatever legal route is neces-

sary to obtain a new playing field for the disposition of the Santa Ana company.

It is not encouraging for those of us who want a conclusion. Most of all, it fails to take into account that Mesa's spoiler role was set up by its own earlier administrative decisions, and Mesa officials should be prepared to live by those decisions.

There may be some excellent arguments on behalf of Mesa's service as opposed to the IRWD, but those arguments should have been made early on in these negotiations, not now. I listened to a number of them over lunch. I suspect they could all be countered by the other side, but more important than that, they meant very little to me — and, I suspect, to the other water users in Santa Ana Heights.

There are a number of things about the IRWD deal that I find less than appealing, but it's time to get on with this. Mesa needs to learn to live with its own mistakes, just as the rest of us do. The lawsuit is compounding, not correcting those mistakes by throwing good money after bad.

Incidentally, you should probably know that they paid for my lunch. A bowl of bean soup.



This hand could come out of a textbook on play. However, it was dealt in the 1961 Bermuda Bowl, and one of the world's great players went wrong.

At both tables in the U.S.A.-Italy championship match, the final contract was six hearts after South opened one heart. Once North learned that partner held spade

fillers, the slam became easy to reach.

At both tables the opening lead was the four of diamonds. The Italian declarer played low from dummy and, when East won with the king, a spade could be discarded on the diamonds and that was that.

At the other table the American declarer elected to finesse the queen at trick one. When that lost to the king, declarer had to fall back on the spade finesse — down one.

In our opinion, the play of a low diamond is unquestionably correct, because it offers declarer an extra chance. Suppose that South follows low and East wins the jack. Declarer can take any return, draw trumps in three rounds, then cash the ace and king of spades. If the queen drops, the hand is over. If it does not, declarer can still fall back on the diamond finesse. That gives South the same chance of two finesses, except that both are in the diamond suit. In addition there is the possibility that the queen of spades might fall. Q.E.D.
